



B-1 Vehicle Seating Position

A WARNING:

Check the vehicle owner's manual for more information about air bag/booster seat use. For vehicles without a back seat, refer to your vehicle owner's manual.



Use the booster seat only on vehicle seats that face forward.

Do not use on seats that face the sides or rear of the vehicle.

Some vehicles do not have a seating position that can be used safely with this booster seat. If you are not sure where to place the booster seat in your vehicle, consult your vehicle owner's manual, contact Dorel Juvenile Group Consumer Care Department, or visit your local Child Passenger Inspection Station.

Children are safer when properly restrained in rear seating positions

than in the front seating positions.
According to National Highway Traffic Safety
Administration information, children in rear seating positions are statistically safer, whether you have air bags, advanced air bags, or no air bags at all.

To avoid your child being seriously burned, take the following precautions:

- 1. Park in the shade or where sun does not directly hit the booster seat.
- 2. Always use the booster seat with the seat pad.

B-2 Installation in Vehicle

A WARNING:

Check the vehicle belt before each use. Use only if the belt can be tightened properly and securely.

This booster seat should be securely belted in the vehicle even when not in use. In a crash or sudden stop, an unsecured booster seat could injure occupants.

Do not use a booster seat that has been in a crash. You must get a new booster seat.

B-3 Booster Seat Use

AWARNING:

Never take your child out of the booster seat while the vehicle is moving. Never leave child unattended.

Placing your child in a hot booster seat may result in burns.

Do not use a booster seat with damaged or missing parts.

Do not substitute parts or try to modify the booster seat in any way.

Do not use any booster seat accessory except those approved by Dorel Juvenile Group.

AWARNING:

Never allow any child to play with this booster seat; it is not a toy.

Do not remove or cover up any of the warning labels or other labels on the booster seat.

On the side of the booster seat there is a date of manufacture label.

Do not use this booster seat more than 10 years after date of manufacture.

C-1 Removing Seat Pad for Cleaning

AWARNING:

Do not use this booster seat without the seat pad. Failure to do this can result in serious injury.



1. To Remove Pad From Seat:

From back, slide pad off of seat and around armrests.



a. Release seat pad from tabs on front of seat. Remove pad from seat.

Cleaning Pad


Machine wash separately with cold water on a gentle cycle. Do not use bleach. Tumble dry separately for 10-12 minutes on low heat. Remove immediately.

Replacing Pad

Replace the pad by reversing the order. Slide pad onto seat and attach elastic straps.

D-1 Understanding Your Vehicle

D-2 Knowing Your Vehicle Belts

Not all vehicle belts and seating positions will work with booster seats.

You must review your vehicle's owner manual for vehicle seat belt use with booster seats.


D-3 Aircraft Information

E. Belt-Positioning **Booster Use**

E-1 Preparing Belt-Positioning Booster



Lap/ Shoulder

40-100 lb (18.1-45.4 kg) 43-57 in. (110.1-144.8 cm) The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that children remain in a five-point harness until they outgrow their forward-facing harnessed child restraint.

This typically occurs around age 4, but some children outgrow them sooner and others not until later.

Please talk to your doctor about the best option for your child.

E-2 Installing with Lap and Shoulder Belt



1. Place Booster Seat Forward-Facing in Vehicle

> Center the booster seat in the chosen seating position. The back of the booster seat should be

flat against the vehicle seat back.



2. Place Child in Seat

Child should sit with their back flat against the vehicle seat and bottom flat against the booster seat. 14



3. Buckle Lap and Shoulder Belt

Lap belt should cross the child's upper thighs. Buckle vehicle belt. The shoulder belt should lay

snugly across the center of the child's shoulders and across the chest (not on the face or neck).

Pull up on the shoulder belt to tighten.

NOTE: Make sure the lap and shoulder belt are placed under armrest as shown.

Check periodically to ensure your child has not moved out of position and loosened the shoulder belt. continued on next page.

AWARNING:



Do not use this booster seat if the tops of your child's ears are above the top of the vehicle seat back or headrest.

Use only the vehicle's lap and shoulder belt system

when restraining the child in this booster seat.

Check vehicle instructions for more information about air bag/booster seat use.



Do Not Use only the lap belt when using this seat.

The shoulder belt must always be adjusted snugly across the child's chest.

NEVER place the

shoulder belt behind the child's back or under the child's arms.

Failure to follow these warnings could cause serious injury or death to your child.

AWARNING:

By the nature of the design, backless booster car seats do not have a back or headrest. These types of booster car seats help position the vehicle belt across the body.

Any additional protection of the body or head is dependent on the protection systems of your vehicle.

Please consider this when choosing where this booster will be used in your vehicle and always consult your vehicle owner's manual.

Troubleshooting

1. If the shoulder belt crosses the child's neck when using the booster seat:

Try moving the booster seat toward the center of the vehicle or move the vehicle seat forward or back. Check to see if your vehicle has adjustable shoulder belt anchor points.

WARNING: NEVER place the shoulder belt behind the child's back.
