IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Read all instructions-All the safety and operating instructions should be read carefully before the hockey game is played.
- 2. Caution-This is not a toy and is intended for use by or under the supervision of adults. Adults should review safety guidelines with children to avoid possible risk of electric shock or other injuries.
- 3. **Power sources-**This hockey game should be operated only from 110-120V A.C., 60 cycle current as indicated on the identification label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company.
- **4. Power cord protection-**Power cord should be routed so that it is not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against it. Pay particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point of exit from the game.
- 5. Overloading-Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
- **6. Object and liquid entry-**Never push objects of any kind into this game through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short-out parts which could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the game.
- 7. Ventilation-Openings in the game are provided for the exhaust air to create a cushion effect. The openings on the air blower are for the intake air. Keep clear of the air blower when it is on. Do not put hand or other objects near the intake openings. To ensure reliable operation of the game and protect it from overheating these openings must not be blocked or covered.
- 8. Damage requiring service-Unplug the game from the wall outlet.
 - Do not attempt to service the blower yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions.
 - A. When the power supply cord or plug is damaged.
 - B. If liquid has spilled, or objects have fallen into the blower.
 - C. When the air blower exhibits a distinct change in performance e.g. abnormal noise, this indicates a need for service.
- 9. CAUTION-ELECTRICALLY OPERATED PRODUCT-Not recommended for children under 8 years of age. As with all electrical products, precautions should be observed during handling and use to reduce the risk of electric shock.

Assembly Tips:

Attention: If you are using an electric screwdriver in the assembly, please set at low torque and do not over tighten the hardware. When assembling individual parts, loosely tighten screws until all screws are inserted, then tighten completely

Assembly Instructions

- 1. Find a clean, level place to begin the assembly of your Air Hockey table. The table will be assembled upside down and then turned over on its legs once the assembly completed. This game table is heavy, and turning it over will require at least two strong adults.
- 2. Remove all the parts from the box and verify that you have all of the listed parts as shown on the parts identifier below. Carefully cut or tear the four corners of the box so that the bottom of the box can be used as your work surface.

FIG.1 LEG, LEG PANEL AND LEG LEVELER ASSEMBLY

- 3. Attach the Left Leg (#2) and Right Leg (#3) to the Main Cabinet (#1) using three Bolts (#11) and three Washers (#12) per Leg. **See FIG.1**.
- 4. Attach the Leg Panel (#4) to the Leg using six Screws (#10) per Leg Panel. See FIG.1.
- 5. Screw the Leg Leveler (#8) into the Leg. See FIG.1.





FIG.2 INSTALL BATTERY

6. Lift the table assembly from the floor with at least two strong adults, turn it over, and set the table assembly on its legs in the location where you play.

CAUTION: Two strong adults are recommended to turn the table over as shown.

- 1. Lift the table off the ground.
- 2. Turn the table over.
- 3. Place it on all four feet at the same time on the ground.






FIG.3 PUSHER ASSEMBLY

10. Tear off the backside paper of the Felt Pad (#7) and stick them at the bottom of the Pushers (#5).





FIG.4 INSTALL BATTERY


11. Under the table, Unscrew Bolt using a screwdriver and open the battery box, Insert 4 AA batteries (not included) in the order of polarity as shown on the inside of battery box, Then close using a screwdriver, Turn on the power by turn the on/off switch of battery box. (If the game will not be used for a long period of the time, we recommend that the batteries be removed.)







- Insert 4 AA Batteries (Batteries not included).




- Return cover and insert Screw.



WARNING:

SCOREBOARD OPERATION




POWER ON/OFF - Slide the POWER ON/OFF Switch to turn the scoreboard ON or OFF

SOUND ON/OFF - Press the SOUND button at any time to turn the sound ON or OFF.

MINUTES - Press the MINUTES button to scroll through the playing time options

START/RESET - Press the START button to select the current time and begin playing the game. After the game is over, press the RESET button to RESET the scoreboard. Press and hold the RESET button for 3 seconds to RESET the scorer at any time
