To preserve the quality of your water color pencils, do not dip or soak your pencils in water. This causes the wood to swell and dissolves the pigments inside the pencils.

The fully water-soluble lead features vibrant color, optimum opacity and good resistance to light. Using a wet paintbrush, your drawings can be transformed into stunning watercolor paintings.

## Good to know

Faber-Castell uses a standardized color numbering system for its products. This allows the shade of a color from one product - like a Goldfaber watercolor pencil - to match the same color of another product - like an oil or soft pastel crayon.

Try out different papers to see which you prefer. We recommend hot press watercolor paper which has a smooth absorbent finish, perfect for watercolor pencil art. Using a quality paper will be reflected in the quality of your art. When you are ready to turn your drawing into a painting, use painter's tape to secure the edges of your paper. This will prevent it from curling when adding water.

When working with a wet paintbrush, the paper absorbs the water and curls. In addition to taping your paper, you can also use a watercolor pad. The sheets are glued as a block ensuring the paper will dry flat.

The pressure you apply to the pencil determines the intensity of the color. The harder the pressure, the deeper the color.

Fills - To flood your page with color, hold the pencil at an angle. Use the entire side of the lead as you color. Using more than one color can create beautiful gradients perfect for sunsets.



Details can be added once the paint is dry. Hold the pencil upright and with a sharp point draw in your lines & finer details.

While the surface is still wet, use a dry brush to absorb water & remove pigment to create lighter colors.
