









Getting started

Formed by nature, each rock has its own unique shape and size.
Little rocks can become bugs or small flowers; bumpy rocks can be swiss cheese; broken rocks can be a cookie with a bite taken out of it.



Look at your rocks and let the shape inspire your creativity.

Please rinse and throughly dry the rocks before you begin painting.

Cover your work surface. Have a cup of water and paper towels handy.

This paint is permanent when dry - it may stain clothing, fabrics, and other surfaces. Wear a smock or old clothes, and clean up any spills immediately while still wet.

Paint can settle and separate over time. Mix each color thoroughly before you begin painting.

Rinse and dry your brush thoroughly before changing colors.

Painting Your Rocks

For ideas or inspiration, refer to the samples on the box.

Don't be afraid to mix up your own colors, as shown. You can use a paper plate or piece of foil for mixing. To deepen the colors, you may need more than one coat of paint. Allow to dry between coats.

Pro tip - to make your rocks more weather-resistant, paint the bottom too.





pink + yellow = orange



blue + yellow = green



blue + pink = purple



Let it Glow!

After the paint has dried, add glow-in-the-dark stickers to your rocks.

Place your rocks under a bright light to charge.
Turn off the lights and watch them GLOW!
