Create with Clay

Instructions

Roll, squish, cut and create with clay! Ten exciting colors of clay, cookie cutters, sculpting tools, a wooden roller, texture plate and push mold leads to endless hours of play. Build and leave on display, this clay never dries out. Get your friends and create!

Before you begin

1. Make sure your hands and work surface are clean.
2. Cover your work surface with a plastic tablecloth or place mat to protect it from the clay.
3. The clay in our kit is gluten-free, but please do not eat it.
4. This clay is not meant to be baked.
5. Although the clay is not “air dry” we recommend bagging or keeping it in the packaging when not in use.

Mixing Clay Colors

Soften your clay by squeezing and smushing it. Try creating a marble effect by using two different colors of clay and squishing them together. Continue blending to create your own color.



Push Mold

Press a piece of clay into the push mold. Leave some excess clay to grab onto when pulling out the shape. Trim the excess clay with a sculpting tool.



Tools and Texture

Use the roller and texture plate to add a pattern to your clay. Cut a shape out with a cookie cutter or a sculpting tool.

What else can create texture on your clay? Try the bristles of an old toothbrush or the treads of a toy truck. Before trying items you find around the house, be sure to ask an adult for permission.

Tip: Roll and cut on a piece of paper. Bend the paper to peel off the shape.

Instructions

Free Form

Balls: Roll the clay in a circular motion.

Rods: Roll the clay back and forth.

Bricks: Make a ball. Press in the sides then top and bottom to shape.

Creatures & more: Join the shapes together with your tools or fingers.



All Together Now!

Use a place mat with a picture or draw a scene on paper. Add your clay creations to the picture and play!



Clean Up

Pick off any clumps of clay from your fingers and wash your hands with soap and water to remove any remaining clay.
