

# JOURNEY STICKS

Journey sticks have been used for centuries to retell stories of travel. Adding items collected on the journey can help when navigating a new terrain. They can also remind you of a fun adventure.

- Paint paper sticks, leaves, feathers\* and beads as desired. Refer to the photos for inspiration. Let dry.

- Glue the leaves and feathers to your stick. Wrap and tie the cord and thread on beads.



\* size, shape and color of feathers may vary



# PICTURE FRAMES

- Paint the wooden sticks.
- Arrange them into a square – use glue to secure.
- Glue on a 5” (12.7cm) cord to hang, or wrap with cord and tie.
- Add a picture or drawing.
- You can also add painted feathers or clay creations.

# ABOUT THIS PAINT

This paint may stain fabrics, furniture and other surfaces. Cover your work surface with newspaper, have a cup of water and paper towels handy and wear a smock or old clothes. Clean up any spills immediately while the paint is still wet. Paint can settle and separate over time. Mix each color thoroughly before you begin painting. Before changing colors, rinse and dry your brush thoroughly.

# ROCK PAINTING

- Decide how you want to paint your rocks. Use the pictures on the box for ideas or make your own designs.
- Trade them with your friends or hide them for others to find.

**Pro-Tip** For better coverage, start with a layer of white paint first. Always rinse and dry your brush before changing colors.



# CLAY PINCH POT

- Roll clay into a ball to make one pot, or divide in half to make 2 pots.
- Push your thumb in the center. Press with your fingers to gently shape a bowl.

**Pro-Tip** Use your imagination to shape the clay into a lady bug, snake or anything you would like to add to your projects.





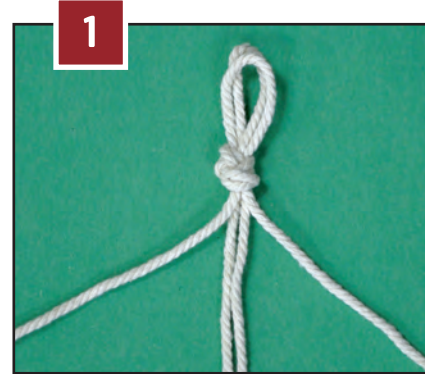


## BRACELETS

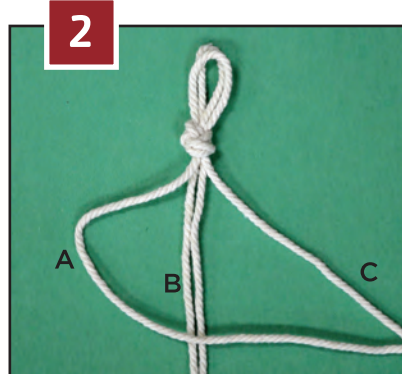
- Paint beads as desired or refer to photo for inspiration. Let dry.
- Cut a 36" (91.4cm) and a 64" (162.5cm) length of cord.
- Fold each cord in half and tie them in a knot, leaving a 1" (2.5cm) loop at the top.
- Place the long cords on each side and the short cords in the center.
- Weave for 3" (7.6cm), thread a bead to one of the center strands, weave for 3" (7.6cm) more.
- Add bead to end, finish with a knot. Trim excess and add glue to secure.
- You can also create simple braided necklaces and bracelets with your cord and beads

### Pro-Tip

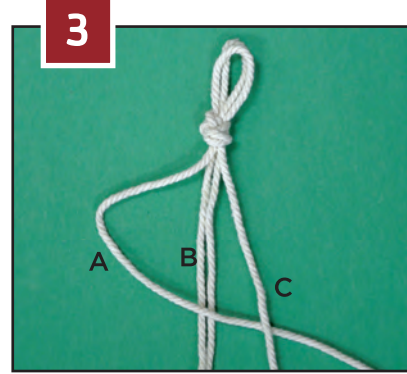
- Pro tip – put bead on the end of a feather or paint brush to paint all sides of the bead.



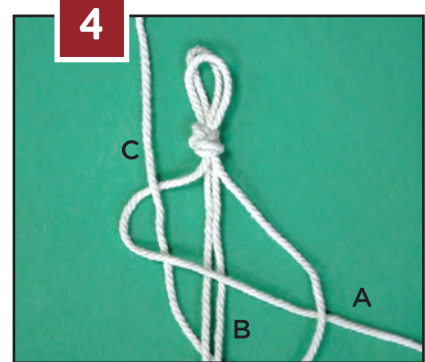
Fold the cords in half and tie in a knot. Leave a 1" (2.5cm) loop at the top. Place the long cords on each side and the short cords in the center.



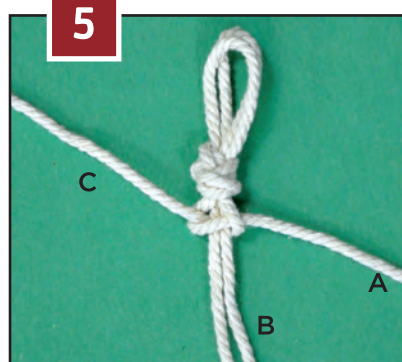
Cross the left cord (A) over the center cords (B), creating a loop on the left side.



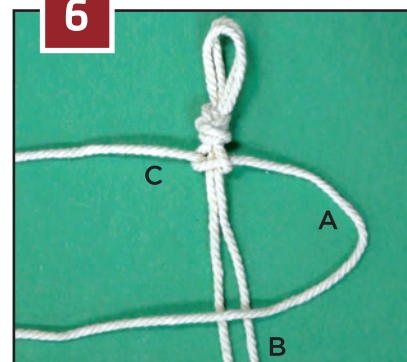
Place the right cord (C) over the left cord (A).



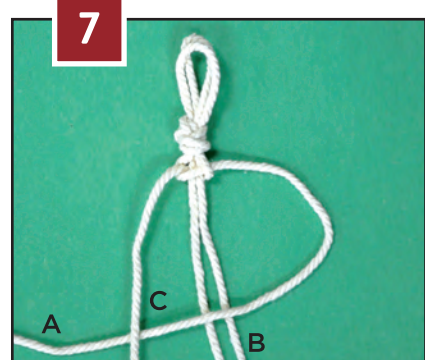
Pass the right cord (C) under the center cords (B) and up through the loop you made on the left.



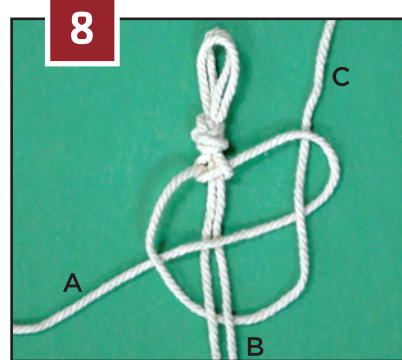
Pull the left and right cords (A and C) to tighten the knot.



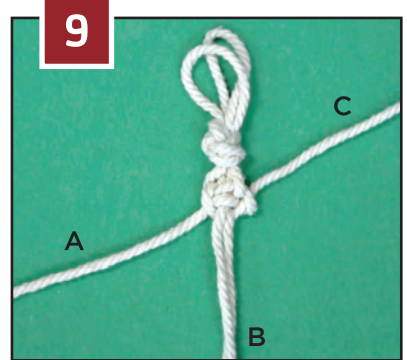
Tie the same knot starting on the right side. Cross the right cord (A) over the center cords (B) creating a loop on the right side.



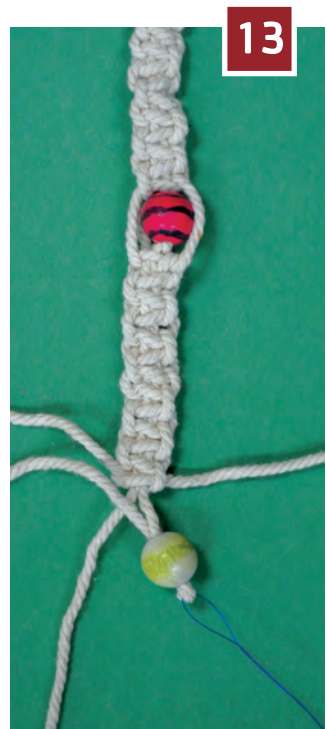
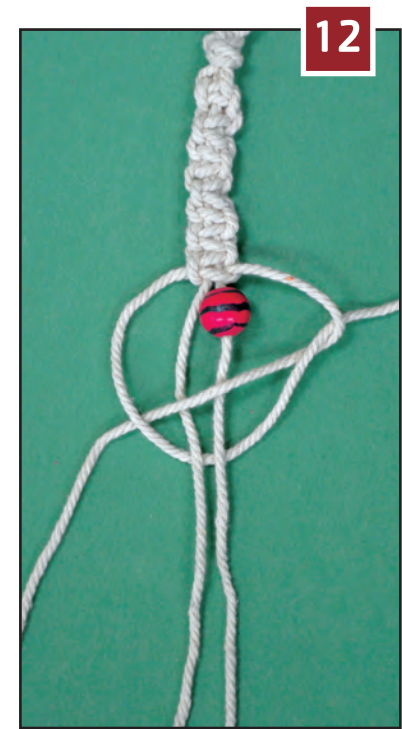
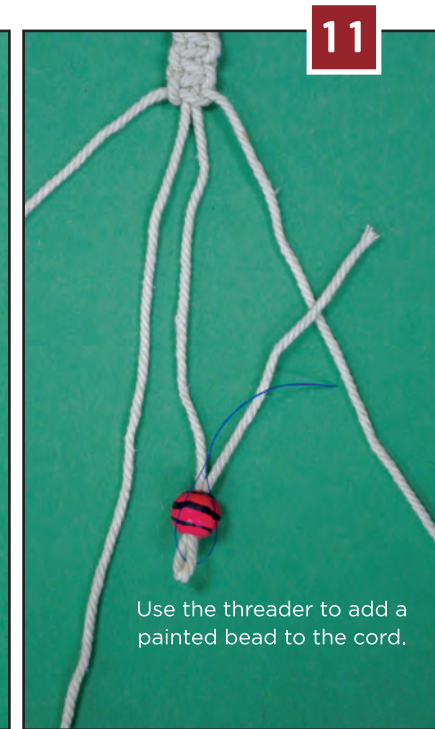
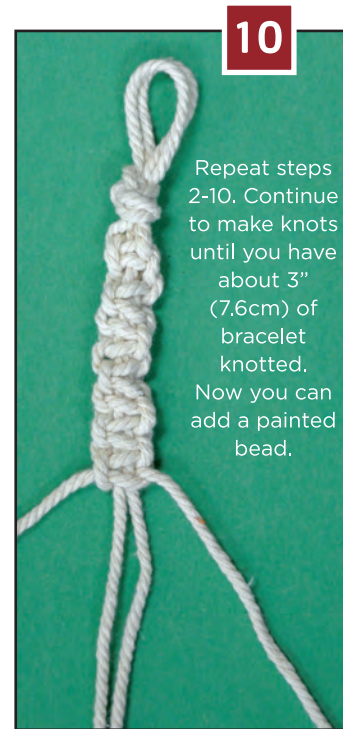
Cross the left cord (C) over the right cord (A).



Pass the left cord (C) under the center cords (B) and up through the loop you made on the right.



Pull the left and right cords (A and C) to tighten the knot. Pull the B cords down.



To finish, add a bead to one of the center strands and secure by knotting all 4 cords together. To wear, slip the end bead through the loop like a button.

## WIND CHIME

- Paint paper sticks, leaves, feathers and beads as desired. Refer to photos for inspiration.

- Glue sticks into an "X" shape and let dry.

- Wrap cord where sticks cross, creating a loop on top for hanging.

- Cut seven 8" (20cm) lengths of cord.

- Thread chimes through 4 of the cord lengths. Tie to chimes and to the sticks as shown. Trim excess.

- Glue feathers and leaves to 2 of the cord lengths. Tie to sticks at varying lengths. Trim excess.

- Thread beads onto 1 cord length and knot end. Refer to photo for placement. Trim excess.

- Place the metal chimes close together so they can touch when the wind blows.

- Display your wind chime in a covered area to protect it from the weather.
