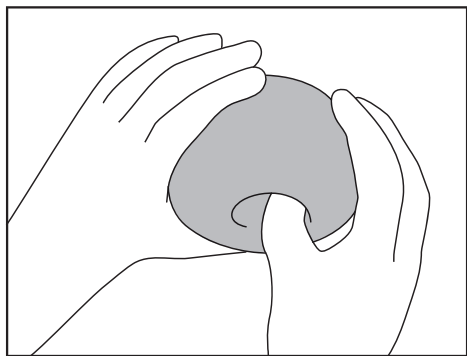


- Set it aside to dry and then paint it.

- You can use a little bit of water to smooth things out if needed. Just don't use too much water or the pot will collapse.



- Rotate the ball of clay and use your thumb and fingers to pinch and form the sides of your pot.

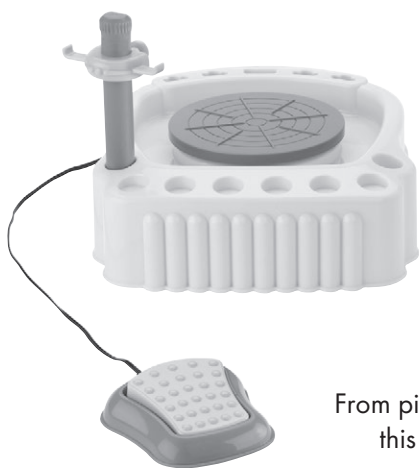
- Roll the clay into a ball and holding it in one hand, insert the thumb of your other hand into the center.

- Break off a hunk of clay about the size of a ping pong ball and begin kneading it to remove air bubbles.

This is a great beginning project. All you need is a little clay and your hands.

- This clay will begin to dry as soon as it is exposed to air. Store any remaining clay inside a re-sealable bag when not in use.
- Remember clay is fragile when dried, so treat it with care. Find a special place to display your work of art.
- Clay must dry for 24 hours before painting.
- This clay is for decorative purposes only and should not be used for food or beverages.

Important Information about the Clay

- The paint included is a specially formulated non-toxic, acrylic paint that dries permanently on most surfaces, so be careful.
- Cover your work surface with a newspaper. Have a cup of water and paper towels handy.
- Wear a smock or old clothes. This acrylic paint can stain. Clean up any spills immediately with soap and water.
- Paint can settle and separate over time. Mix each color thoroughly before you begin painting. If the paint seems too thick, stir in a drop or two of water.
- Before changing colors, rinse and dry your brush thoroughly.

- Newspaper • Paper Towels • Small plastic bowl for water
- Re-sealable plastic bags for clay storage • Cookie cutters
- Tooth pick or paper clip • Rolling pin

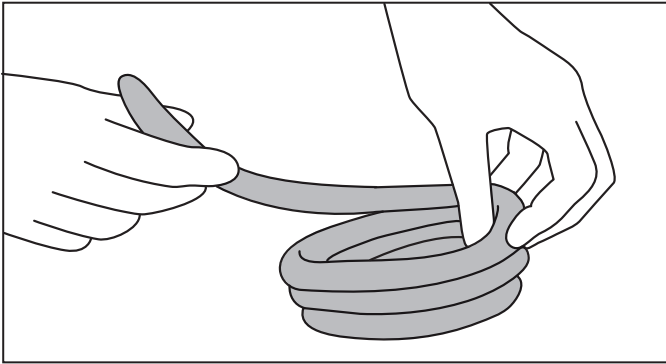
This refill kit can be used with the #14595 Pottery Studio. Please refer to the instruction booklet included in that kit for further information.



You can create projects using the tools and wheel from your Pottery Studio set or just use the components included in this refill set. Look inside for more ideas.

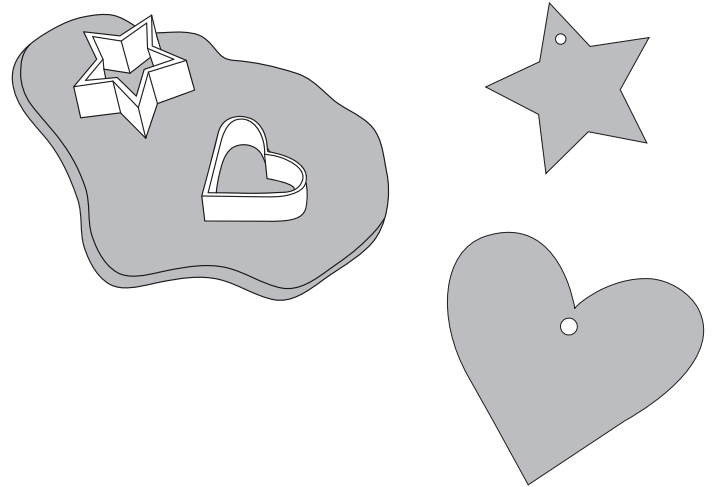
Coil Pots

- Squeeze a lump of clay. Dampen your hands slightly with water and begin rolling your clay into a nice even rope.
- Wind the rope into a coil to create the base of your pot.
- Continue winding the coil up to create the sides of your pot.



Create an Ornament

Roll out a slab of clay using a rolling pin, or press it out with your hands, until it is about 1/4" (.63cm) thick. Use cookie cutters, or a plastic knife to cut into the shape you want. Using the end of your paint brush or a tooth pick, poke a hole in the top of your ornament. Be sure it is large enough to insert a ribbon or string for hanging. Use a tooth pick or paper clip to draw details into your ornament.



Hand-sculpted Clay

Since clay is so moldable, you can create almost any shape. You can make whimsical animals, flowers, aliens, bugs, monsters, doll house miniatures, cartoon characters - whatever you can dream up. Here are just a few examples of the things you can make.



Clay Beads - Clay beads can be made in almost any shape and size. Just remember to use a paper clip or tooth pick to add a hole for stringing your beads.

Painting your Pieces

Again, be sure your clay pieces are completely dry before painting. For best results, set them aside to dry overnight.

The paint included in this kit will give your pieces a glaze-like finish. When completely dry, the paint becomes shiny - almost like kiln-fired pottery.
