- 1. This Hi-Top Creeper is a tool to reach what are normally hard to reach places, such as the topside of an engine compartment for mechanics.
- ALWAYS inspect the Hi-Top Creeper for damage before each use. Do not use if damage is detected. Make sure all nuts and bolts are secure before each use.
- 3. ALWAYS make sure the angle adjustment bar is secure in one of the three position slots before using.
- ALWAYS face the Hi-Top Creeper when climbing up or down. Use both hands and keep your body centered between the rails.
- DO NOT use the Hi-Top Creeper if you tire easily or are subject to fainting spells or disorientation.
- DO NOT use the Hi-Top Creeper if you are taking medication that could impair judgment or are under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- DO NOT overload the Hi-Top Creeper. The maximum capacity is 400 lbs (180 kg) which includes body weight, tools and torque applied to tools.
- 8. DO NOT use the Hi-Top Creeper over a running engine.
- 9. ALWAYS wear safety goggles that provide front and side protection for the eyes.
- 10. ALWAYS wear gloves that provide protection based on the work materials or to reduce the effects of tool vibration.

- Lean your chest onto the chest pad deck gently. Avoid causing a shock load by jumping or falling onto the chest pad deck.

- DO NOT get the Hi-Top Creeper wet or use in damp locations or where there is condensation.
- 16. ONLY use the Hi-Top Creeper on flat, level surfaces that can withstand the weight of total load.
- 17. ALWAYS lock the casters before using the folding Hi-Top Creeper.

UNPACKING

AWARNING: DO NOT operate the tool if any part is missing. Replace the missing part before operating. Failure to do so can result in a malfunction and personal injury.

Remove the parts and accessories from the packaging and inspect for damage. Make sure all items in the contents are included.






6 mm Hex Key, Adjustable Wrench, 10, 13, 14 & 19 mm Socket or Wrench

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

- Place the angle support (17) into the height adjustment notches of each leg (5 & 6). The height adjustment notches (Fig. 1) will be on the inside and the legs must angle outwards. Lay the angle support flat with the support bars facing the front of the creeper.
- 2. Assemble the right and left legs (5 & 6) to the base frame (1) (Fig. 2). Insert the end of each leg into the base frame's openings and align the bolt holes. Secure each leg with a frame bolt (14) and 19 mm lock nut (21). Insert the two leg lock pins (13) and push the safety clip down to secure the legs.
- 3. Attach the front casters (10) by inserting the stem of each caster through the end of each leg and securing with a flange nut. (Fig. 3) Install the rear locking casters (11) to the base frame in the same manner. Lock the rear wheels in place for the remainder of the assembly by pressing down on the locking tab with your foot.











ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

- 4. Install the ladder assembly (2) by inserting a frame bolt (14) through each side of the base frame and lower ladder assembly. (Fig. 4) Secure each bolt with a 19 mm lock nut (21). Place a bumper pad on each support bar of the angle support (17) and swing the angle support up into the angle support bracket on the ladder assembly and secure with angle support bolt (18) and 13 mm lock nut (22). Repeat on other side.
- Place the leg cross support (7) on both legs (5 & 6), aligning the bolt holes. (Fig. 5) Insert a cross support bolt (15) through each end of the leg cross support and leg. Slide a washer (19) over each bolt and secure with a 13 mm lock nut (22).
- Attach the chest deck frame (3) to the top of the ladder assembly (2) using three chest frame bolts (16) and three 13 mm lock nuts (22) on each side. (Fig. 6) Attach the chest deck pad (4) using deck screws (20) from underneath.
- Place the pouch bracket (9) over the pouch (8) and align the holes. (Fig. 6) Insert chest frame bolts (16) through the holes. Line up the protruding bolts with the holes in the deck frame's front. Secure the pouch to the deck frame with 13 mm lock nuts (22).
- Place the foam bumper pad (12) over the ladder assembly's crosspiece (Fig. 7). This will prevent the ladder from scuffing the vehicle.
- 9. Recheck and tighten all bolts and screws as necessary.









CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Maintain the tool with care. A tool in good condition is more efficient, easier to control and will have fewer problems.

Inspect the tool components periodically. Repair or replace damaged or worn components. Only use identical replacement parts when servicing.

Maintain the tool's labels and name plates. These carry important information. If unreadable or missing, contact customer service for replacement.

AWARNING: Only qualified service personnel should repair the tool. An improperly repaired tool may present a hazard to the user and/or others.

CLEANING

Wipe clean as needed. Use mild upholstery cleaner (not caustic) to clean the chest deck pad as needed.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE CONT.

LUBRICATION

DO NOT lubricate the casters. This can damage the mechanism.

STORAGE

1. Remove the leg lock pins from each leg.

ACAUTION: Hold the ladder when removing the second pin as the base frame will fall to the floor. Store the pins in the creeper's pouch.

- 2. Push the ladder's angle support arms back towards the ladder to the highest locked position.
- 3. Lift the legs up until they rest next to the ladder assembly.
- 4. Store the creeper vertically. Make sure the rear casters are locked once in place.

REMOVAL FROM STORAGE

1. While holding onto one support leg and the padded deck, slowly lower the support legs to the floor.

▲CAUTION: Watch your head.

- 2. Pull the ladder's angle support arms forward to settle in a height adjustment notch.
- 3. Remove the leg lock pins from the pouch.
- 4. Hold onto one leg and lift the base frame until the bolt holes align. Push a lock pin through and lock into place. Repeat with the other leg.
- 5. Unlock the rear casters and it is ready for use.
