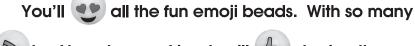


Let's bout the best emoji bracelet kit ever!

Getting Started

Stringing beads is great way to develop fine motor skills. If you are having trouble, ask an adult or older friend to craft with you. Remember, keep beads away from small children and pets.



Helpful Hint



Work on a towel. This will help keep your beads from rolling off the table. You will need a pair of scissors to cut the cord.

Beading

You have enough beads to make 5 bracelets. Since wrists come in all shapes and sizes, measure the bracelet against your wrist as you work for a perfect fit.

- Decide on a color scheme or theme for your bracelets.
- Divide up your beads into 5 piles. Lay out your bead pattern onto your towel.
- String your cord through the beads. When you finish, pass the cord through your beads a second time. This will make your bracelet extra strong.
- Tie the ends of the cord together in several tight knots.

Pro- Tip! If you like, add a dot of your own craft glue over the knot to make it extra secure.

Now you are ready to wear them, share them, or trade them with your friends!

Use any leftover cord and beads to decorate your sneaker laces or your backpack!
