



Figure 1 shows a steady increase in the percentage of respondents who believe that the U.S. should do more to help the environment. The percentage rises from 65% in 1990 to 92% in 2000. This indicates a growing public concern for environmental issues over the decade.

Figure 2 shows the percentage of respondents who believe that the U.S. should do less to help the environment. The percentage rises from 35% in 1990 to 8% in 2000. This indicates a decreasing public concern for environmental issues over the decade.
