



Before You Begin

- Save the box! With adult assistance, carefully cut out the play mat printed on the back of your box.
- Paint is permanent when dry and may stain clothing, fabric and other surfaces. Cover your work surface and wear a smock or old clothes. Have a cup of water and paper towels handy.
- Clean up spills immediately. Wash clothing within an hour to help prevent stains.
- Rinse your paint brush with water before changing colors and after use.
- Paint can settle and separate over time, Mix each color throughly before you begin painting.

Paint and Decorate

Paint For ideas, refer to the pictures here and on box.

 Paint your Dino as desired. Paint same color areas first and allow them to dry in-between coats. Paint is permanent when dry and may stain clothing, fabric and other surfaces. Cover your work surface and wear a smock or old clothes. Rinse and dry your paintbrush before switching to a new color. Set aside to fully dry.



- Once your paint is dry, apply the two white circular stickers on either side of your Dino's face then press the wiggly eyes on top.
- Apply the triangular dimensional stickers to the Dino's scales and circular dimensional stickers to it's body. Stickers placed on painted surfaces cannot be repositioned.
- Place the Dino and leaf-shaped bowl onto the mat. Apply the flat stickers around the mat. When you are finished, move the Dino off of the mat and onto a paper towel.









Planting Fabric Tongue



- Place the tongue in water until completely saturated.
- Feed the narrow end of the tongue through the mouth as shown.
- Pull the tongue through until the wide end reaches the mouth.
- Hang the narrow end outside of the body like this.



Potting Mix

- Open the potting mix. Add a few tablespoons of clean water. Squish the bag until the mix clumps together like clay. Add more water as needed. If the potting mix is too wet, lay a paper towel over the mix to absorb the excess water.
- Squeeze the mixture into the bottom of the Dino. Lightly press the potting mix down into the body and fill until it's 1/2 inch (1.3 cm) from the top.
- Lay the tongue on top of the potting mix.
- Squeeze more of the potting mix on top of the tongue and fill until it's 1/4 inch (0.6 cm) from the top. Lightly press it down.

Chia Seeds

- Sprinkle the seeds over the mixture, making sure to not overcrowd the seeds. Save the rest of the seeds to plant later.
- Water the seeds with a tablespoon of water.







Water and Grow

Leaf-Shaped Bowl

- Place the play mat in a warm, sunny place. Put the Dino back onto the play mat and put the end of the tongue inside the bowl.
- Fill the bowl with clean water. The tongue will absorb the water and feed your plant for days. Refill the bowl as needed.

Helpful Hints

- Chia seed should sprout in 3 to 5 days. The seeds need a little room to grow so adding too many seeds at one time will inhibit plant growth.
- For best results do not put your Dino in direct sunlight.
- To keep your Dino looking great, avoid unnecessary handling once complete.
- Over time, you may see a fuzzy growth on the soil or plants. This harmless growth called mold is nature's way of breaking down the old plants to make new soil.
- Use the remainder of the seeds to replant later.
