Sparkle N' Grow BUTTERFLY TERRARIUM



Important: Read all directions before you begin. Refer to the Helpful Hints section at the end of these instructions.
Everything you need is included – just add water! Quick grow chia and wheat grass seeds sprout in 3 to 4 days.

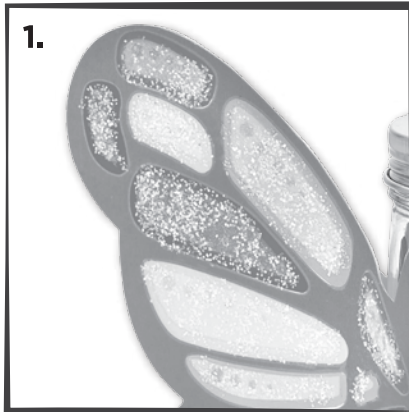
Get Ready to Grow

Gardening can be a little messy. Cover your work surface or work outdoors. You have enough materials to plant your garden twice. Set the rest of your materials aside to use later.

Decorate

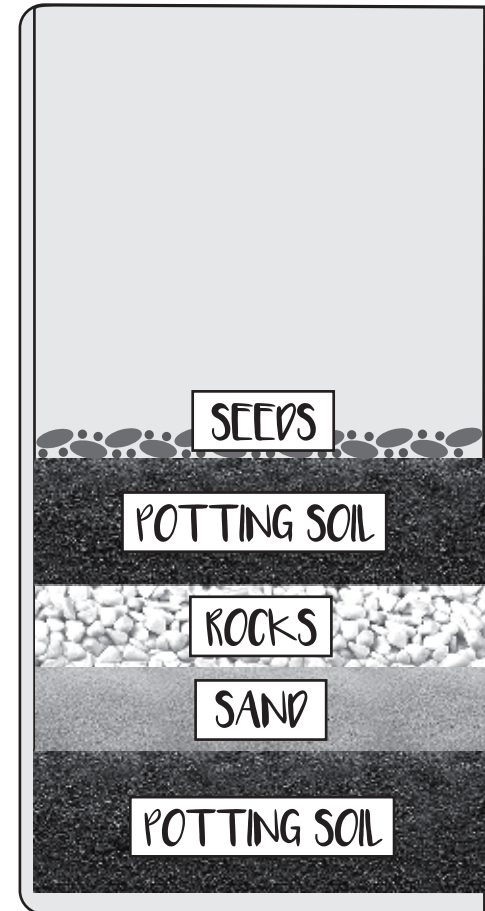
1. Decorate the cardboard butterfly wings with glitter stickers.
2. Attach the pipe cleaner antennas through the lid – twist as shown. Add the beads, fold down pipe cleaner ends to secure.
3. Attach the cardboard wings. Working from the bottom, open up the wings and slide them onto the jar. Work carefully so you don't tear them.

Note: For step 4, you will add the flowers and butterflies after planting. Push the stems and wires into the soil to secure.



Plant

- Keep the soil, sand and stones at the bottom 1/3 of the terrarium
- Layer a small amount of soil, sand and rocks as shown – Finish off the top with another layer of soil for planting. You can add a little decorative sand and stones to the top as desired. save the rest for replanting later.
- Add a few chia and a few wheat grass seeds. You can use a pencil to push them down into the soil. Mist the seeds heavily until the soil is very wet. Soil must be kept damp for seeds to sprout.
- See step 4.
- Replace the lid. Once the seeds sprout remove the lid. Along with water, your plants need sunshine and air to grow.



Helpful Hints

In most cases, your garden will begin to sprout in 3-4 days.

For best results, keep your terrarium under your grow light or in a warm sunny place.

If your seeds are not sprouting, check to be sure the soil is damp, misting as needed.

Note - If your garden gets too wet or humid you may notice some new fuzzy growth appear. These are little plants called mold. Remove the lid and let your garden dry a bit – air circulation helps. The mold is nature's way of breaking down the seeds and plant material to create new soil.

Over time, your garden will need replanted. You can use any leftover materials and plant it again, or buy new seeds and soil. These are available at any garden center.
