

PROBATION

Probation is a court-ordered period of supervision for individuals who have been convicted of a crime. It is often used as an alternative to incarceration for first-time offenders or those with minor offenses. Probation officers monitor the individual's behavior and ensure they comply with the conditions of their sentence, such as attending counseling, maintaining employment, and avoiding further criminal activity. Failure to comply can result in the revocation of probation and a return to prison.
