
2 Wrap the yarn around the pegs to the right, as shown.

PRO-TIP Always wrap your yarn around the back of the peg or your loops will ge

too tight.

- **3** Wrap around the entire loom 2 times as
- 4 Secure your working yarn around the anchor peg several times.

PRO-TIP Add small pieces of fiberfill to the ball while sewing the hole shut.

FOR THE



5 Starting with the last wrapped peg, slide your knitting hook along the groove. Hook the bottom loop, then pull it over the top loop and peg as shown. Release the yarn from your hook.


Continue around the entire loom until each peg has one loop left. You've just completed casting on to your loom and knitting the first row. Push the yarn down onto the pegs.

6 Wrap around the loom one more time. Once each peg has a second row, you are ready to hook again. After knitting a few more rows, remove the knot on the anchor peg and let it hang from the bottom of your project.

Repeat wrap and hook steps until you've completed 20 rows total. You should have one loop remaining on each peg. Measure a 20" (50.8 cm) tail and trim.

FINISHING THE BODY

1 Turn the loom upside down and use the needle threader to thread the tail yarn, through the large plastic needle.




Continue around your loom, sewing through each loop, as shown. Continue around the bottom of your sewing through each loop. Pull the yarn tightly to close it up, leaving only a small hole.

- 2 Sew through the first loop one more time.
- **3** Flip the loom rightside up so you see the inside. Tightly knot your yarn to the last loop and trim the excess.
- 4 Thread the needle again with the other tail still attached to the loom. Sew the yarn through the first loop, pulling the yarn all the way through. As you sew through each loop, pull it off the peg as you go. Repeat this step until you've completed half the loom.
- 5 Use the fiberfill to stuff your plushie. Divide the fiberfill and save a little bit for the legs.








6 Finish sewing through the rest of the each loop, pulling it off the peg as you go. Pull the hole shut, leaving only a small hole as shown.

Sew through the first loop one more time.

7 Tie a knot to the hole and tuck the rest of the tail into the ball.

ADDING STICKER ACCESSORIES

- 1 Use the large white sticker to cover one of the holes. This becomes the unicorn's nose and face.
- 2 Add the purple mouth, nose, eyes, and pink hearts to the face of your unicorn.
- 3 With the remaining white yarn, cut 2 6" (5.2 cm) pieces. Thread each string through an ear.



4 Tie each ear to the sides of the unicorn's head as shown.

Place the pink triangle stickers over the ears.

5 Thread the needle with the ribbon on the gold horn. Tie the horn in between the ears, as shown and double knot.

MAKE A POM POM MANE

1 Cut 3 - 6" (5.2 cm) pieces of the rainbow yarn and set them aside. Using the small loom, you will make 3 small pom poms. These will be used to make the unicorn's mane.

Tie the rainbow yarn to the anchor peg and wrap the yarn around the pegs, as shown 8 times and trim.

2 Use the 6" (5.2 cm) string that was set aside to tie a double knot around the middle. The ends of this string will be used to tie the pom pom to the unicorn's mane, so don't trim!

REMINDER Don't trim the 6" (5.2 cm) string around the middle. It is used to tie the pom pom to the














3 Use the hook to remove the pom pom from the loom and cut cut the loops of each end.

Repeat these steps until you've completed 3 pom poms.

4 Take the tails from the middle of the pom pom. Use the needle to tie one pom pom onto the white yarn in front of the gold horn and make a double knot.

Tie with a double knot, the other 2 pom poms onto the white yarn behind the gold horn, as shown.



MAKE A POM POM TAIL

5 Use the remaining rainbow yarn to create a tassel for the unicorn tail. Cut 2 - 8" (20.3 cm) pieces of yarn and set aside. Using the large loom, wrap the yarn around the pegs as shown until there isn't any yarn remaining.

Use the 8" (20.3 cm) string that was set aside to tie a double knot around the middle.

6 Use the hook to remove the loops from the loom. Trim the loops at both ends, as shown.

7 Fold in half and use the last piece of 8" (20.3 cm) yarn to tie a double knot around the top. The ends of this string will be used to tie the tassel to the unicorn's back, so don't trim!

8 Thread on the tails from the double knot to the needle using the threader. Tie the tassel onto the top of the hole on the backside of the unicorn.

Make a double knot and tuck remaining string into the white knit.



hide small tails of yarn, use your finger or the hook tool to poke them through the knit















KNITTING 4 LEGS


- 1 Using the small loom, tie the white yarn to the anchor peg, leaving an 8" (20.3 cm) tail. Knit 5 rows, using the same process as the large loom.
- 2 Cut a small tail and tie it onto your pink yarn. Knit 3 rows with the pink yarn to create your unicorn feet.
- 3 Cut the pink yarn, leaving a 6" (5.2 cm) tail. Use the needle on the pink tail to sew the yarn through the first loop, as shown, pulling all the way through and removing the loop from the loom.

As you sew through each loop, pull it off the peg as you go. Repeat this step until you've completed removing the leg from the loom.

- 4 Sew through the first loop one more time and tuck the tail through the hole on the top.
- 5 Turn the leg inside out and use the tail to tie a double knot to the last loop.

You will repeat this process to make 4 legs.

6 Divide the remaining fiberfil into 4 even piles. Use one of the piles to stuff each of the 4 legs.



DIVIDE LAST OF FIBERFILL INTO 4 PILES

ATTACHING THE LEGS

1 Flip the body over so you are looking at the belly and plan out where the legs should go. Use the image to left as a guide to help you place them.



2 Position the first leg on the belly. Thread the white yarn tail onto the needle with the threader. Using the needle, pick up loops from the bottom of the leg and stitch them around the leg to the body.

Once you've worked around sewing the leg onto the body, double knot the tail to your last stitch.

Tuck the knot and remaining tail into the body, using the needle, and trim

3 Repeat this step for the other 3 legs.
