Option	Electrolyte Imbalance
A	Hyperkalemia
B	Hyponatremia
C	Hypocalcemia
D	Hypomagnesemia

ANSWER: D

RATIONALE: The patient is taking a diuretic, which can cause hypomagnesemia. Weakness and fatigue are common symptoms of hypomagnesemia.

Option	Statement
A	The patient should be positioned in a supine position.
B	The patient should be positioned in a semi-Fowler's position.
C	The patient should be positioned in a prone position.
D	The patient should be positioned in a Sims position.

ANSWER: B

RATIONALE: The patient should be positioned in a semi-Fowler's position to reduce the risk of aspiration.
