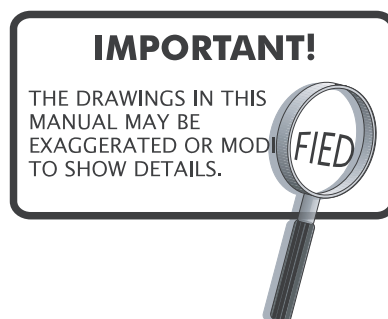

1. This game (with Mechanical Scoring Arm) can be played outdoors in dry weather - but must be stored indoors.
2. Tighten hardware as instructed.
3. Do not over tighten hardware, as you could crush the tubing.
4. Some drawings or images in this manual may not look exactly like your product.
5. To prevent damage to the electronics or to your wall, do not place this unit any closer than six inches from the wall.

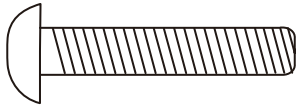

Remove all the parts from the box and verify that you have all of the listed parts as shown on the Parts List.

NOTE: STEP 1, 2 requires a second adult to help “hold” the assemblies as being assembled

NOTE: When unfolding assemblies, be careful not to bend any parts.

PARTS REQUIRED:

2 pcs - **P3** Base Tube

1 pc - **P4** Base Connect Tube

4 pcs - **H3** M6 x 28mm Allen Head Bolt

4 pcs - **H5** M6 Nut

8 pcs - **H4** M6 Flat Washer

STEP 1

Attach the Base connect tube **P4** to the Base tubes **P3** using Nuts **H5**, Washers **H4** and Bolts **H3** as shown in **FIGURE 1**.

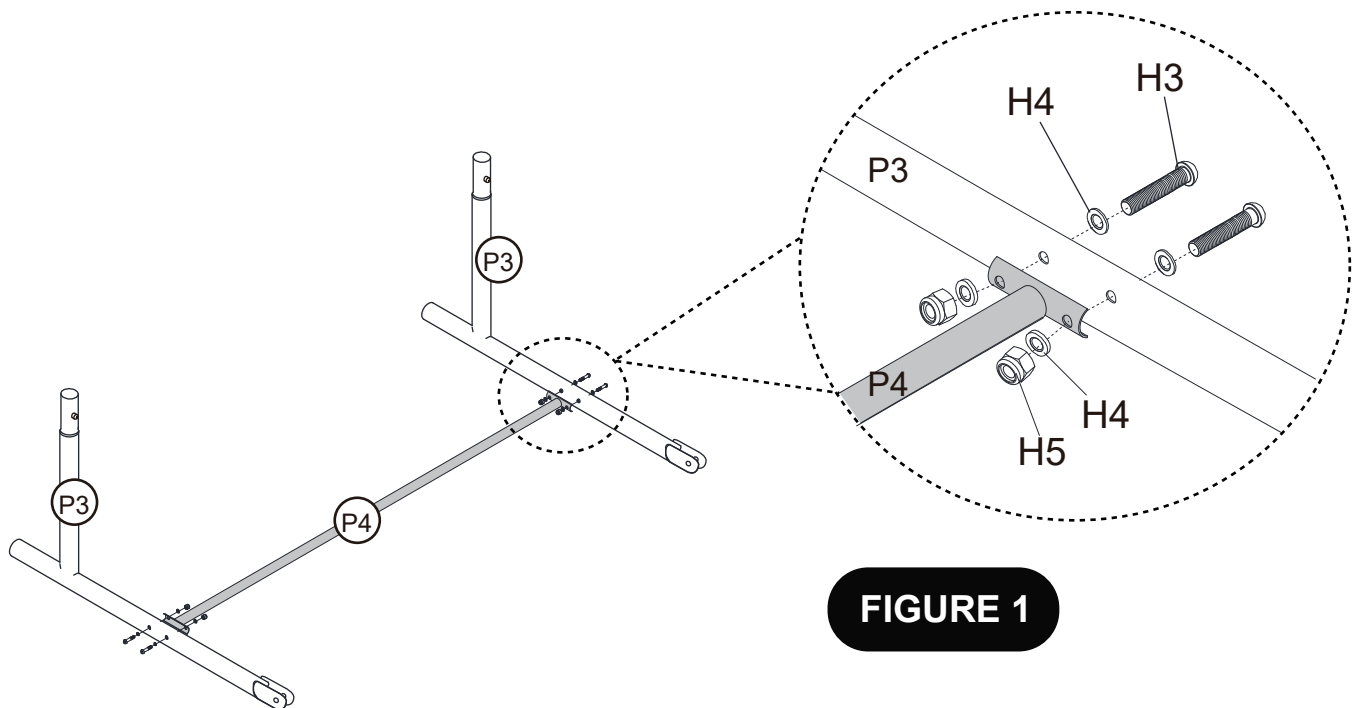

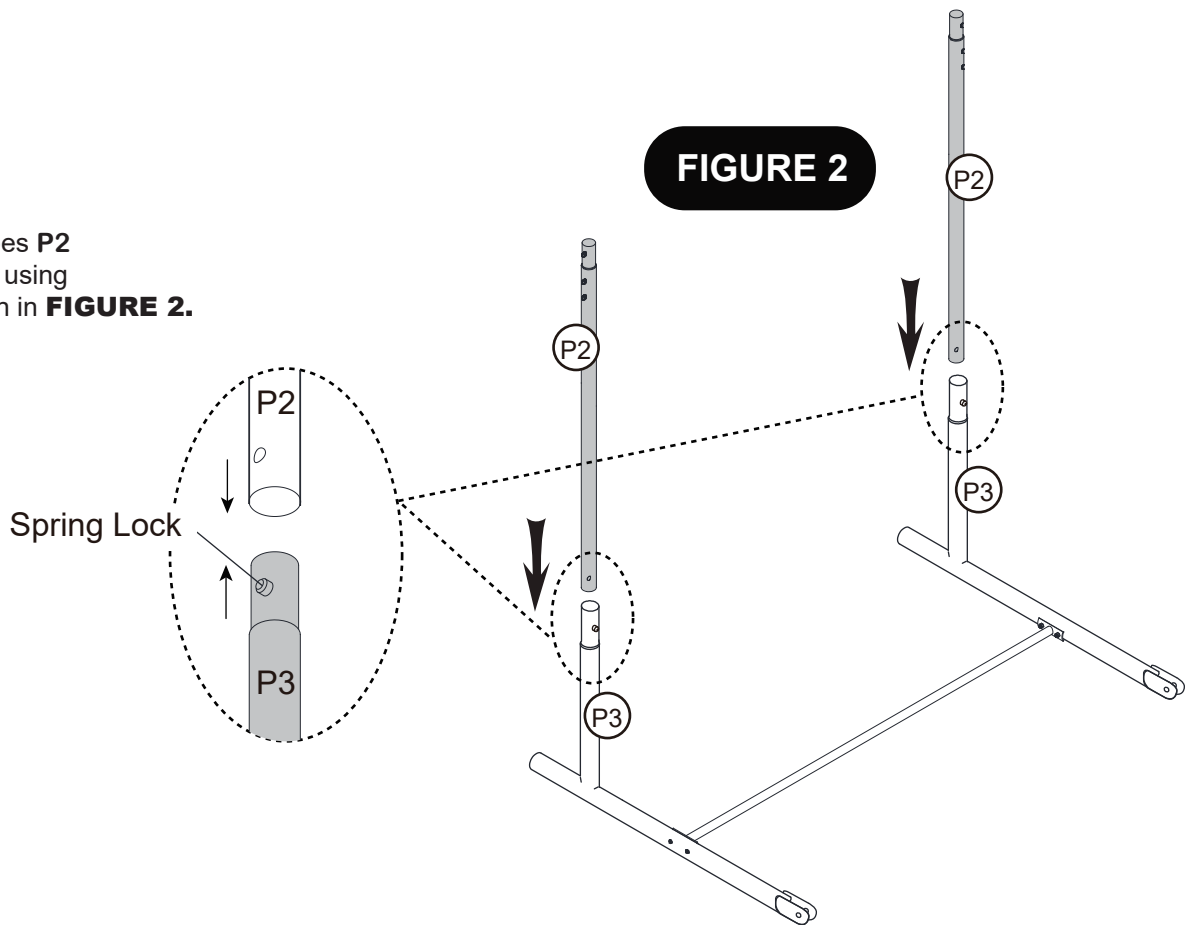
2 pcs - **P2** Board Tube

STEP 2

Attach the Board Tubes **P2** to the Base tubes **P3** using Spring Lock as shown in **FIGURE 2**.



STEP 3

Attach the Base connect tube **P4** to the Board Tubes **P2** using Nuts **H5**, Washers **H4** and Bolts **H3** as shown in **FIGURE 3**.

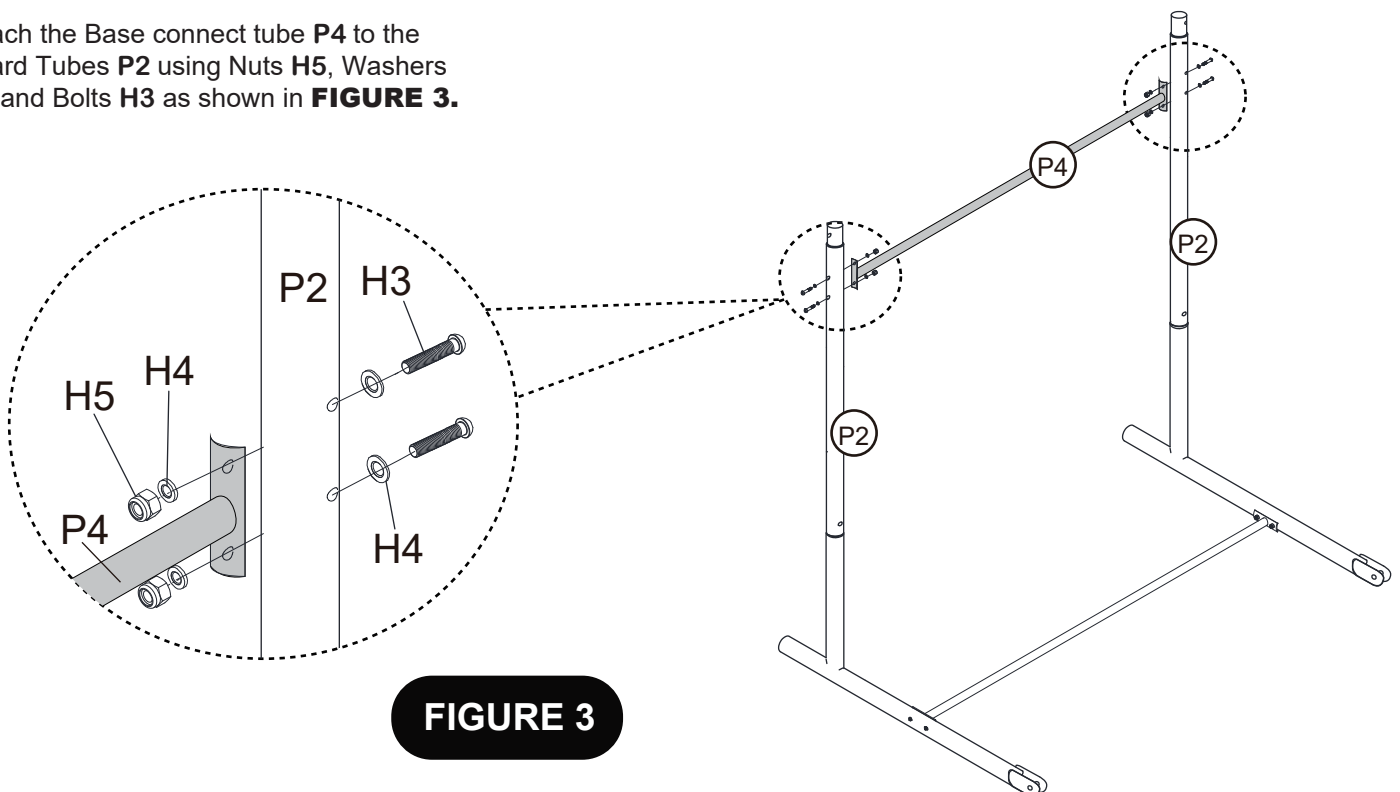

PARTS REQUIRED:

2 pcs - **P1** Board L Tube Top

2 pcs - **H2** M6 x 30mm Allen Head Bolt

2 pcs - **P7** Lower Frame Curved Tube

4 pcs - **H4** M6 Flat Washer

2 pcs - **P8** Upper Frame Curved Tube

2 pcs - **H5** M6 Nut

STEP 4

Attach the Board L Tube Top **P1** to the Board Tubes **P2** as shown in **FIGURE 4**.

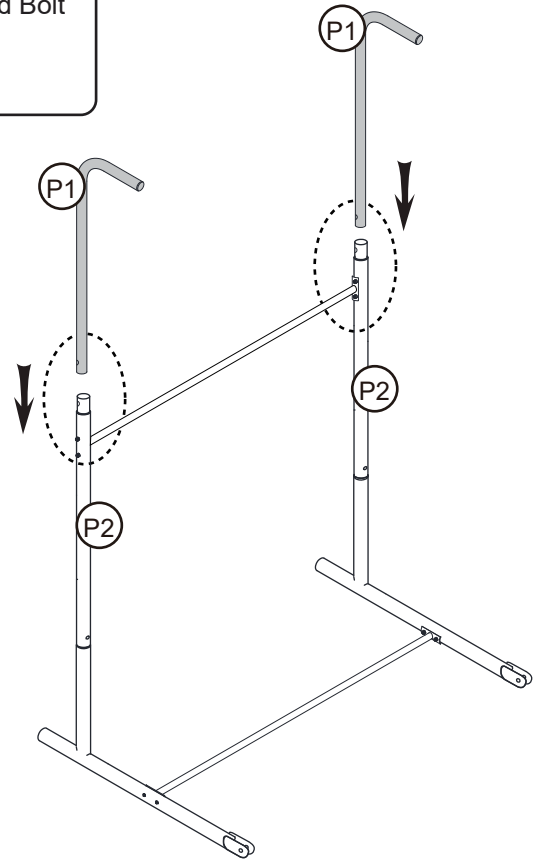

STEP 5

Attach the Lower Frame Curved Tubes **P7** to the Base Tubes **P3** using Nuts **H5**, Washers **H4** and Bolts **H2** as shown in **FIGURE 5**.

Connect the Upper Frame Curved Tubes **P8** to the Lower Frame Curved Tubes **P7** using Spring Lock as shown in **FIGURE 5**.

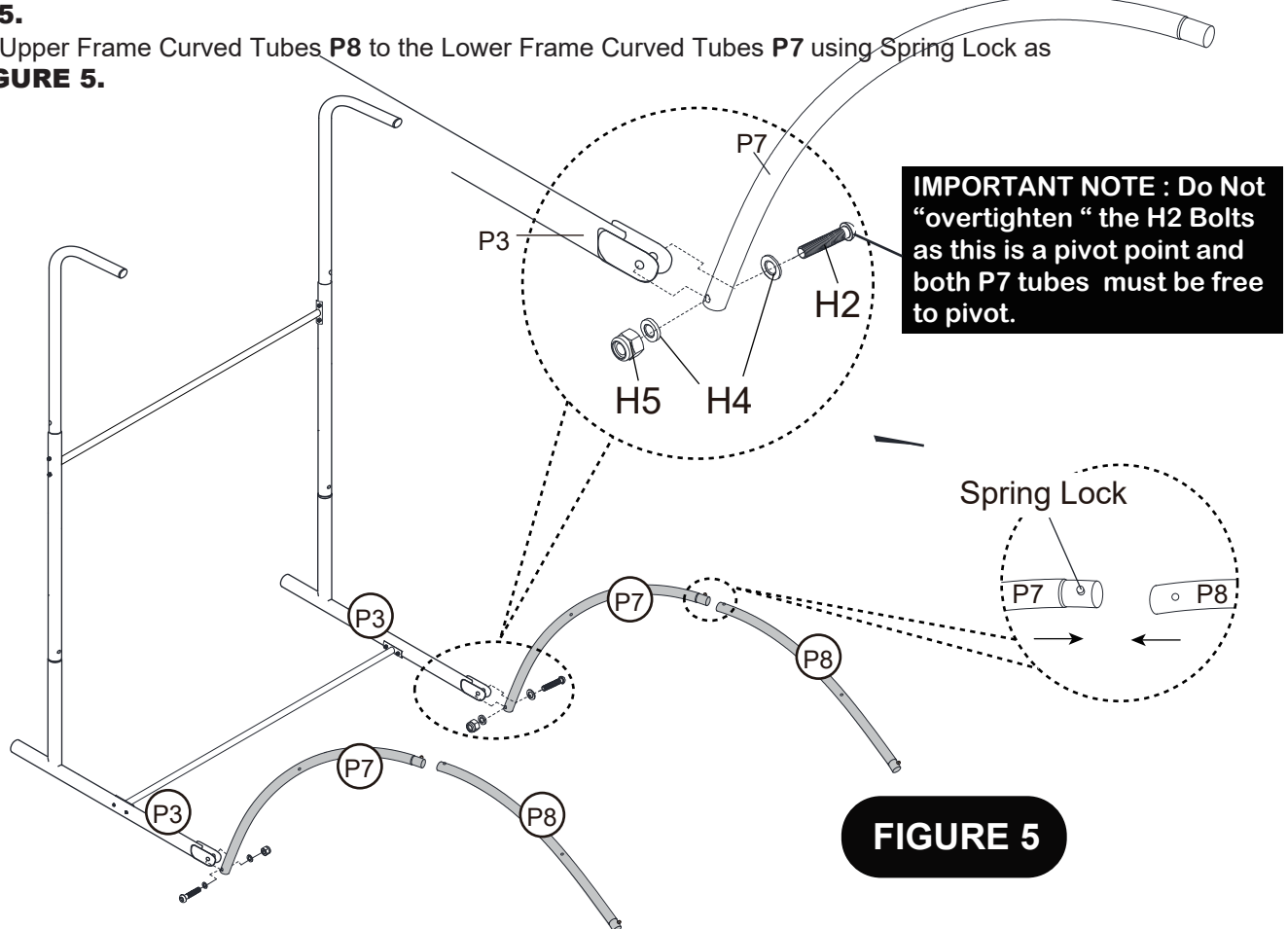

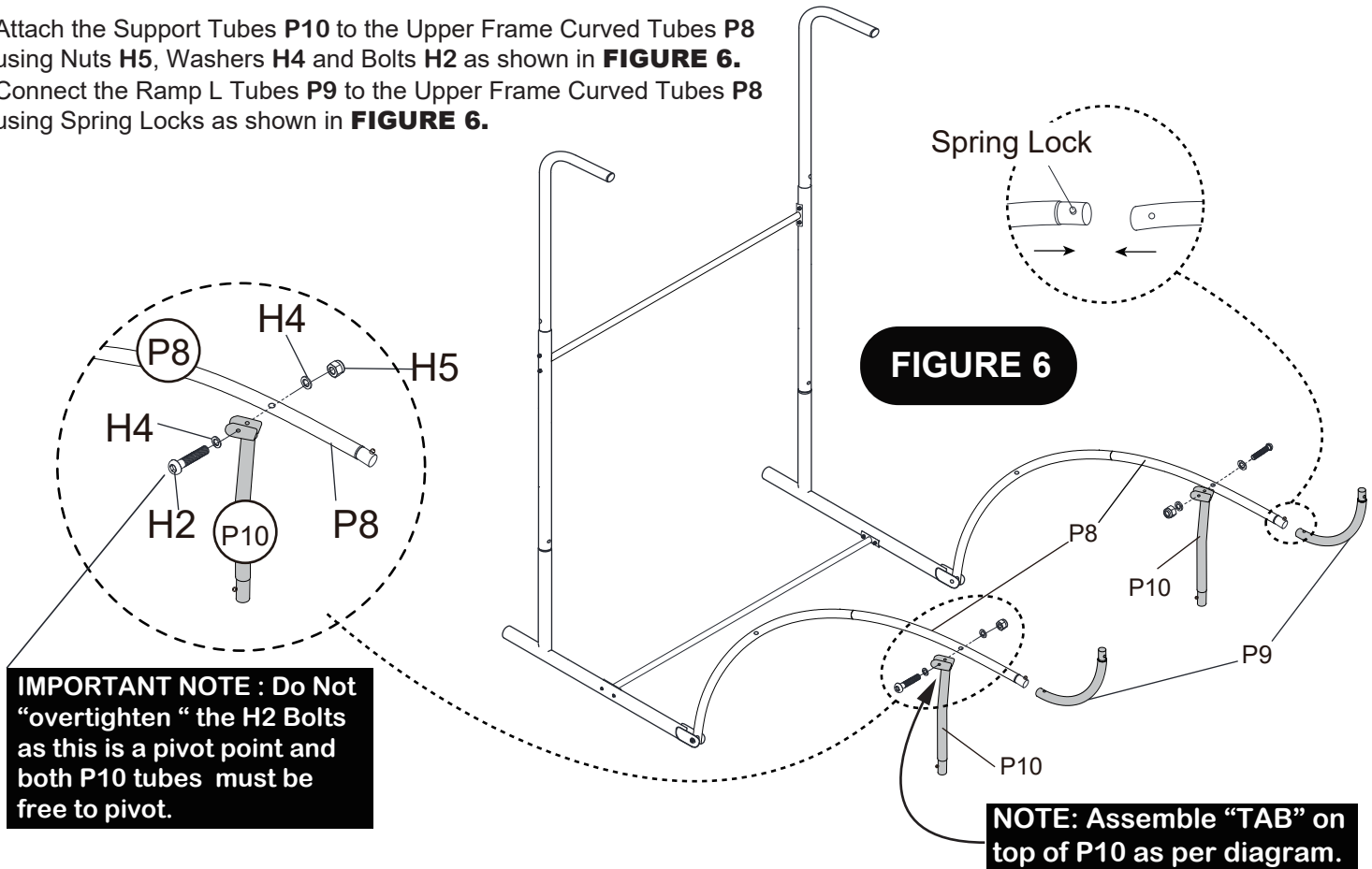

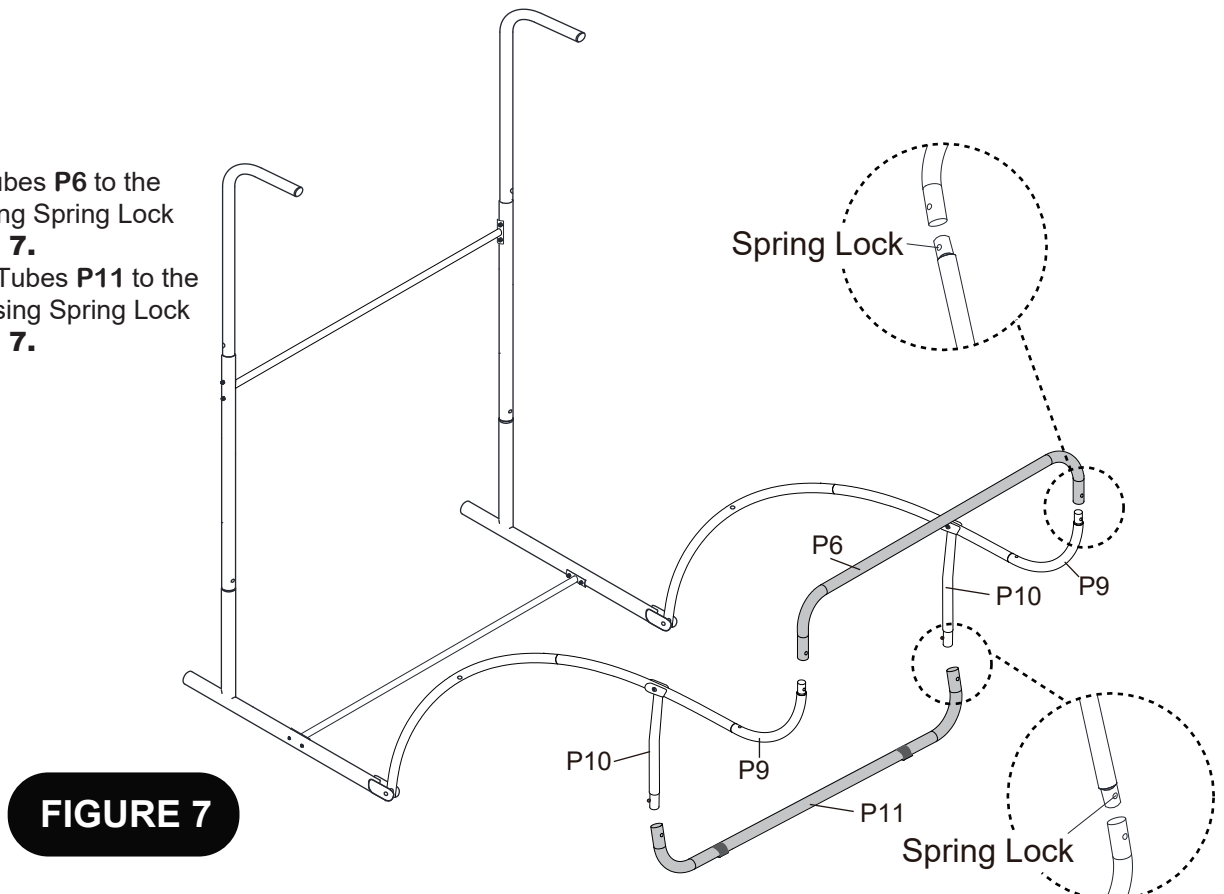
STEP 6

Attach the Support Tubes **P10** to the Upper Frame Curved Tubes **P8** using Nuts **H5**, Washers **H4** and Bolts **H2** as shown in **FIGURE 6**. Connect the Ramp L Tubes **P9** to the Upper Frame Curved Tubes **P8** using Spring Locks as shown in **FIGURE 6**.



STEP 7

Attach the Ramp U Tubes **P6** to the Ramp L Tubes **P9** using Spring Lock as shown in **FIGURE 7**. Attach the Support U Tubes **P11** to the Support Tubes **P10** using Spring Lock as shown in **FIGURE 7**.



PARTS REQUIRED:

2 pcs - **P5** Telescoping Tube

4 pcs - **H5** M6 Nut

4 pcs - **H2** M6 x 30mm Allen Head Bolt

8 pcs - **H4** M6 Flat Washer

4 pcs - **H6** M6 Plastic Washer

STEP 8

Loosen the Telescoping Tubes **P5** and adjust the tube to a suitable length for the next step as shown in **FIGURE 8**.

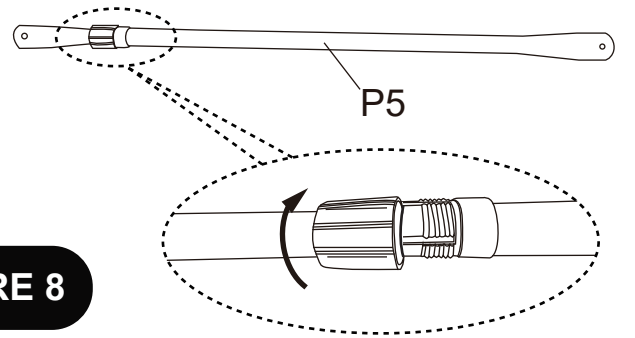

STEP 9

Attach the Telescoping Tubes **P5** to the Board L Tube Top **P1** using Nuts **H5**, Washers **H4**, Plastic Washer **H6** and Bolts **H2** as shown in **FIGURE 9**.

Attach the Telescoping Tubes **P5** to the Lower Frame Curved Tubes **P7** using Nuts **H5**, Washers **H4** and Bolts **H2** as shown in **FIGURE 9**.

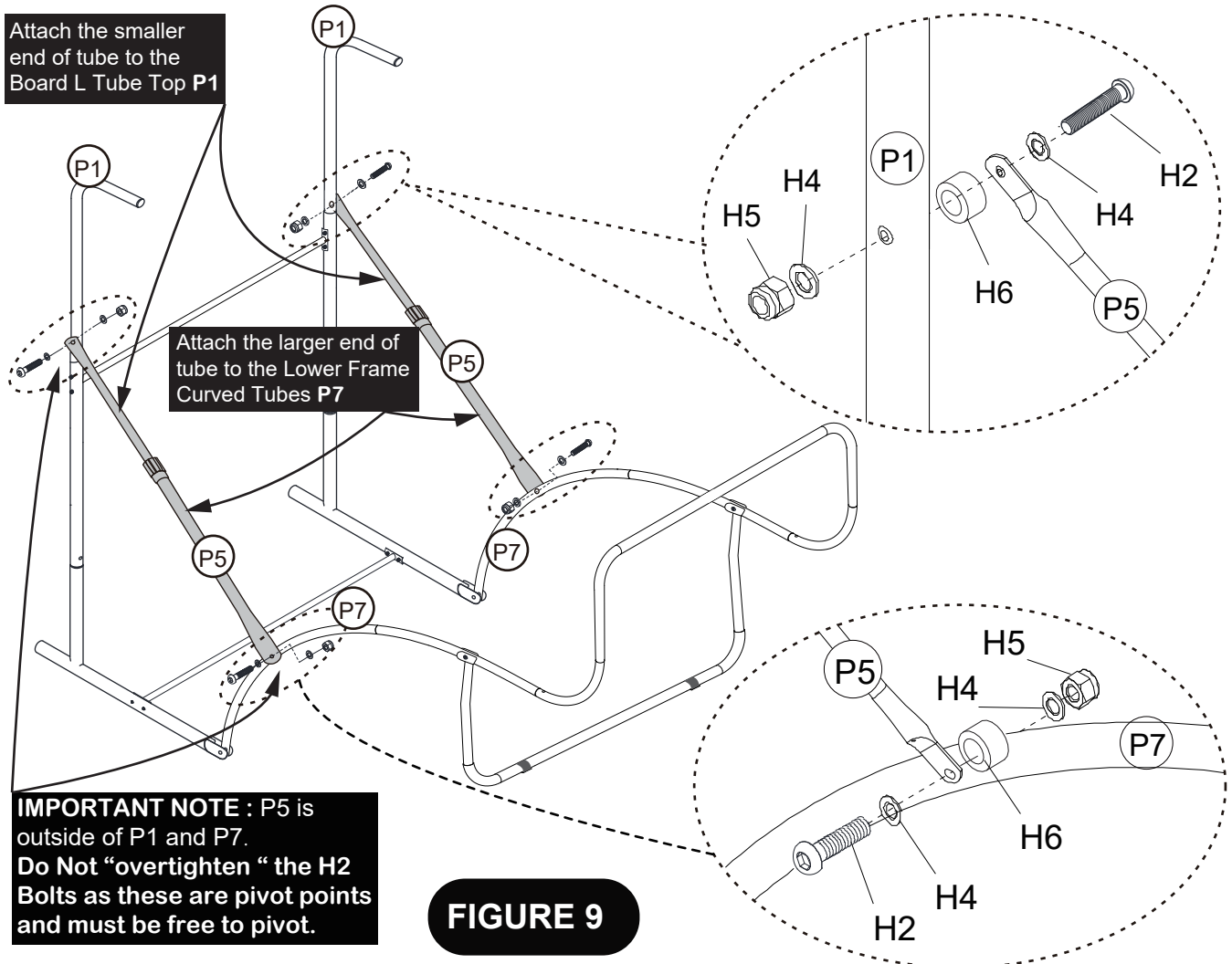

PARTS REQUIRED:

1 pc - **P13** Backboard
4 pcs - **H4** M6 Flat Washer

2 pcs - **H1** M6 x 34mm Allen Head Bolt
2 pcs - **H5** M6 Nut

STEP 10

With the help of another adult, attach the Backboard **P13** to the front side of the Board L Tube Top **P1** using Nuts **H5**, Washers **H4** and Bolts **H1** as shown in **FIGURE 10**.

Carefully fold down
Rims and Scoring Arms

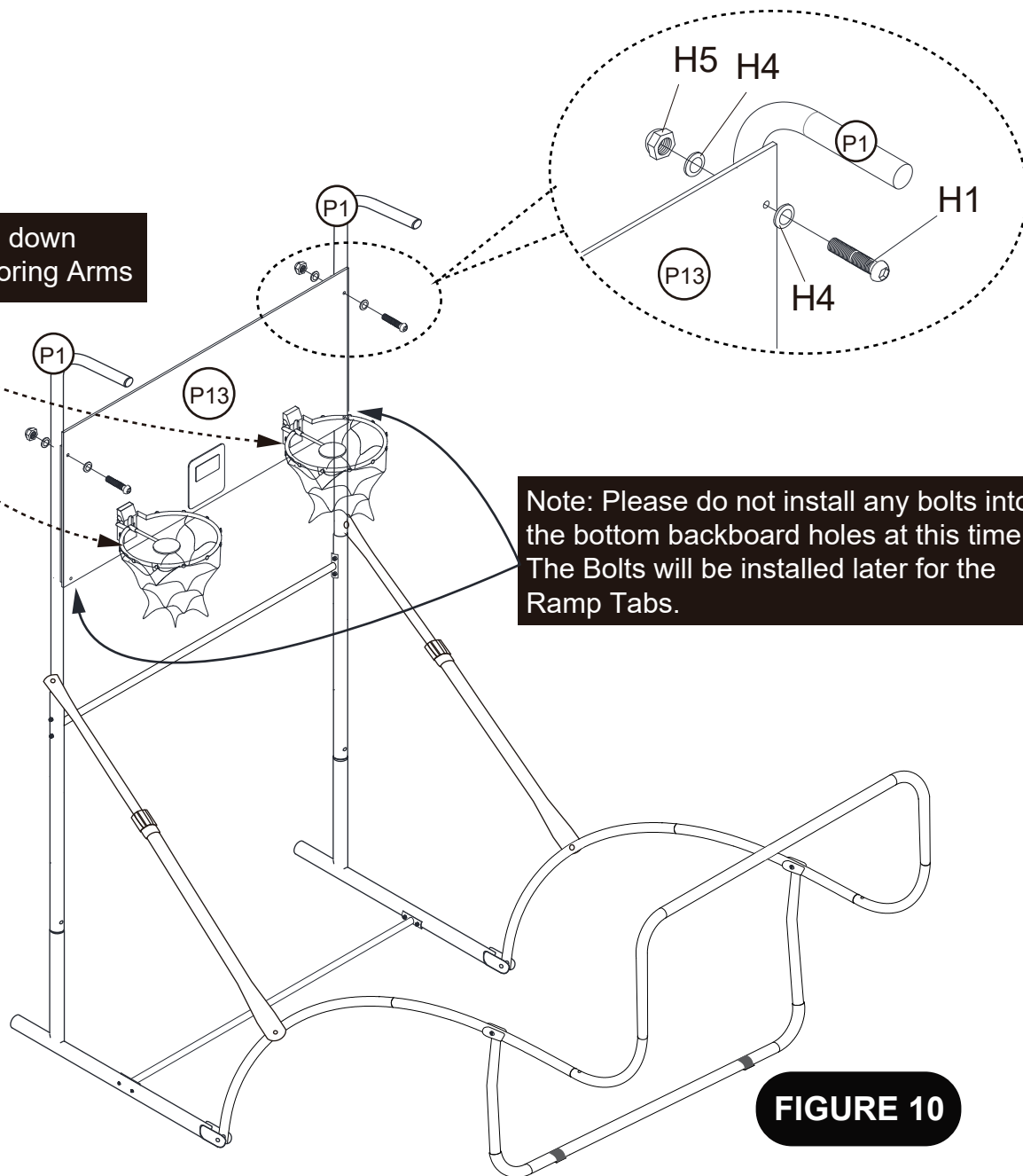

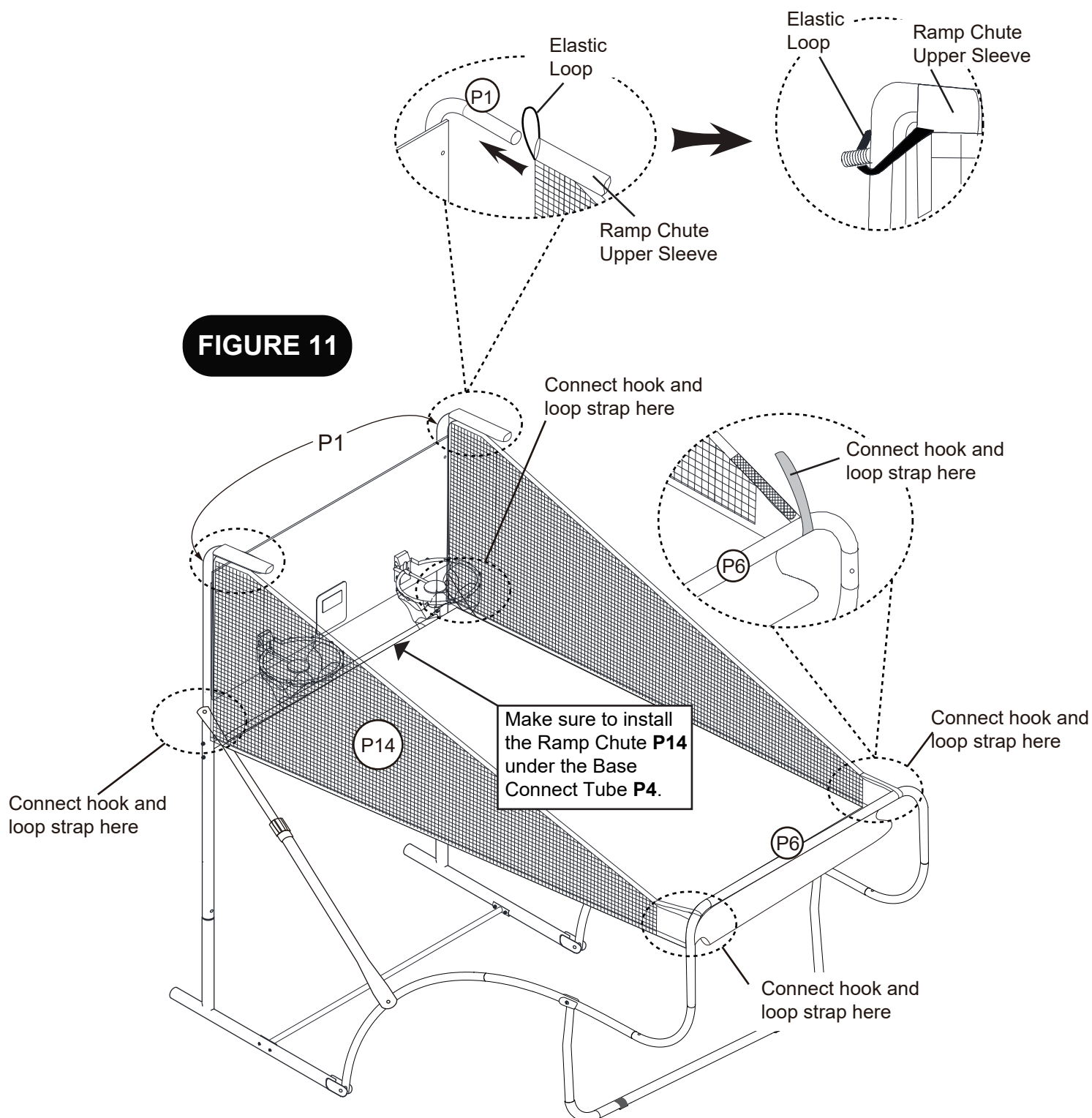
PARTS REQUIRED:

1 pc - **P14** Ramp Chute

STEP 11

Slide elastic straps and the sleeve of the Ramp Chute **P14** onto the Board L-Tube Top **P1** as shown in **FIGURE 11**.

At the front of Ramp Chute **P14**, bring the ramp down and secure using hook and loop straps as shown in **FIGURE 11**. Secure all hook and loop straps on the shootout as shown in **FIGURE 11**.



PARTS REQUIRED:

1 pc - **P12** Ramp Tube
2 pcs - **H5** M6 Nut

2 pcs - **H3** M6 x 28mm Allen Head Bolt
4 pcs - **H4** M6 Flat Washer

STEP 12

Slide the Ramp Tube **P12** into the front sleeve of the Ramp Chute **P14** as shown in **FIGURE 12**. Attach the Ramp Tube **P12** to the inside of the Ramp U Tube **P6** using Nuts **H5**, Washers **H4** and Bolts **H3** as shown in **FIGURE 12**.

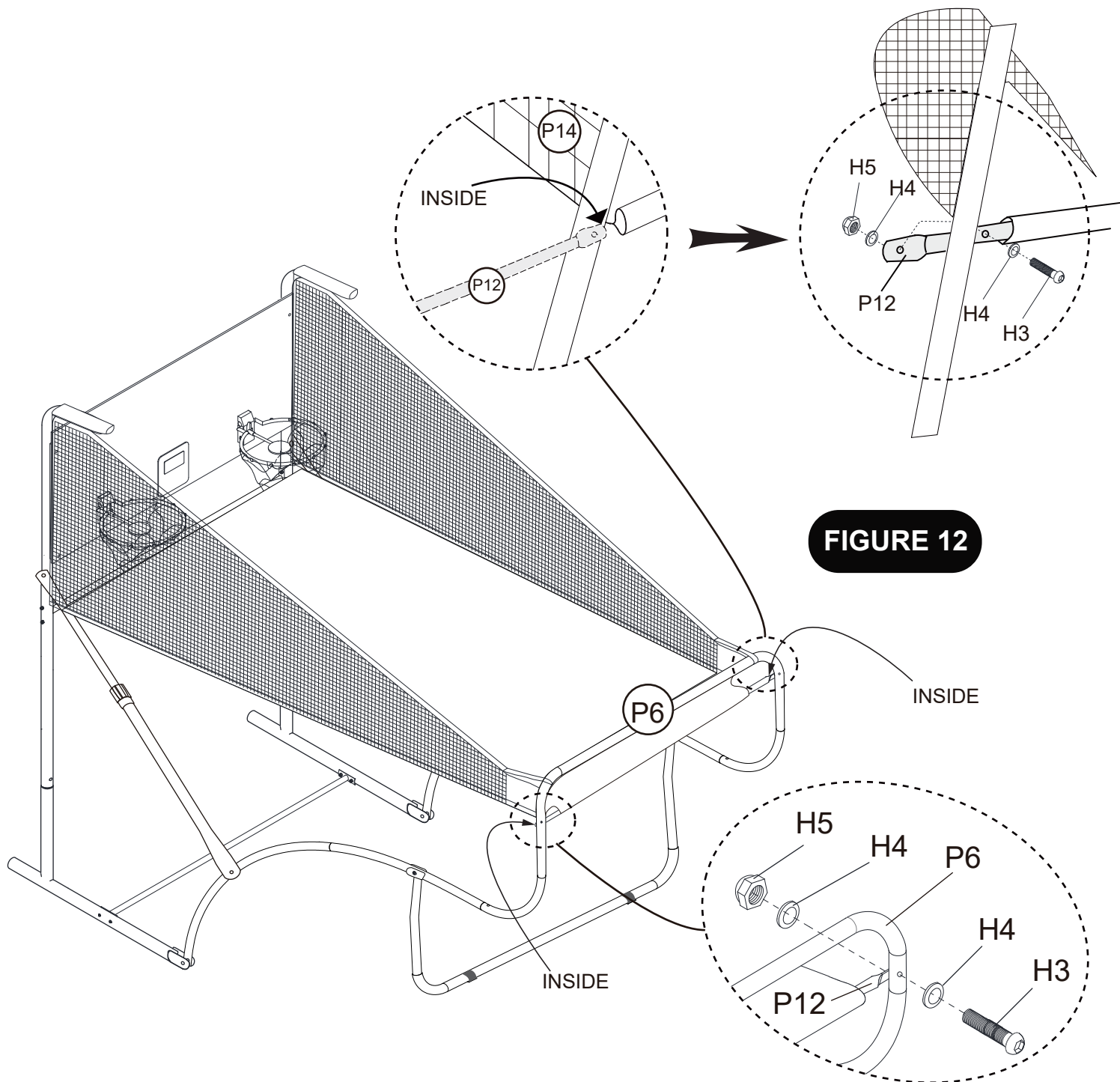

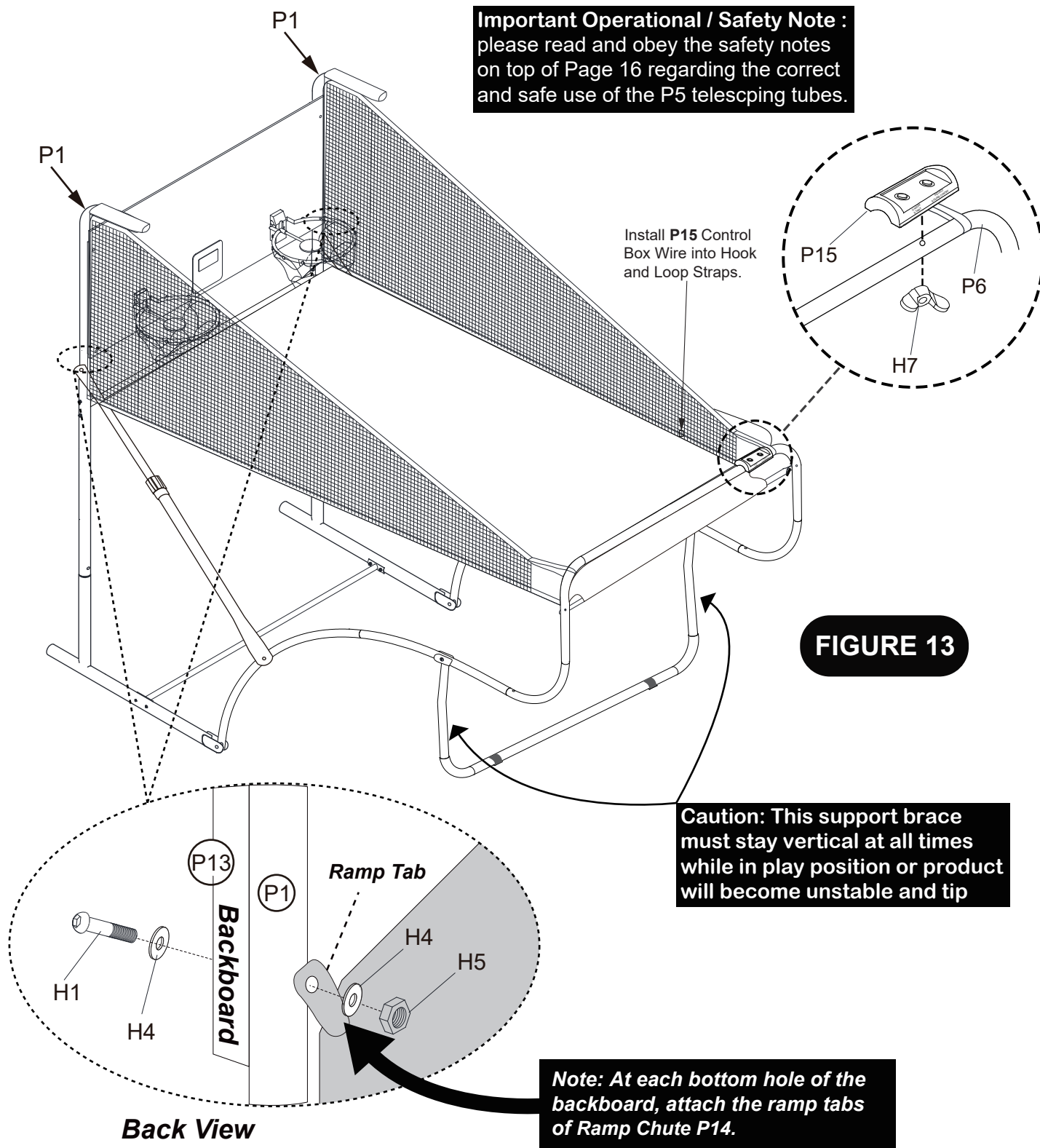

STEP 13

At the bottom hole of the Backboard **P13**, bring the ramp up behind Board L-Tube Top **P1**, attach the ramp tabs of Ramp Chute **P14** using Nuts **H5**, Washers **H4** and Bolts **H1** as shown in **FIGURE 13**.

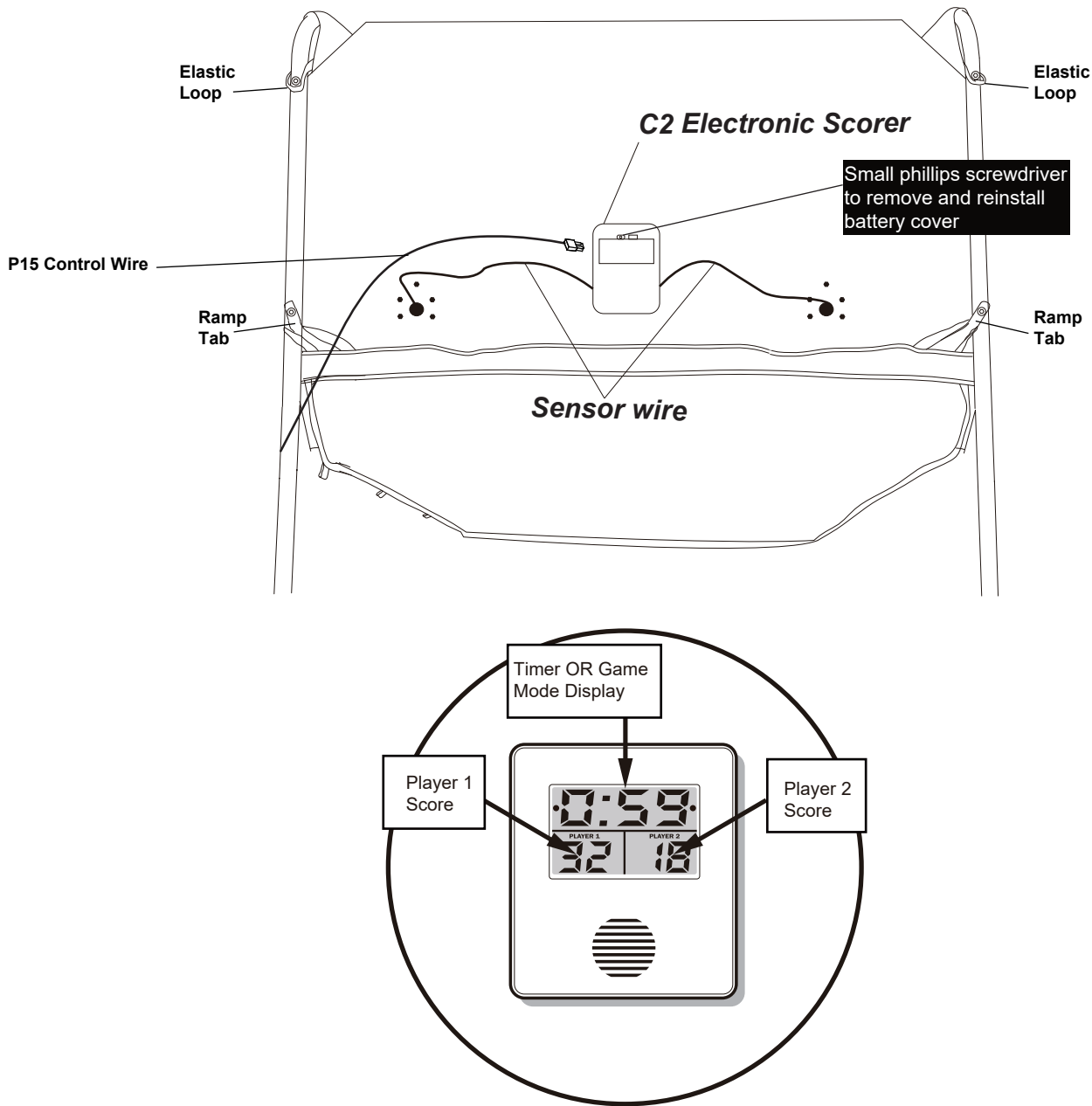
Attach the **P15** Control Box onto the **P6** Ramp U Tube using the **H7** Wing Nut as shown in the **FIGURE 13**.

STEP 14

Insert 3(three) pieces “AAA” batteries in correct polarities into the backside of Electronic Scorer as shown in **FIGURE 14**. See” **FIRST TIME BATTERY INSTALLATION AND NOTICE** “ , before installing batteries, located on **page 17**.



HOW TO PLAY

1. Press the ON/OFF button; the display will show G 1.
2. Press the SELECT/ SOUND ON/OFF button to change game modes, from G 1 to G 8.
3. To switch between game modes after the game is turned on, press the SELECT/SOUND ON OFF button.
4. Once the game mode is selected, for example G 1, press the ON/OFF/START button to begin play.
5. To turn the sound off, press and hold the SELECT/SOUND ON OFF button for approximately 3 seconds. To turn the sound back on, repeat.

GAME RULES

G1: Single Player, One Hoop

- . Player must score only on the AWAY hoop.
- . 2 points are counted for every shot made on the Home hoop only.
- . Unlimited time , Maximum score:100

G2: Single Player, Any Hoop

- . Player must score on HOME or AWAY hoop.
- . 2 points are counted for every shot made on either hoop.
- . Unlimited time , Maximum score:100

G3: Single Player, Alternating Hoop

- . Player must score on alternating hoops. For example: score on AWAY, score on HOME, score on AWAY, score on HOME, etc.
- . 2 points are counted for every shot made on the correct hoop.
- . Unlimited time , Maximum score:100

G4: Two Player, Count Up

- . Each player must score on their own hoop - HOME or AWAY.
- . 2 points are counted for every shot made.
- . Time is preset to one minute.
- . The winner is the player who scores the most points in one minute on their own hoop.

G5: Two Player, Count Down

- . Each player must score on their own hoop - HOME or AWAY.
- . Each player starts with 20 points and 2 points are deducted for every shot made in their own hoop.
- . There is no time limit.
- . The winner is the player who gets to zero, or scores 10 shots, first.

G6: Two Player, Match Play

- . There are 20 games in a match. Each game lasts for 5 seconds.
- . Each player must score on their own hoop - HOME or AWAY.
- . The player that scores first on their own hoop during each 5 second game receives 2 points.
- . Only one score is counted for each 5 second game.
- . The winner is the player with the most points at the end of the 20 game match.

G7: Two Player, Pro-Match Play

- . There are 12 games in a match. Each game lasts for 5 seconds.
- . Each player must score on their own hoop - HOME or AWAY.
- . In games 1-3 and 7-9, the player that scores first on their own hoop receives 2 points. Only one score is counted per game.
- . In games 4-6 and 10-12, the player that scores first on their own hoop receives 3 points. Only one score is counted per game.
- . The winner is the player with the most points at the end of the 12 game match.

G8 : Two Player, Any Hoop, 10 scores in 99 seconds.

- . Time limit is 99 seconds.
- . Maximum score is 10 points.
- . Each player scores 2 points on either the Home or AWAY hoops.
- . Player 1 plays until either 10 points have been scored or 99 seconds have elapsed, then Player 2 starts their game.
- . The player to have scored 10 points in the quickest time is the winner

Important Safety Notes: Please Read

1. To fold the basketball game into the storage position, loosen the Telescoping Tubes P5.
2. Carefully lift the Front Horizontal Ramp U Tube P6 and fold the Support Tube P10 and Support U Tube P11 until the game is in the storage position as shown in **FIGURE 15**.
3. Tighten the Telescoping Tubes P5 in order to safely hold the basketball system in the upright position.
4. Loosen telescoping tubes to fold down into playing position when you want to play the game .
5. Retighten the telescoping tubes while the basketball game is in the playing position in order to maintain correct rigidity of the frame structure during play.

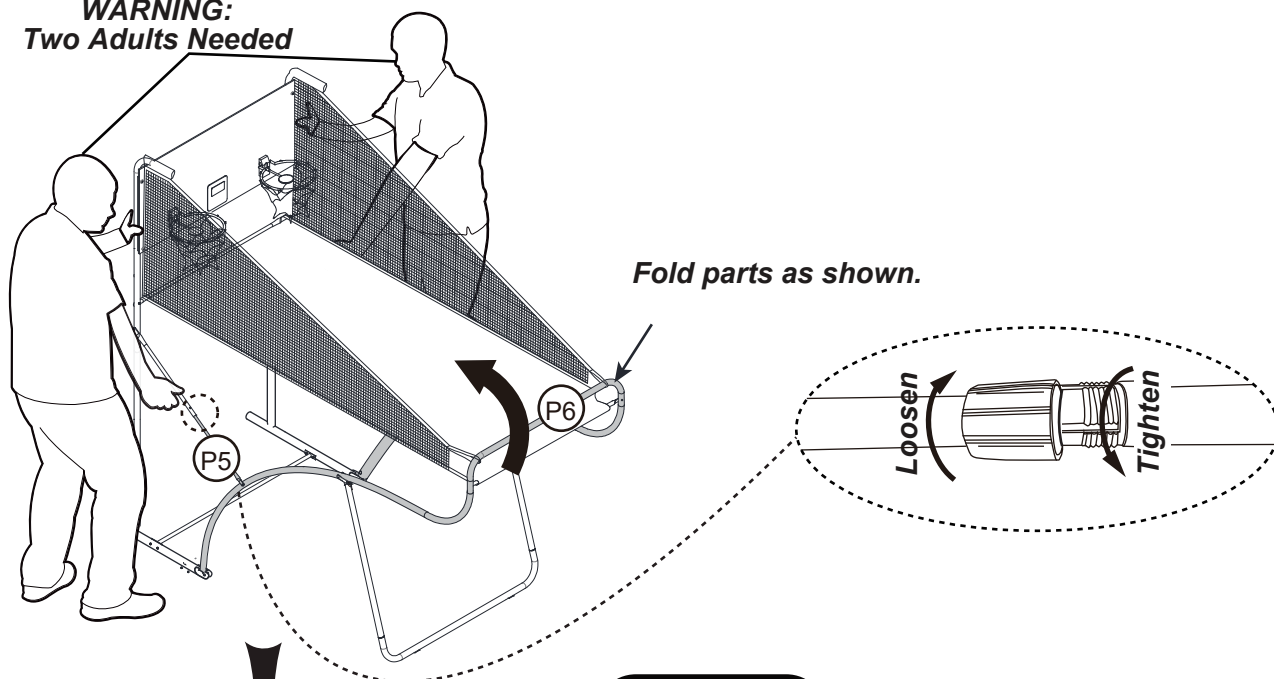
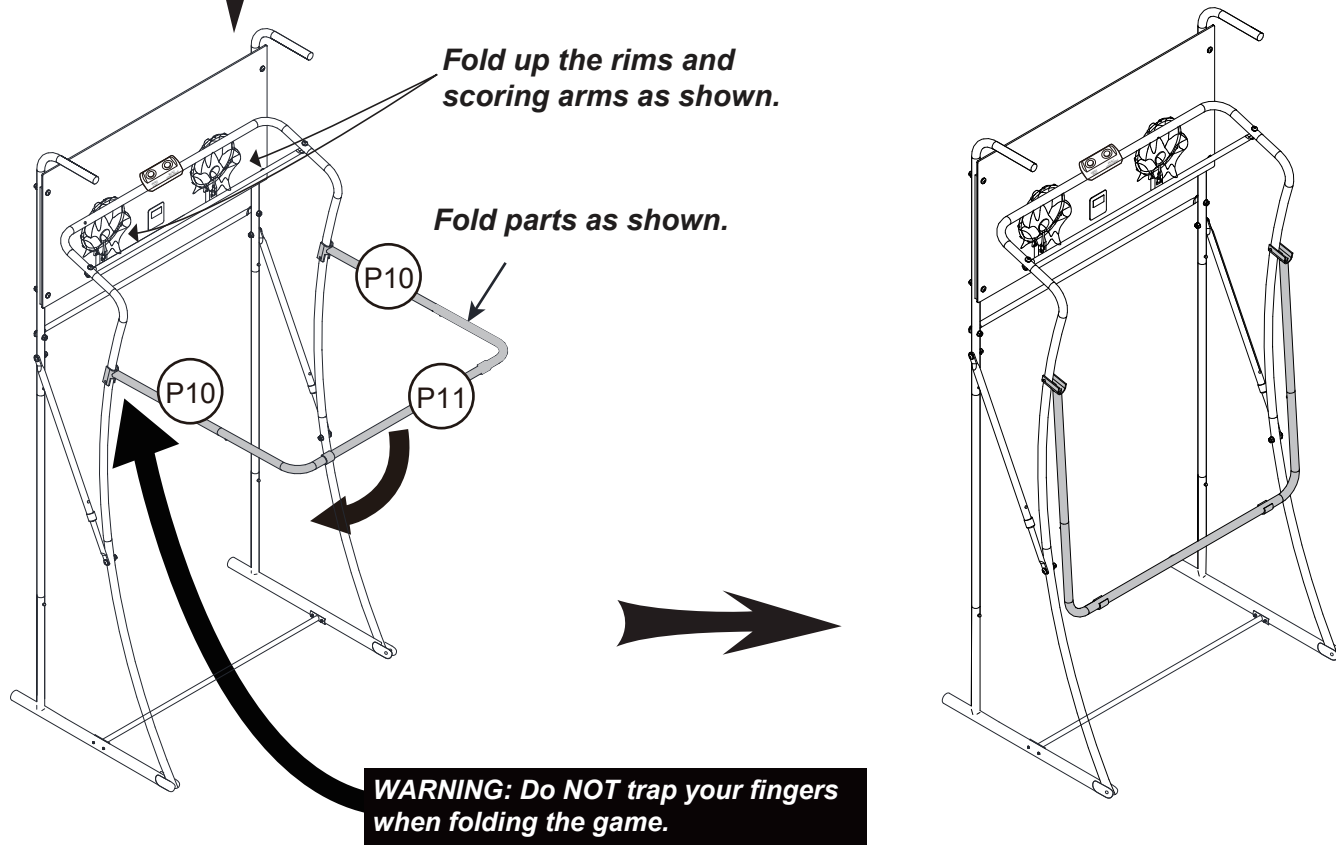

First Time Battery Installation:

Locate battery compartment for this product .

Use alkaline batteries for maximum performance .

Using a small Phillips head screwdriver – loosen and remove the battery compartment cover screw(s).

Remove battery compartment cover .

Install new batteries only after reading the “ Battery Information NOTICE” !

Replace compartment cover and secure cover with the cover screw . Do not over tighten and strip out the screw .

IMPORTANT: BATTERY INFORMATION

Please retain this information for future reference. Batteries must be installed / replaced by an adult .

Notice:
