CELEBRATE THE SEASON AND THE SPIRIT OF GIVING. BY MAKING AND SHARING A HANDMADE HOLIDAY CRAFT







Create beautiful window art with this sparkling stained glass paint. Trace your favorite holiday designs with the black outliner paint and then fill them in with an array of brilliant colors. Make your designs pop with rhinestones.

Sparkling window paint can also be used to decorate mirrors or any smooth glass surface.

Remember - Sparkling window paint or outliner should never be used on painted walls, fabric, wood or other porous surfaces. If you are not sure, check with an adult before displaying your art.

Important Information About This Paint

- The paint included is a specially formulated non-toxic acrylic paint that dries permanently on most surfaces, so be careful.
- Paint may stain fabrics, furniture and other porous surfaces. Wear a smock or old clothes and cover your work area with newspaper.
- Clean up any spills immediately with soap and water.
- Paints may settle and separate over time. With the cap on, shake well before using.
- Do not shake black outline paint.
- Save any leftover paint to touch up your designs.
- Window cleaner can be used to remove any paint residue from windows and mirrors.

Paint Tube Tips

Before you paint, here are some important things to remember:

- 1. These paints begin as opaque, pastel colored liquids.
- As they dry the colors become translucent and vibrant.
- 2. If the nozzle becomes clogged, use the tip of a paper clip to clean it out.





OUTLINE YOUR DESIGN

When outlining and painting your design, be sure all lines are connected and spaces are filled in, so when it's dry, it will peel off the plastic sheet as one piece.



You can use the designs we have included in the kit - or draw your own!

- Choose your design and slide the sheet into the plastic cover as shown.
- Use the black outliner paint to trace your designs. Be sure to create a continuous unbroken line.
- Set your design aside to dry. The liner must be completely dry before painting or the paint will smear.



PAINT AND DECORATE



- Fill in your design with the window colors of your choice. Hold the applicator slightly above the plastic sheet and gently squeeze to release the paint.
- Use the applicator tip to spread the paint around. Be sure the paint covers all open areas.
- When you are finished painting, set it aside to dry. Depending on the thickness of the paint, heat, and humidity, drying times may vary. For best results, allow your designs to dry overnight.



PRO TIP: To keep your paints from drying out, always replace the caps when not in use.

RHINESTONES

Once your designs are completely dry, you can add the rhinestones.

Use a dot of leftover window paint to stick them in place. Allow the paint to dry completely before displaying your designs.







PEEL AND PRESS

- Gently peel your finished design away from the plastic sheet. If it sticks, or is difficult to remove, it needs more drying time.
- Press your designs against a clean window. They cling like magic! You can display these on mirrors too.

The color and consistency of your window art may change over time, depending on the amount of light and temperature. Save any leftover paint to create new art.



BLENDING TECHNIQUES

The color blending technique is a great way to add interest and texture to your designs. Simply lay down the colors as shown below. Use a toothpick or paper clip to mix colors together.



OMBRE EFFECT

Fill in the top of the design with one color and the bottom with another.

Drag a toothpick or paper clip through where the two colors meet in a zigzag pattern to create a swirly ombre effect.
