Build, Paint and fly 4 Fun Foam Airplanes

Assemble the plane

To attach the wing, slide it through the large slot on the side of the plane, gently position it in the center notch.

To attach the tail, slide it through the small slot on the side of the plane, gently position it in the center notch.



Important information about this paint

- The paint included is a specially formulated non-toxic, acrylic paint that dries permanently on most surfaces, so be careful.
- Cover your work surface with newspaper. Have a cup of water and paper towels handy.
- Wear a smock or old clothes. This paint may stain. Clean up any spills immediately with soap and water.
- Paint can settle and separate over time. Mix each color thoroughly before you begin painting. If the paint seems too thick, stir in a drop or two of water.
- Before changing colors, rinse and dry your brush thoroughly.

Design ideas

You may want to plan your design before you begin, that way you will have plenty of paint to finish all 4 airplanes. You can sketch your ideas on paper, or lightly draw on the planes with a pencil.

When painting your designs, it's best to paint equally on both sides of the plane, wings and tail. This will help keep your plane balanced so that it flies properly. Adding too much paint to the plane may effect its ability to fly.

When the paint is completely dry, slide the clear plastic nose clips on to the front of the planes.
