STEP 2: To set the timer (up to 180 minutes), turn the dial clockwise to the desired time. To use without the timer, turn the dial to '**ON**'.

STEP 3: Once the drying unit is turned on, zip down the cover, ensuring it is pulled down enough to cover the drying unit and airer.

STEP 4: Once the garments are dry, unzip the cover and switch off the drying unit by turning the dial to the off position. If the timer has been set, the drying unit will automatically switch off once the time has elapsed.

STEP 5: Unplug the drying unit and allow it to cool before removing any garments. Unzip the cover and remove from the airer to allow it to cool.

STEP 6: Once cooled, remove the garments with care, as the airer may still be hot. Take care to unload the garments evenly to prevent the airer from tipping over.

STEP 7: When finished with the unit, remove it from below the airer and store separately in a cool, dry place.



NOTE: Only use with garments that have been spun in a washing machine prior to hanging to avoid damaging the unit. This will ensure the most efficient drying and prevent excess dripping.



CAUTION: Do not load the chosen airer beyond its recommended maximum weight.

WARNING: Max operating time is 3 hours – please let the drying unit cool down fully before using again.



Position the drying unit centrally under the airer, leaving space between the unit and airer cover.

Allow sufficient time between uses for the airer cover to air out and dry.

DON'T:

Load the chosen airer beyond its recommended maximum weight. Touch or cover the heat outlet with clothes at any point.

Cover the holes on top of the airer cover during use.

Leave the drying unit unattended during use.

Leave the drying unit plugged in or operating overnight.

Hang clothes on the bottom bars of the airer closest to the heat outlet.

Care and maintenance

Before attempting any cleaning or maintenance, unplug the drying unit from the mains power supply and allow it to cool fully.

Clean the drying unit with a soft, damp, lint-free cloth and dry thoroughly.

Do not immerse the heated airer in water or any other liquid. Do not use harsh or abrasive detergents or scourers.

Instructions for use

Assembling the drying unit and airer cover

STEP 1: Before plugging the drying unit into the mains power supply, assemble the clothes airer (not included) and place the drying unit on the floor underneath or on the drying rack provided. The drying unit must be positioned centrally underneath the airer and on a flat, even surface for best results.

STEP 2: Hang up the damp garments on the airer as required. Load evenly across the airer to avoid it tipping over.

STEP 3: Unzip the airer cover and place it over the loaded airer.



NOTE: Only spun, well-wrung washing should be added. Take care not to exceed the maximum weight for the chosen airer.

Using the drying unit

Once the drying unit has been assembled following the instructions in the section entitled 'Assembling the drying unit and airer cover', it is ready to use.

STEP 1: Plug the drying unit into the mains power supply and turn on at the switch.
