

Folding technique

It's very important to fold your paper lining up the edges straight and with crisp folds. Work carefully, folding. Unfolding and refolding could tear the paper.

When you see a dotted line, this means "fold here".

When you see an arrow, this means fold from where the arrow starts to where the arrow ends.

Classic Aircraft

You will find instruction to make 3 styles of airplanes. The Standard is the easiest, The Traditional mid level and The Lion most challenging.

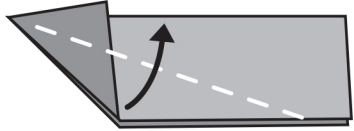
Standard



2. Fold the corner to the center fold.



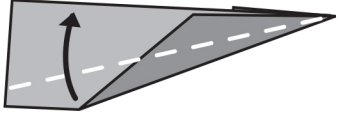
1. With the design facing up, fold the paper in half length ways.



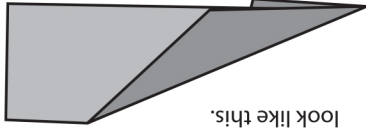
4. Fold the side corner to the center fold.



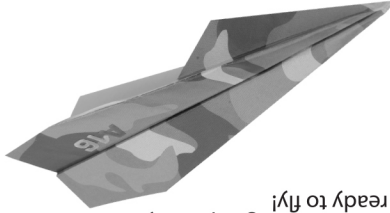
3. Flip over. Fold the other corner to the center.



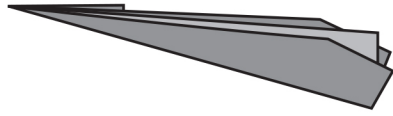
6. Fold the long edge down to the center fold.



5. Flip over. Repeat the same fold on the other side. It should look like this.



8. Push the wings up and you're ready to fly!

Fold and fly your own airplanes. Use 20 papers to create three styles of planes. Stick the decals on and give them a toss. Watch as they glide through the air.



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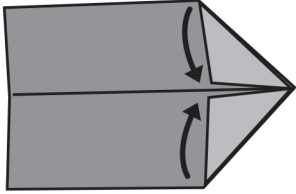

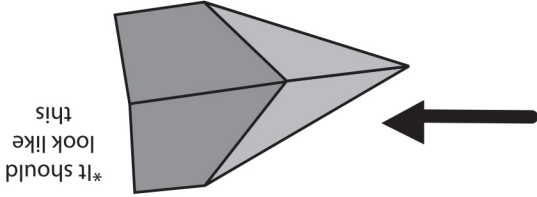
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Traditional

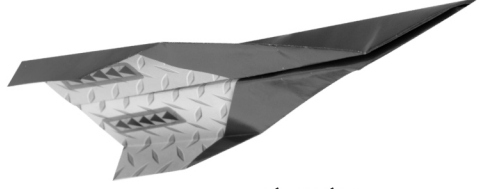
1. With the solid side facing up, fold the paper in half length ways, and open up.
2. Fold corner into the center line on both sides.



3. Fold side corner into center line on both sides.



5. Fold both sides down leaving 1/2" at the bottom to create the wings.

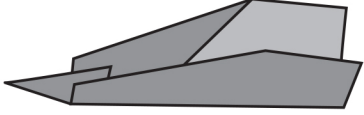
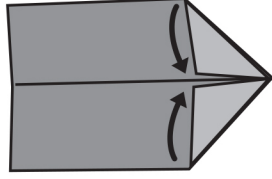


6. Fold tips of the wings up for flying style.

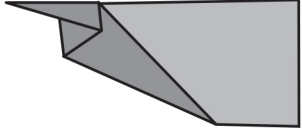
7. Lift wings up and you're ready to fly!

The Lion

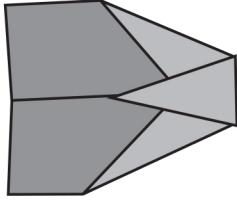
1. With the solid side facing up, fold the paper in half length ways, and open up.
2. Fold the corners into the center fold.



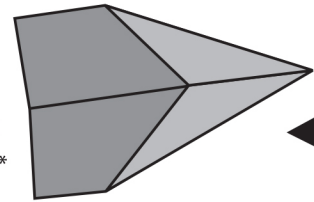
8. Flip the plane and repeat step 7 on other wing.



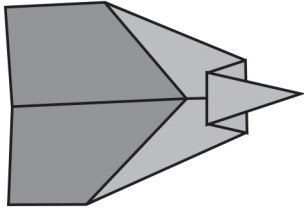
6. Flip the plane over and fold the plane in half. The folds will show.



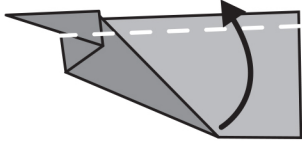
4. Fold the tip down.



3. Fold the side corners into the center fold.



5. Fold the tip up so it is over the edge.



7. Fold the wing down about 1" from the bottom of the plane.
