
Pinch Pots

Look for the Do Art Pottery Studio #14595

- Squeeze a lump of clay. Dampen your hands slightly with water and begin rolling your clay into a nice even rope.
- Wind the rope into a coil to create the base of your pot.
- Continue winding the coil up to create the sides of your pot.

Roll out a slab of clay using a rolling pin, or press it out with your hands, until it is about 1/4" (.63cm) thick. Use cookie cutters, or a plastic knife to cut into the shape you want. Using the end of your paint brush or a tooth pick, poke a hole in the top of your ornament. Be sure it is large enough to insert a ribbon or string for hanging. Use a tooth pick or paper clip to draw details into your ornament.

## **Painting your Pieces**

Since clay is so moldable, you can create almost any shape. You can make whimsical animals, flowers, aliens, bugs, monsters, doll house miniatures, cartoon characters - whatever you can dream up. Here are just a few examples of the things you can make.



**Clay Beads** - Clay beads can be made in almost any shape and size. Just remember to use a paper clip or tooth pick to add a hole for stringing your beads.

Again, be sure your clay pieces are completely dry before painting. For best results, set them aside to dry overnight.

The paint included in this kit will give your pieces a glaze-like finish. When completely dry, the paint becomes shiny – almost like kiln-fired pottery.
