

Try mixing clay to create new colors:



yellow + pink = orange

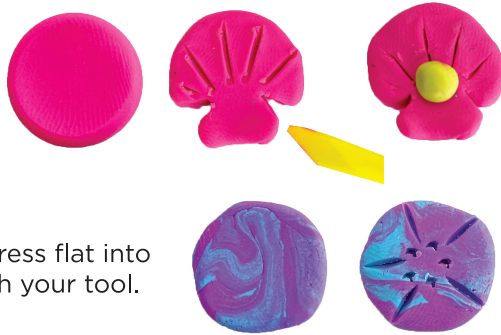
aqua + yellow = green



violet + blue = grape

Roll a ball of clay and press flat into a circle. Cut the base as shown. Add details with your tool and another ball of clay to make a pearl.

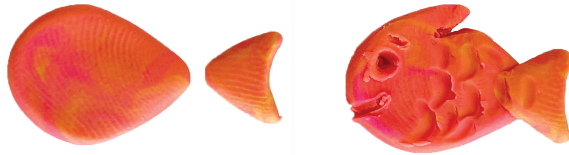
Shells



Roll a ball of clay and press flat into a circle. Add details with your tool.

Roll a ball of clay, press flat into a circle then pinch into a teardrop. Add a tail shape and connect. Create face and scale details with your tool. Cut a small fin into the top.

Make your own

Water Globes

Note: You will need to divide up your supplies so you have enough materials to make all 2 water globes. For best results, plan out your designs before you begin. Refer to the box for ideas and inspiration.

Craft with care. Keep glitter away from your eyes, nose and mouth. Rinse with water as needed.

BEFORE YOU START:

Place the base on your work station with the shallow side facing up. This is the side you will decorate.

Do not decorate the side with the removable stopper.

If not assembled correctly, the dome will not fit onto the base.

1. Completely cover the base with a thin layer of clay. Push the clay evenly to the edge. Even small open areas around the edge could create a leak.

2. Flip the base over and remove the stopper. Using the pointed clay tool, clear the clay away from the hole and replace the stopper. Do not place clay over the hole when decorating. This is where the water will be added later.

3. Decorate your scene by making clay seaweed, coral and waves - anything you can imagine! Be sure to press them to the base clay to keep them in place.

4. Place clay on the bottom on the figurines to stick them to the base clay. Press the clay on the figurine into the base clay to keep it in place.

5. Turn the base over and give it a firm shake to make sure everything is secure.

***Pro tip-** to keep the glitter from sticking to the inside of the globe, try smearing a tiny amount of dish soap around the inside of the globe before the next step.*

6. Sprinkle the glitter over your scene, add some extra to float around. Try to keep the glitter away from the edges for the most secure seal.

Note: You may need to wash your hands when switching colors of clay.



7. Press the top of the globe onto the base. It should fit very snugly. You may need to ask an adult or older friend to help with this step. Add the colorful fun stickers to lid.



*** It is best to work over a sink and ask an adult for help as needed. Have some paper towels handy to clean up any drips. ***

8. Wipe away any clay from the outer edge, where the globe meets the base. Add a line of glue around the seam. Place the water globe on the clear plastic tray and allow to dry, for 1-2 hours.



9. Remove the stopper from the bottom of the base and place the funnel in the hole. Use a small stream of cool water to fill the base. Once it is filled, replace the stopper. For a crystal clear water globe, try using bottled or distilled water.

10. Watch your scenes sparkle! Hold the base and globe together while shaking.



Display - place your water globes on the clear plastic trays provided in case of accidental leakage. Do not display your globes directly on wood or any surface that may be damaged by water. These globes also look great without the water!

As with any handcrafted item, your water globes may change over time. This is a normal part of the crafting process.
