



12. Shake globe and watch it sparkle.

Display - Place your water globes on the plastic trays provided. In case of accidental leakage, do not display your globes on wood or any surface that may be damaged by water. These globes also look great without the water!



As with any handcrafted item, your water globes may change over time. This is a normal part of the crafting process. Save any materials for touch up and repair. Be sure to open the water globe over a sink if touch ups & repairs are needed.

Important

This is a handmade item. In some cases, leakage may occur. Follow these tips to get the best result:

- 1) Follow instructions carefully.
- 2) Make sure your hands are clean and your work surface is clean.
- 3) Use an even, complete layer of clay on the bottom of your dome.
- 4) Do not use too much glitter.
- 5) Be sure to seal dome completely.
- 6) Hold bottom and top of dome when shaking (but do not squeeze).
- 7) Display dome on clear trays provided.
- 8) Do not display on a surface that could become damaged if it gets wet.
- 9) Do not display in an area with excessive temperature fluctuation.
- 10) Prolonged exposure to water may change color of clay.

Plan out designs before you begin. Refer to the box for ideas. Divide up the supplies so you have enough materials to make all 3 globes.

Decorate shallow side of globe base. Do not decorate side with removable stopper.

Mix clay for new colors:
Red + Yellow = Orange
Yellow + Blue = Green
Red + Yellow + Blue = Brown
Blue + White = Light Blue
White + Red + Yellow = Peach

1. Cover base of globe with a thin layer of clay. Push the clay evenly to the edge of the base. This will help seal the globe so that water will not leak out.






2. Flip base over and remove stopper. Using a clay tool, clear the clay out of the hole and replace stopper. Keep hole clear when decorating. This is where you will add water later.

3. Decorate your scene by making clay fish, coral,

4. Use your tools to make hash marks on the bottom of clav pieces to hold them together. Use tools to smudge them firmly into the base clay.



















6. Place clay on bottom of figurines to stick them to base clay.
