

Dos and don'ts

DO:

Allow at least 150 cm either side of the airer to prevent any fire hazards. Pay particular attention to children and vulnerable people where present, as some parts of this heated airer can become very hot and cause burns. Only dry clothes and other articles that can endure at least 75 $^{\circ}$ C or above. Only attempt to dry clothes that have undergone a normal spin cycle after washing or are thoroughly wrung out after handwashing. This is to avoid excess water dripping underneath and damaging the unit.

DON'T:

Exceed the maximum load of 10 kg.

Overload the heated airer beyond the recommended maximum weight. Touch or cover the motor with clothes at any point.

Care and maintenance

Before attempting any cleaning or maintenance, unplug the heated airer from the mains power supply and allow it to cool fully.

Clean the heated airer with a soft, damp, lint-free cloth and dry thoroughly. Do not immerse the heated airer in water or any other liquid.

Do not use harsh or abrasive detergents or scourers.

To clean the dust gauze, first remove the screw from the base of the heater unit using a screwdriver.

Pull out the dust gauze and wipe clean with a cloth.

Insert the dust gauze back into the slot and secure by replacing the screw and tightening with a screwdriver.

Instructions for use

Assembling the heated airer

STEP 1: Insert the three dryer legs (11) firmly into the holes in the base of the heater (8). Place the unit upright on a level, dry, heat resistant surface.

STEP 2: In a clockwise motion, screw the lower support pole (4) into the air flow outlet (7) on top of the heater (8).

STEP 3: In a clockwise motion, screw the upper support pole (2) into the connector on top of the lower support pole (4).

STEP 4: Firmly secure the folding clothes rack (1) onto the upper support pole (2).

STEP 5: Hang the heat insulated tube cover (5) on the folding clothes rack (1). The heated airer can now be plugged into the mains power supply and is ready for use.



CAUTION: Take care when assembling the heated airer, as it is possible for loose clothing or fingers to become trapped and cause injury to the user.

Using the heated airer

Once the heated airer has been assembled following the instructions in the section entitled 'Assembling the heated airer', it is ready to use. **STEP 1:** Hang up the damp garments as required. Only machine-spun washing should be added. Take care not to exceed the maximum weight and load evenly across the folding clothes rack to avoid the heated airer tipping over.

STEP 2: Unzip the heat insulated tube cover and place it over the clothes. Zip up the cover, ensuring that it is pulled down enough to cover the heater. **STEP 3:** Once the heated airer is loaded, plug it in and turn it on using '**ON/OFF**'; this will illuminate indicating that the heated airer is turned on. **STEP 4:** To set the timer (30–180 minutes), turn the dial clockwise to the desired time. To use without the timer, turn the dial to '**ON**'.

STEP 5: Once the garments are dry, switch off the heated airer by switching '**ON/OFF**' to the off position, the light on the switch will turn off. If the timer has been set, the heated airer will automatically switch off once the time has elapsed.

STEP 6: Remove the garments with care, as the heated airer may still be hot. Take care to unload the garments evenly to prevent the airer tipping over.



NOTE: Only for use with garments that have been spun in a washing machine prior to hanging to avoid damaging the unit. This will ensure the most efficient drying.



CAUTION: Do not load the heated airer beyond 10 kg.



WARNING: Max operating time is 3 hours – please let the heated airer cool down fully before using again.
