Rails should be installed per the Instructions for Use (IFU) provided with/on the Value Care Bed.





The *Invacare* **Value Care Semi-Electric Bed** utilizes a single motor design making the bed lightweight and easy to assemble. The advanced pendant is designed to allow the head and knee sections to move either simultaneously or independently at the push of a button.
