

### **DDA LED Residential Downlight**

**INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS** 

Models: DDA3

#### WARNING



RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK. Disconnect power at fuse or circuit breaker before installing or servicing.

Make all electrical and grounded connections in accordance with the NEC and any applicable local code requirements. Installation, service and maintenance of luminaire should be performed by a qualified licensed electrician.

Do not touch the yellow surface of the LED as it may damage the light engine.






Make sure that the supply voltage is the same as the luminaire voltage. Suitable for use in wet location in covered ceiling installations only.



## **Components required for Installation Light Engine / Frame**

















 ${\it Make sure all power is turned off before beginning installation}$ 

#### Installation

Main steps for installation are as follows:

- 1) Rough in of housing or frame and downlight
- 2) Electrical connections to housing/downlight
- 3) Installation of downlight
- 4) Installation of trim

1 Shut off power to desired circuit before any work. Identify and prepare location for installation.

The frames have varying requirements for cutout size. Use the below table for the proper hole size for installation.

#### **Cutout Size**

Adjustable Housing or Plaster Frame= 4.5" min Downlight = 4.25" min, 4.6" max

#### **Adjustable Housing**

Note: Bar hangers are adjustable for use in installations with spacing from 10" to 24". They can be used with joist installations of wood, engineered lumber, steel stud construction and with grid ceilings having T-bars.

Bar hanger may be shortened to fit 12" framing or smaller by breaking at score lines.

#### **Joist Installation**

- Extend bar hangers to fit between wood joists and position the "L" shaped leg at the end of the bar hanger to the bottom of the joist.
- Bar hangers should be level with the bottom of the joist or framing member.
- Hammer pre-inserted nails directly into the wooden joist.

#### **T-Grid Installation**

- Extend bar hangers and align the slots in the mounting tabs over the T-bars.
- Optional fasteners can be used for attaching the bar hangers to the T-bar.

#### **Optional Commercial Mounting Bracket**


- Mounting bracket is supplied from the factory flat against two side walls of the housing.
- To utilize bracket for mounting, two legs will be bent outward for installation. Using plyers, bend each end of the bracket forward at approximately a 45 degree angle.
- Consult local building codes for final support of fixture.

#### **Finalize Installation**

- Adjust housing platform position by sliding on bar hangers to desired position. Use locking screws to secure.
- To Relocate Fixture: Remove nail with hammer claw, move to desired location, re-hammer nails.

#### **Electrical Installation**

- Identify the appropriate opening on the J-Box for the building wiring. Remove knockout on the J-Box.
- Press the clip to open the junction box.
- Feed the building wiring into the knock out holes and connect per the wiring diagram



#### **Adjustable Housing**



#### **Aiming Instructions**

Adjustable brackets allow for aiming of the light source towards objects or walls.

#### **Angular Rotation**

Angular Rotation up to 30°

- Loosen lower thumb screw inside the housing
- Rotate entire LED module to desired angle.
- Degrees are stamped into the bracket for consistent alignment.

#### **Horizontal Rotation**

- Loosen the lock down thumb screw inside the housing
- Rotate LED module to desired location
- Lock thumb screw down to secure the desired position.


#### Vertical adjustment.


Telescoping vertical adjustment available for ceilings greater than ½" thick. Ideally combined with thick collar accessories.

- Loosen the lock down thumb screw inside the housing
- Lower or raise the LED module to desired location
- Lock thumb screw down to secure the desired position.

#### **Trim Installation**

- Install adjustable trim so angled side of trim is parallel to the face of the LED module.
- Insert angled trim, shipped separately, into housing by pressing upward until tight against ceiling.





#### Plaster Frame - to be used in conjunction with the DDA3 Downlight Housing

Note: Bar hangers are adjustable for use in installations with spacing from 10" to 24". They can be used with joist installations of wood, engineered lumber, steel stud construction and with grid ceilings having T-bars.

Bar hanger may be shortened to fit 12" framing or smaller by breaking at score lines.

#### **Joist Installation**

- Extend bar hangers to fit between wood joists and position the "L" shaped leg at the end of the bar hanger to the bottom of the joist.
- Bar hangers should be level with the bottom of the joist or framing member.
- Hammer pre-inserted nails directly into the wooden joist.

#### **T-Grid Installation**

- Extend bar hangers and align the slots in the mounting tabs over the T-bars.
- Optional fasteners can be used for attaching the bar hangers to the T-bar.

#### **Finalize Installation**


- Adjust housing platform position by sliding on bar hangers to desired position. Use locking screws to secure.
- To Relocate Fixture: Remove nail with hammer claw, move to desired location, re-hammer nails.


#### **Downlight /Remodel & Electrical Installation**


- Pull supply wires through the hole in the ceiling.
- Remove the appropriate knock out on the junction box and press the clip to open the junction box.
- Wire fixture in accordance with NEC or your local electrical code.
- Insert fixture, j-box first, into the ceiling cavity. Make sure ceiling attachment springs are loose so they compress into the housing body during insertion.
- Push housing upward until seating flange is flush with the ceiling. Using a Philips head screw driver, tighten the two
   (2) installation tightening screws until the housing is firmly against the ceiling.

#### **Trim Installation**

• Insert downlight trim, shipped separately, into housing by pressing upward until tight against ceiling.







#### **Remodel Mounting**



#### For Air-Tight Installations

Remove gaskets from the J-Box by removing door. After housing is installed and before inserting trim, place gaskets over the (2) two openings where the ceiling attachment clip slides through the housing wall. Closing any openings.

#### **Installation Preparation**

- Scribe a circle in the ceiling in the desired location per the table in step 1.
- Accurately and cleanly cut hole in ceiling. (Note: Jagged edges or an oversize hole may prevent the fixture from seating properly.)

#### **Electrical Installation**


- Pull supply wires through the hole in the ceiling.
- Identify the appropriate openings on the J-Box for the building wiring and driver flexible conduit. Remove knockouts on the J-Box.
- Press the clip to open the junction box.
- Feed the building wiring and the supply wires from the driver assembly into the knock out holes and per the wiring diagram and in accordance with NEC and your local electrical code.


#### **Frame Installation**


- Insert driver and fixture, j-box first, into the ceiling cavity. Make sure support clips are loose so they compress into the housing body during insertion.
- Push housing upward until seating flange is flush with the ceiling.
- Using a Philips head screw driver, tighten the (2) two Installation Tightening Screws until the housing is firmly against the ceiling.


#### **Trim Installation**


• Insert downlight trim, shipped separately, into housing by pressing upward until tight against ceiling.











#### **Accessory Installation**

#### Optic Installation


- Remove optic retainer collar by loosening two (2) screws.
- Remove existing lens from fixture. Take care not to touch the yellow LED surface.
- Align new optic with fixture.
- Replace optic retainer collar and tighten two (2) screws.


#### **Extension Collar Installation**


- Remove existing collar by removing four (4) screws.
- Install new collar by aligning with screw holes and installing screws.

#### **Mud Ring Installation**

- After fixture is installed, place the mudring on the ceiling and carefully align opening with ceiling cutout and fixture opening.
- Secure mudring in place using countersunk screws (supplied). Ensure screws go in smoothly and fit flush with the openings in the mudring.
- Tape and spackle over mudring accordingly. Taper spackle over edges of mudring until smooth.
- Do not spackle over center lip spackle flange at fixture aperture.
- Once completely dry, install trim.

This limited warranty is provided to you, the purchaser of the product identified on Seller's invoice, as your exclusive remedy and applies only to NICOR products that have been purchased from an authorized NICOR Distributor; the product was new and in an unopened NICOR package at the time of installation; and the NICOR product was installed by a licensed electrician or under the supervision of a licensed electrician and used by consumers in the United States or Canada when accompanied with this warranty. This warranty extends only to the first consumer purchaser and is not transferable. A consumer wishing to invoke the terms of this limited warranty must first obtain a RGA number within 30 days of discovery of the defect, and return the product to NICOR for inspection. Once verified to be covered by this limited warranty, NICOR will, at its sole discretion, repair, replace, or refund the purchase price of any product that does not conform to this limited warranty. If NICOR, at its sole discretion, determines that the product should be repaired or replaced, this warranty is limited to the reasonable, customary, and necessary costs and expenses associated with the repair/replacement. This warranty requires that all repair/replacement estimates and costs, including but not limited to equipment rental (if any), and any other cost or expense to be incurred in the repair/replacement of the product, be approved in advance and in writing by NICOR.

FAILURE TO OBTAIN NICOR'S ADVANCE WRITTEN APPROVAL OF ALL REPAIR/REPLACEMENT COSTS AND EXPENSES IN WRITING SHALL VOID THIS LIMITED WARRANTY.
