4. First-aid Measures

4.3 MOST IMPORTANT SYMPTOMS: Tissue damage in the eye, including redness, irritation & swelling, corneal opacity or lesions, discoloration, perforation or serious physical decay of vision, which is not fully reversible within 21 days.

5.4 SPECIAL FIRE FIGHTING PROCEDURES: Standard procedure for chemical fires. Immediate medical attention is required.
