

Check the person for signs of serious allergic reaction (anaphylaxis):

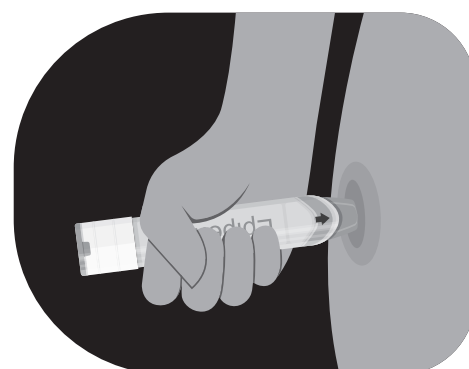
- Shortness of breath, wheezing, or trouble breathing
 - Hives, swelling, or itching of the face, lips, tongue, throat, hands, or arms
 - Dizziness, fainting, or feeling faint
 - Tightness in the throat
 - Weak pulse or low blood pressure
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PREPARE:

1. Grasp the auto-injector with the [orange] tip pointing downward.
2. With your other hand, remove the [blue] safety cap by pulling straight up. Do not bend or twist.

**ADMINISTER:**

1. Place the auto-injector with the orange tip against the outer thigh.
2. Swing and push the auto-injector firmly into the thigh until it “clicks”.
3. Hold in place for 3 full seconds.
4. Remove the auto-injector from the thigh.
5. After injection, the orange cover automatically extends to ensure the needle is never exposed.



After using the auto-injector, you must seek immediate medical attention or go to the emergency room. For the next 48 hours, you must stay close to a healthcare facility or be able to call 911.
