


DECORATE

There is no right or wrong way to decorate the puppets. Encourage your child to be creative and have fun.

Your child may want to arrange the felt shapes on the socks before pressing them into place.

Once they are stuck they can be removed, but not repositioned.

Adding The Mouth



1 Find the pieces that look like this.



Insert your hand into the puppet forming a mouth shape.



Peel and press the mouth sticker in place.
Open and close your fingers to make your puppet "talk".

Note to Parents:

Your child may need a little help peeling the backer from the shapes.

Tip: If you are having trouble removing the backer, rub adhesive into felt before peeling off.





SETTING THE STAGE

If you don't have a puppet theater, why not make one? You and your child can work together to try some of these simple ideas.



Drape a table with a blanket and then you and your fellow puppeteers can hide behind it.



Stand behind a couch or chair and use that as your puppet stage.
