RIBOLI FAMILY HISTORY

1880s

With vineyards sprawling across Southern California, Los Angeles is a premium appellation for grape-growing and winemaking in all of California.



1910 ▼

Santo Cambianica leaves his home of Berzo San Fermo, located in the northern Italian province of Lombardia, for Los Angeles where he quickly builds relationships in the winemaking and Italian-American communities.



1919 - 1933 ▼

Prohibition jolts the wine industry, forcing many wineries to close. San Antonio Winery, however, perseveres. Due to Santo's strong relationship with the church, the Archdiocese of Los Angeles grants him permission to produce wines for sacramental and ceremonial purposes.



◀ 1946

Stefano Riboli, nephew and apprentice to Santo, and Maddalena Satragni marry. The two had met earlier when Stefano noticed her driving a tractor in the field, an immediate indication to him that her tenacity was unlike any other.



1917

Living the American Dream, Santo opens San Antonio Winery on Lamar Street, dedicating it to his Patron Saint Anthony.

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1947 ▼

San Antonio Winery is transformed to include a tasting room, the first of its kind in Los Angeles. This opens the door for new visitors and more business. Now, patrons may sample wines as they shop.



1956

Santo Cambianica passes, leaving San Antonio Winery, which by now is an established institution in California's wine industry, in the capable hands of Stefano and Maddalena for the next generation. The two already had a powerful vision for the future.



1962

13-year-old Santo Riboli, firstborn child of Stefano and Maddalena, joins the family business.

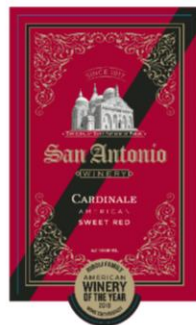
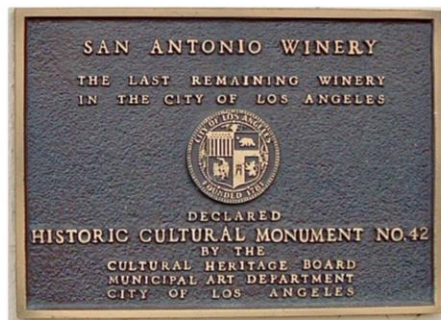


1965

At 15 years old, Cathy Riboli, Maddalena and Stefano's daughter, joins the family business.

1966 ▼

Urbanization and railroad development threatens to displace San Antonio Winery, but the winery is saved once again by the Cultural Heritage Board Municipal Art Department of the City of Los Angeles. As a result, the winery is declared a Historic Cultural Monument.

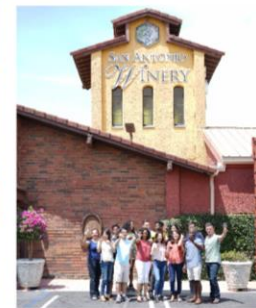


1967

To the delight of longtime customers wanting a high alcohol sweet wine, Stefano and Maddalena introduce San Antonio Cardinale, the first wine of the San Antonio Specialty collection.

1969 ▶

The Ribolis open their tasting room in Ontario, CA which quickly becomes the Inland Empire's premier wine destination.



1974 ▲

Maddalena opens her restaurant, Maddalena Restaurant, inside San Antonio Winery Los Angeles, serving up many Italian classics, including her own special recipes.



1977

Stefano and Maddalena's youngest, Steve Riboli, joins the family business at 16 years old.



1983 ▲

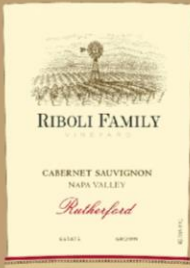
Never one to slow down, Maddalena proudly launches her namesake wine brand. Maddalena Wines serves as inspiration and celebration for others who strive to exceed expectations.

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1986

Maddalena & Stefano purchase their first estate vineyard in the heart of Napa Valley in the world-renowned Rutherford AVA. Grapes grown here, particularly Cabernet grapes, have an incredible balance of flavor and acidity that are difficult to achieve in other parts of the world. With the purchase of this vineyard, the Riboli Family Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon is born.

The Ribolis purchase Rancho Soledad Vineyard in the Monterey AVA. This area grows excellent Chardonnay grapes that exhibit the region's signature tropical flavors.



1998

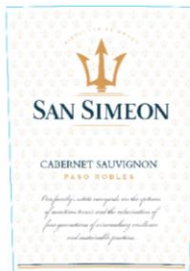
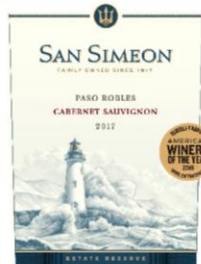
The Ribolis expand their Monterey estate vineyard footprint with the purchases of 2 new vineyard properties: Sarmento Vineyard in the Santa Lucia Highlands AVA and the El Camino Real Vineyard in Arroyo Seco AVA. The Sarmento Vineyard grows some of California's finest Pinot Noir and Chardonnay grapes, while the El Camino Real Vineyard is ideal for Chardonnay, due to the daily winds and fog in the area.

4th generation family member Anthony Riboli joins the company as Head Winemaker for their California Estate brands.



1992

Named after the coastal California town, San Simeon is born. This wine pays homage to the vital role the fog and cool air from the sea plays in the vineyards.



1995

The Loma Vista Estate Vineyard in Monterey's Arroyo Seco AVA is purchased. This mighty wine growing region gets confluences of so many geographic factors that it is a prime location for Chardonnay grapes.



2003

The Ribolis launch Stella Rosa Wines, a high quality semi-sweet, semi-sparkling wine from Piedmont, Italy. This region of Italy has particular significance to the Ribolis – it's where Maddalena was born.

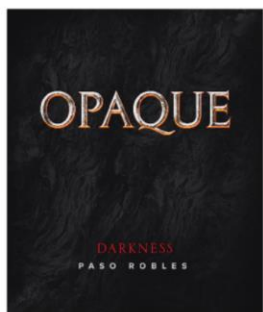


2010

The Ribolis open their San Antonio Winery tasting room in Paso Robles, CA, a region that is rapidly becoming one of California's top wine destinations.

Opaque Wines is born, bold and rich wines created to highlight the character of the unique terroir from each of the family's estate vineyards in Paso Robles.

2014 ▶

4th generation family member Chris Riboli joins the company's National Sales team.



2017 ▼

Highlands 41 Wines is born, named after historic Highway 41 and the rugged Creston Highlands in Paso Robles, CA.

The Ribolis purchase their largest Paso Robles estate vineyard to-date, Creston Highlands, located in the Creston AVA. Most vines in this AVA are planted at elevations of 1,000-1,300 feet and on west or southwest facing slopes, ideal conditions for high quality Cabernet grapes.

The Ribolis celebrate 100 years of San Antonio Winery and award-winning winemaking. Business partners and the community are invited to join the Harvest Festival at the San Antonio Winery.

2013

The Ribolis purchase their Stefano vineyard in Paso Robles, CA, honoring their hardworking father and grandfather. Located in the El Pomar AVA, this vineyard benefits from the Templeton Gap while remaining warm enough to create a climate ideal for multiple grape varietals.



2015

The Ribolis purchase a second El Pomar AVA vineyard in Paso Robles and name it Maddalena Vineyard, dedicating it to their trailblazing mother and grandmother. Another beautiful symbolic gesture, the Maddalena Vineyard sits opposite of the Stefano Vineyard.

2016 ▼

The Pretty Penny Vineyard in the El Pomar AVA and the Riboli Creston Vineyard in Creston AVA in Paso Robles, CA are purchased. The Creston AVA sits in the eastern region of Paso Robles where it is warmer and has a significant diurnal temperature shift that allows full development of flavors.



2013 ▶

4th generation family member Dante Riboli Colombatti joins the company to help build the Marketing Department.



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2018

San Antonio Winery is recognized as the American Winery of the Year by Wine Enthusiast, one of the most prestigious awards to be given in the global wine industry.



2019 ▶

4th generation family member Jennifer Riboli Converse joins the company in the Hospitality sector.



2019 ▼

The Riboli Family Winemaking and Event Center opens in Paso Robles, CA. This state-of-the-art facility is powered entirely with solar panels and engineered with smart technology to save manpower and electricity. It also recycles 100% of all water used making it certified 100% sustainable by CSWA. With the opening of this facility, the Ribolis move their estate wine production here.

The Ribolis purchase Jada Vineyard & Winery in Paso Robles, CA, acquiring their vineyards, tasting room, and award-winning wine brands – 1149, VIII VIII, XCV, JackJohn, Estate Red Blend, Hell's Kitchen, Jersey Girl, Sawbones, Tannat, Passing By, WCS, and Jack of Hearts.

Stella Rosa becomes America's #1 imported wine brand.

The 1917 Outdoor Bar & Bistro opens at San Antonio Winery, Los Angeles. Customers can enjoy tasting flights and a delicious menu in Los Angeles' beautiful weather.

The Ribolis forage into the spirits industry, with the launch of Stella Rosa Premium Imported Brandy. This Italian product draws immediate excitement and demand.

San Antonio Fruit Farm is born, an Italian semi-sweet, dual-fruit flavored wine from two female winemakers who have worked with the Ribolis for many years.

Riboli Estate – Willow Creek Vineyard is purchased in Paso Robles, CA. This district of Paso Robles can be compared to Napa Valley's iconic Stag's Leap AVA; both are benchmarks of excellence.

With the purchase of additional acreage, Stefano Vineyard expands, nearly doubling in size, beauty, and bounty.

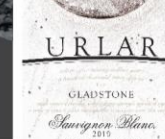
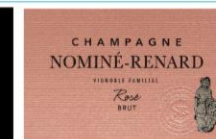
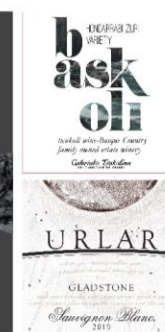
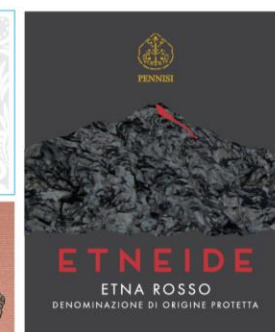
The Ribolis celebrate Maddalena's 100th birthday.
