### **Choosing Car Seat Mode**

## **WARNING**

Failure to follow these instructions may result in serious injury or death to your child. Serious injury can include paralysis and/or permanent brain injury.

Be certain to measure your child's weight and height (do not guess) before choosing this car seat's mode.

Your child's height, weight, and age determine how the car seat should be placed in the vehicle.

Children vary widely in body size, shape, and temperament—please consult your doctor before switching between any modes within the limits and fit requirements of the car seat.

#### Infants and Toddlers

Children must ride rear-facing and remain rear-facing until they reach the maximum weight or height limits for rear-facing mode. Rear-facing child restraints installed behind another vehicle seat must be installed touching the back of the vehicle seat in front of it, or be as close as possible.

#### **Toddlers and Preschoolers**

Children can only use a forward-facing car seat once they outgrow rearfacing weight or height limits. Once they are forward-facing, children must use their child restraint in forward-facing mode with a harness until they reach the maximum weight or height limits for forward-facing harness mode.

#### School-Aged Children

Children can only use a belt-positioning booster car seat once they outgrow forward-facing harness weight or height limits. Children must use the belt-positioning booster mode until the vehicle's lap and shoulder seat belt fit them properly without the belt-positioning booster.

#### Rear-Facing Mode

**5–40 lb** (2.3–18 kg) **and 19–40 in.** (48–101.6 cm)



In this car seat, your child **MUST** ride **Rear-Facing** and remain in **Rear-Facing** mode until they outgrow any one of the above.

#### **Forward-Facing Mode**

**30–65 lb** (13.7–29.5 kg) **and 34.4–49 in.** (87.1–125 cm)



In this car seat, your child **MUST** remain in harnessed **Forward-Facing** mode until they outgrow any one of the above.


**40–100 lb** (18.1–45.4 kg) **and 43.4–52 in.** (110.1–132.1 cm)



In this car seat, your child can use the **Booster**Seat mode until they fit the vehicle's lap and shoulder seat belt properly without a **Booster Seat**OR outgrow any one of the above.

### **Accessory Use**



#### **Head Pillow and Body Pillow**

(on select models)

For Optional Use in Rear-Facing Mode Only

The head and body pillows MUST be used together.

**To remove head pillow**, pull it out from behind the body pillow.

To remove body pillow, undo the buckle and pull it through the slot in the pillow. Slide the pillow out from behind the harness straps.



#### **Buckle Cover**

(on select models)

For Optional Use in Rear-Facing Mode or Forward-Facing Mode

**To remove**, undo the buckle and pull the buckle cover off the buckle.



#### **EZ Out Buckle Cover**

(on select models)


For Optional Use in Rear-Facing Mode or Forward-Facing Mode

**To install**, slide buckle into opening in front of buckle cover.

**NOTE:** Slide buckle cover only through

slot in pad and **not** through buckle slot in shell. It lays flat underneath the pad as shown.

**To remove**, pull up on buckle cover and slide it off of the buckle and pull it out of the buckle slot in the seat pad.



### **Harness Covers**

(on select models)

For Optional Use in Rear-Facing Mode or Forward-Facing Mode

**To remove**, pull the fastening strips apart and pull the harness covers off of the harness straps.



The harness covers help provide comfort to your child's neck.

If the harness covers will not allow proper positioning of the chest clip or interfere with getting a tight enough harness fit for a smaller infant, remove and do not use.

Store until your child is large enough to use the harness covers while maintaining a properly fitting harness.

#### **EZ Out Harness Covers**

(on select models)

## For Optional Use in Rear-Facing Mode or Forward-Facing Mode

**To remove**, undo fasteners on headrest pad. Pull the fastening strips on covers apart. Pull harness straps out of covers. Slide covers out from behind headrest pad.

**To install**, undo fasteners on headrest. With the back of the harness covers facing you slide covers behind headrest pad. Place harness straps into covers. Fasten headrest fasteners and harness covers.



### Removable Cup Holder(s)

(on select models)

#### For Use in All Modes

The cup holder is top-rack dishwasher safe.



To remove cup holder, twist the cup holder counterclockwise. Pull it out of the slot in the car seat.



Removable Snack Lid and Tray (on select models)

The snack lid and tray are top-rack dishwasher safe.



To remove snack lid, pull it off the top of the cup holder.

To remove snack tray, locate the two tabs underneath the snack tray. Squeeze them together and lift the snack tray out of the slot in the car seat.

### **Changing Buckle Position**

## **WARNING**

Failure to place buckle's metal retainer completely through pad and child restraint can result in serious injury or death. Serious injury can include paralysis and/or permanent brain injury.





#### Undo Buckle

It may be easier to undo the buckle by pressing in towards the top of the button.






#### **Recline Car Seat** to Push Up **Metal Retainer**

Reach under between the base and the car seat. Rotate the buckle's metal retainer and push it up through the car seat.

Insert Buckle's **Metal Retainer** into Buckle Slot Closest to Child

Tuck the ends of the buckle cover into the same pad slot as the buckle.

For EZ Out Style: Slide the buckle cover into the seat pad slot closest to the child and then complete the rest of step 4 above.

#### **Reach Under Car Seat Between Base** and Car Seat

Pull the buckle's metal. retainer completely through the seat pad and car seat.

#### **Check Buckle**

Pull the buckle up to make sure it is secured.

# Harness System Adjustments for Smaller Infants



When using the lower shoulder harness slots for smaller children, you **MUST** use the head and body pillow and the headrest **MUST** be in the lowest position.

The harness system **MUST** be installed correctly.

**DO NOT** use a child restraint with damaged harness straps.




## Adjusting the Harness Straps for Smaller Infants



Fully Loosen Harness Straps and Adjust Headrest to Lowest Position

#### From Back of Car Seat, Pull Harness Straps through Car Seat

The harness straps **MUST** be in the shoulder harness slots **below** the metal bar.





From Back of Car Set, Remove Harness Strap Loops from Splitter Plate



Attach Second Harness Strap Loops to Splitter Plater





Pull Harness Straps Out of Upper Shoulder Harness Slots






#### Thread Harness Straps through Lower Shoulder Harness Slots

Pull the body pillow slightly away from the backrest. Insert the harness straps through the slots in the body pillow and then through the lower shoulder harness slots in the seat pad and the car seat.





The sewn ends of the harness strap loops **MUST** face towards you.

**DO NOT** twist the harness strap or the harness adjustment strap.

Make sure the upper harness strap loops (labeled "2") are fitted completely on both sides of the splitter plate. **DO NOT** use the lower loops (labeled "1" above) for smaller infants.




#### To return the harness straps to upper shoulder harness slots, follow the steps below to rethread them.


1. Remove the harness strap loops from the splitter plate and pull the harness straps out of the lower shoulder slots in the body pillow and car seat.



2. Thread the harness straps into the upper shoulder slots in the seat pad and car seat.



3. From the back of the car seat. thread the harness straps **OVER** the metal bar.



4. Attach the first harness strap loops to the splitter plate.

The sewn ends of the harness strap loops MUST face towards you.

**DO NOT** twist the harness strap or the harness adjustment strap.

Make sure the lower harness strap loops (labeled "1") are fitted completely on both sides of the splitter plate.



#### This car seat has 3 positions.

Rear-Facing Mode - 3 Reclined or 2 Semi-reclined

Use Position 3 or 2 to make sure the appropriate Rear-Facing Level **Line** is parallel with the ground. To determine which level line to use for your child's weight and height, see step 2 on page 22.

Forward-Facing Mode - Position 1 Fully upright Booster Seat Mode - Position 1 Fully upright



To Recline: Pull the recline handle out and push the top of the car seat back.

To Change to a More Upright Position: Pull the recline handle out and pull the top of the car seat forward.



In Forward-Facing Mode or Booster Seat Mode, the vehicle seat back MUST be in the upright position, but you can adjust the angle slightly to better match the angle of the car seat. Refer to the vehicle owner's manual for how to adjust the vehicle seat back.





#### **Fully Loosen Harness Straps**

Place your hand between the harness cover and harness strap.

You may need to undo the harness cover or move the chest clip down.

Push down on the harness release lever (through the opening in the pad) while pulling out on the harness straps as shown.

#### Adjust Headrest/ **Harness Height**

- 1. Squeeze the adjustment handle lever up.
- 2. Move the headrest up or down to the proper height for vour child.
- 3. Release the handle to lock in place.
- 4. Make sure it is locked securely.

In this car seat, your child MUST ride Rear-Facing and remain in Rear-Facing mode until they outgrow any one of the following:

• Weight Limit: 40 lb (18 kg); **OR** 

• Height Limit: 40 in. (101.6 cm); OR

• Rear-Facing Child Fit requirements, see page 18.

Before installing the car seat in your vehicle, check your child's fit in the car seat.

This way you won't have to redo the vehicle installation to make adjustments to the car seat.

## **AWARNING**



**NEVER** install a rear-facing child restraint in the front seat of a vehicle equipped with an active frontal airbag.

**DO NOT** use the tether for rear-facing mode. Secure the tether strap hook to its storage attachment.

**DO NOT** use the lower anchor belt along with the vehicle lap or lap/shoulder belt.

**DO NOT** fasten multiple lower anchor hooks on the same lower anchor bar in the vehicle.

Check the vehicle belt or the lower anchor belt before each use.

Use **ONLY** if the belt can be tightened properly and locked securely in place.

Even when unoccupied, this child restraint **MUST** be firmly secured to the vehicle with the lower anchor belt or with the vehicle seat belt.

This child restraint **MUST ALWAYS** face the rear of the vehicle until the child has reached the maximum weight or height limit for the rear-facing mode.


#### Fully Loosen Harness Straps

Place your hand between the harness cover and harness strap.

You may need to undo the harness cover or move the chest clip down.

Push down on the harness release lever (through the opening in the pad) while pulling out on the harness straps as shown.

#### **Undo Chest Clip**

While holding both sides of the chest clip, press the release button with your thumb and pull the chest clip apart.

For magnetic chest clip: Hold the chest clip with both hands and press in on the top and bottom buttons with your index finger and thumb as shown.

While pressing both buttons, pull the right (top) half of the clip apart from the left (bottom) half to release the magnet and separate the chest clip.



#### **Undo Buckle**

Press the red button to release the buckle tongues.

#### Place Child in Car Seat

Your child's bottom and back should be flat against the car seat.

On select models: You may use the side pocket harness holders to put the harness straps out of the way while placing your child in the seat.

#### **Check Head Position**

The top of your child's head **MUST be at least 1 in.** (2.5 cm) **below** the top of the car seat's headrest.



#### Check Harness Strap Position

The harness strap **MUST** be placed **at the shoulder** when possible, or slightly below; never above.

#### **Check Buckle Position**

- Use the slot closest to your child.
- The buckle strap should not be underneath or behind your child.

**DO NOT** use the 3rd buckle slot in **Rear-Facing Mode**.

# Rear-Facing Vehicle Install



- Before installing the car seat in your vehicle, check to see if you need to adjust the buckle position for your child. See step 7 on page 20 for child fit. Once the car seat is installed, you will not be able to adjust the buckle position.
- Review vehicle owner's manual. Determine the type of vehicle belts in your car and how to use them to lock a car seat in place **OR** where LATCH: lower anchor seating positions are located in your vehicle.
- If you are using a vehicle belt to install the seat, make sure the lower anchor belt is stored away (see page 61).
- Make sure the tether strap is properly stored away (see page 66).

There are 2 different methods for install.

#### Use only one:







Vehicle Belt

LATCH: Lower Anchor Belt

## **WARNING**

**DO NOT** use both the LATCH: lower anchor belt and vehicle belt at the same time to install the car seat.





#### Place Car Seat Rear-Facing in Back Seat

The car seat base **MUST** be flat on the vehicle seat.

When using the passenger and driver side locations, the car seat **MUST** be touching the back of the vehicle seat in front of it, or be as close as possible.

#### Recline Car Seat and Check Rear-Facing Level Lines

For children 5–30 lb (2.3–13.6 kg) and 19–34.3 in. (48–87 cm), the bottom level line on the car seat MUST be parallel with the ground.

For children 30-40 lb (13.7-18 kg) and 34.4-40 in. (87.1-101.6 cm)

**AND can sit up unassisted,** the top level line on the car seat **MUST** be parallel with the ground.






Use **Position 2 or 3** to make sure the appropriate level line for your child's weight and height is parallel with the ground.

**DO NOT** use **Position 1** for **Rear-Facing Mode**. See Reclining Car Seat on page 14.


#### **Locate Rear-Facing Belt** Path and Route Vehicle Belt or Lower **Anchor Belt through It**

For the Lower Anchor Belt: You may need to fully lengthen the belt before routing it into the belt path. Squeeze the adjuster button and pull the belt out as shown.

Thread the connector without the adjuster closest to it through the **Rear-Facing Belt Path** opening as shown.

#### Vehicle Belt or Lower **Anchor Belt Goes:**

- Under the car seat pad; AND
- Across the car seat: AND
- In front of the buckle: AND
- Out the other Rear-Facing Belt Path opening.


DO NOT twist the belt.



### **Finished Lower Anchor Belt Routing**

The lower anchor belt adjuster **MUST** be on the child's right.

#### **Attach Lower Anchor Belt** Connectors to Vehicle's **Lower Anchors**

**Buckle Vehicle Belt** 


If your car has a switchable retractor, use it to lock the vehicle belt. Review page 66 of this manual or your vehicle

owner's manual.

On select models: Make sure the arrows on the connectors are facing up.

Fasten one lower anchor belt connector to the anchor located in the vehicle seat.

Repeat for other side of car seat.





#### **Tighten Belt**

Place your hand in the car seat and firmly push the car seat down and back towards the vehicle seat. Pull the belt towards you and parallel (in line) with the belt path as shown.



For the Lower Anchor Belt or Lap Only Vehicle Belt: it may be easier to tighten if you route the free end of the belt back into the Rear-Facing Belt Path, reach into the Rear-Facing Belt Path, and pull the free end of the belt towards you.

#### **Check Belt Tightness**

Hold the Rear-Facing Belt Path with your non-dominant hand. Push and pull the car seat from side to side.

The car seat should not move more than **1 in.** (2.5 cm) at the belt path.



If the car seat moves more than 1 in.  $(2.5\ \text{cm})$ , you can try:

- Pulling the belt tighter; OR
- · Reinstalling the car seat; OR
- Changing to a different seating location; OR
- Switching to a different install method (LATCH or vehicle belt).

#### Secure Child in Car Seat

#### Recheck Rear-Facing Level Lines

Redo the installation if the car seat is not reclined correctly for your child. See step 2 and the info box on page 22.





Only if necessary, you may place a tightly rolled towel(s) or foam pool noodle(s) under the front of the car seat base to help make the appropriate **Rear-Facing Level Line** for your child's weight and height parallel with the ground.

Check often to make sure padding is still in place and the belt is tight.



- Is the belt tightened enough so that the car seat does not move more than 1 in. (2.5 cm) from side to side at the belt path? Check the tightness of the install often to make sure it has not loosened. See steps 6 and 7.
- Is the appropriate level line for your child parallel with the ground? See step 2 and the info box on page 22 and step 9 and the info box on page 26.

When using the passenger and driver side locations, the car seat **MUST** be touching the back of the vehicle seat in front of it, or be as close as possible.



**30–65 lb** (13.7–29.5 kg) **and 34.4–49 in.** (87.1–125 cm)

In this car seat, your child MUST remain in harnessed Forward-Facing mode until they outgrow any one of the following:

• Weight Limit: 65 lb (29.5 kg); **OR** 

• Height Limit: 49 in. (125 cm); OR

• Forward-Facing Child Fit requirements, see page 30.

Before installing the car seat in your vehicle, check your child's fit in the car seat.

This way you won't have to redo the vehicle installation to make adjustments to the car seat.

## **AWARNING**

**DO NOT** use the lower anchors of the child restraint anchorage system (LATCH system) to attach this child restraint when restraining a child weighing more than 50 lb (22.7 kg).

The vehicle belt **MUST** be used for installation if your child weighs more than 50 lb (22.7 kg).

When anchors are available, you **MUST ALWAYS** attach, adjust, and secure the tether (top anchorage) strap when installing the car seat in the Forward-Facing mode with internal harness.

**DO NOT** use the lower anchor belt along with the vehicle lap or lap/shoulder belt.

Check the vehicle belt or the lower anchor belt before each use.

Use **ONLY** if the belt can be tightened properly and locked securely in place.

**DO NOT** fasten multiple lower anchor hooks on the same lower anchor bar in the vehicle.

Even when unoccupied, this child restraint **MUST** be firmly secured to the vehicle with the lower anchor belt or with the vehicle seat belt.

Before using this seat in Forward-Facing mode, your child must have outgrown the seat in Rear-Facing mode.



# Forward-Facing Vehicle Install



- Before installing the car seat in your vehicle, check to see if you need to adjust the buckle position for your child. See step 7 on page 32 for child fit. Once the car seat is installed, you will not be able to adjust the buckle position.
- Review vehicle owner's manual. Determine what kind of vehicle belts your car has and how to use them to lock a car seat in place OR where LATCH: lower anchor seating positions are located in your vehicle.
- If you are using a vehicle belt to install the seat, make sure the lower anchor belt is stored away (see page 61).

There are 2 different methods for install.

#### Use only one:











#### Vehicle Belt + Tether

for a child up to 65 lb (29.5 kg)

#### LATCH: Lower Anchor Belt + Tether

Do not install by this method for a child weighing more than 50 lb (22.7 kg).

## **▲** WARNING

**DO NOT** use both the LATCH: lower anchor belt and vehicle belt at the same time to install the car seat.

When anchors are available, you **MUST ALWAYS** attach, adjust, and secure the tether (top anchorage) strap when installing the car seat in the Forward-Facing Mode with internal harness.

#### **Back Seat**







#### Attach Lower Anchor Belt Connectors to Vehicle's Lower Anchors

#### **Tighten Belt**

Place your hand in the car seat and firmly push the car seat down and back towards the vehicle seat. Pull the belt towards you and parallel (in line) with the belt path as shown.

For the Lower Anchor Belt or Lap Only Vehicle Belt: it may be easier to tighten if you route the free end of the belt back into the Forward-Facing Belt Path, reach into the Forward-Facing Belt Path, and pull the free end of the belt towards you.

#### **Check Belt Tightness**

Hold the Forward-Facing Belt Path with your non-dominant hand. Push and pull from side to side.

The car seat should not move more than 1 in. (2.5 cm) at the belt path.



If the car seat moves more than 1 in. (2.5 cm), you can try:

- Pulling the belt tighter; OR
- Reinstalling the car seat; OR
- Changing to a different seating location; OR
- Switching to a different install method (LATCH or vehicle belt).

#### **Tighten Tether**

Push firmly on the back of the car seat and pull the free end of the tether strap to remove all of the slack.

#### LATCH: Lower Anchor Belt + Tether

Do not install by this method for a child weighing more than 50 lb (22.7 kg).

- **Vehicle Belt Install:** Is the vehicle belt locked? See step 7.
- LATCH: Lower Anchor Belt Install: Are the connectors securely attached to the vehicle's lower anchors? See step 7.
- Is the belt tightened enough so the car seat does not move more than 1 in. (2.5 cm) from side to side at the belt path? Check the tightness of the install often to make sure it has not loosened. See steps 8 and 9.
- Has the tether been installed and tightened? See steps 4 and 10.

#### Securing Child in Car Seat

## **▲ WARNING**



DO NOT use the magnetic chest clip with children who have an implanted electronic medical device.

A magnet is used to help secure the chest clip locking mechanism together which may interfere with the proper function of an implanted

electronic medical device.

Parents or caregivers who have an implanted electronic device should keep their device away from the chest clip and consult their doctor and medical device manufacturer for specific information before using this chest clip.

If a parent/caregiver or child has an implanted electronic medical device, please contact Dorel (see back cover) for a replacement (non-magnetic) chest clip free of charge.

#### **Fasten Chest Clip**

Insert right half of the chest clip into the left half and snap together.

For Magnetic Chest Clip:

Lay the right (top) half of the chest clip over the left (bottom) half and it will automatically snap together and lock.

Pull gently on each half of the chest clip together to make sure it is locked.





#### Place Child in Car Seat

Your child's bottom and back should be flat against the car seat.



#### **Buckle Harness**

Pull the harness straps up to make sure the buckle is locked.

#### **Tighten Harness**

Pull the harness adjustment strap straight out to snugly tighten the harness.

#### **Position Chest Clip**

Slide the chest clip up the harness straps and position it at mid-chest (even with armpits) and away from your child's neck.

#### Check Harness Tightness

Unfasten the harness covers.

Try to pinch the harness at the shoulders vertically between index finger and thumb as shown.

If your fingers slip off, the harness is tight enough. If you can pinch the harness strap, tighten more. Fasten the harness covers.



A snug strap should not allow any slack. It lies in a relatively straight line without sagging. It does not press on the child's flesh or push the child's body into an unnatural position.

If one side of the harness is tighter than the other, lengthen the tighter side by pulling up the harness near the hip slot.

#### FINISHED!



Your child is now secured in the car seat.

Check your child's fit often and make any needed adjustments to the car seat as they grow.

#### To Remove Child from Car Seat:

- **1.** Loosen harness strap.
- 3. Release chest clip.

2. Unbuckle harness.

4. Remove child.

#### **Troubleshooting**

**1.** If the buckle or harness release lever sticks: D0 NOT lubricate. Check for dropped food, sticky spilled drinks, dirt, leaves, etc.

Clean with warm water and/or remove the object with tweezers. If you cannot get the harness to adjust and remain tight with the buckle securely locked, **DO NOT** use this car seat.

2. If your harness twists: Straighten the harness each time you put your child in the car seat. Lock the buckle and tighten the harness so it will be ready for next use.

## **WARNING**

Failure to fasten and tighten the harness system correctly may allow the child to be ejected from the child restraint in a crash or sudden stop causing serious injury or death. Serious injury can include paralysis and/or permanent brain injury.



**DO NOT** mistake comfort for safety. The harness system **MUST** be snugly adjusted.

**DO NOT** put snowsuits or bulky garments on your child when placing them in the child restraint.

Bulky clothing can prevent the harness straps from being tightened properly.



**40–100 lb** (18.1–45.4 kg) **and 43.4–52 in.** (110.1–132.1 cm)

In this car seat, your child can use the Booster Seat mode until they fit the vehicle's lap and shoulder seat belt properly without a Booster Seat OR outgrow any one of the following:

• Weight Limit: 100 lb (45.4 kg); OR

• Height Limit: 52 in. (132.1 cm); **OR** 

• Booster Seat Child Fit requirements, see page 53.

You **MUST** store the harness system and remove the accessories, except the cup holders and/or snack tray, when using the **Booster Seat Mode**.

## **WARNING**

**DO NOT** use the harness system when using as a booster seat.

**DO NOT** use the booster seat if vour child's head is less than 5 in. (12.7 cm) below the roof of the car. Consult your vehicle manual for proper seatbelt usage.



#### **Check Shoulder Belt Position**

The shoulder belt should lay snugly across the center of your child's shoulder and across their chest.



#### **Check Lap Belt Position**

The lap belt should lay snugly across your child's hips; not on their stomach.

### **Removing Seat** Pad Set



You do not need to remove the harness system to remove the pad from the car seat.

**DO NOT** fully pull the harness strap out of the car seat. Leave it threaded in the hip harness slots. If removed, you will not be able to rethread it.

**To remove accessories**, see pages 5–7.



#### **Fully Loosen Harness Straps**

#### **Cleaning Parts of Car Seat and Installing Seat Pad Set**

#### **Cleaning Pad and Accessories**

Machine wash separately with cold water on a gentle cycle. Make sure the harness covers are closed so the fastening strips are not exposed. **DO NOT** use bleach. Tumble dry separately for 10–12 minutes on low heat. Remove immediately.

#### **Cleaning Harness Strap**

#### Check the harness straps often for any wear or damage.

Spot clean using warm sudsy water and a damp cloth. Spilled food and liquids on the car seat may result in mold or bacterial growth over time. These spills could also attract insects or rodents.

#### Cleaning Buckle and Car Seat

Spot clean using warm sudsy water and a damp cloth. DO NOT submerge into water.

#### **Installing Seat Pad Set**


- 1. Lower headrest to middle of car seat.
- 2. Pull seat pad around headrest and onto car seat.
- 3. Secure the two clips at the bottom of the seat pad to the front of the car seat. Reinsert the two fabric tabs near the top of the backrest pad into the slots on the sides of the seat pad.
- 4. Pull headrest pad onto headrest.
- 5. Insert the two fabric tabs on the upper portion of the headrest pad into the slots on lower portion.

**DO NOT** fully pull the harness strap out of the car seat. Leave it threaded in the hip harness slots. If removed, you will not be able to rethread it.


**DO NOT** use the child restraint without the seat pad or with damaged harness straps.

### **LATCH: Lower Anchor Belt**



Your vehicle's features may be considerably different than those pictured here.

The lower anchors of LATCH (Lower Anchors and Tethers for CHildren) is a universal system for installing car seats without using vehicle seat belts. The LATCH: lower anchor belt can **ONLY** be used in vehicles that have the lower anchor bars installed in designated seating positions. Most vehicles manufactured after September 2002 are equipped with LATCH: lower anchor bars. Check your vehicle owner's manual to see which seating positions may be equipped with LATCH: lower anchor bars.





## **▲ WARNING**

**DO NOT** use both the lower anchor belt and vehicle belt at the same time.



Your vehicle's features may be considerably different than those pictured here.

If LATCH: lower anchors are not an option or if your child weighs more than **50 lb** (22.7 kg) in **Forward-Facing Mode**, you **MUST** use the vehicle seat belt system to install the car seat.

Not all vehicle belts and seating positions will work with car seats. Please go through the following steps to understand how to lock a car seat in Rear-Facing Mode or Forward-Facing Mode with a vehicle belt.





#### You MUST Review Your Vehicle Owner's Manual

Your vehicle owner's manual will let you know which vehicle belts and seating positions car seats can be installed in.

Types of Retractors

#### Check How This Car Seat Will Be **Locked Into Place**

The vehicle belt **MUST NOT** loosen after tightening.

This means there needs to be a way to lock the vehicle belt.

#### The ways this can be done are:

- By using the seat belt's retractor (see step 3); **OR**
- By using the seat belt's latch plate (see step 4).



#### **Check Retractor**

Retractors pull seat belts into stored positions and lock the belt to hold passengers in place.

See the next page for some common types of vehicle belt retractors that will work with this car seat.



#### Switchable Retractor

(most vehicles have this type)

This retractor can be switched to a locking mode.

You MUST have the retractor in the locking **mode** to use the seat belt with this car seat.

Switching to locking mode: Slowly pull the shoulder belt all the way out, then let it go back in **1–2 in.** (2.5–5 cm).

As it goes back in, you will most likely hear a ratcheting sound.

Gently pull the belt to see if it has locked. You will not be able to pull any more belt out if the lock has engaged.



#### **Automatic Locking Retractor**

This retractor always locks.

It will automatically lock after slowly pulling the seat belt out at least halfway and letting the belt go back into the retractor **1–2 in.** (2.5–5 cm).



#### **Emergency Locking Retractor** See Step 4 Check Latch Plates

If the retractor does not lock, it is most likely an Emergency Locking Retractor. These retractors only lock during a sudden stop or collision.

You will need to determine if your seat belt's latch plate can lock the belt. See step 4. Check Latch Plates.





#### **Check Latch Plates**

Latch plates are the part of the seat belt that goes into the buckle.

#### To see if the latch plate locks:

- 1. Buckle vehicle belt.
- **2.** Slowly pull up on the lap portion of the vehicle belt.

If the vehicle belt does not slide through the latch plate, it's locked.

If the vehicle belt slides through the latch plate, it is a **sliding latch plate**.

Sliding latch plates easily slip between the lap and shoulder portions of the belt.




If you have an Emergency Locking Retractor with a Sliding Latch Plate, you MUST use a locking clip.

Please contact us for one, see the back cover of the manual.

## Never Use the Following With This Car Seat:

- Emergency Locking Retractor Lap Only Belt
- Inflatable Seat Belts



Your vehicle's features may be considerably different than those pictured here.

When anchors are available, you **MUST always attach, adjust, and secure the tether (top anchorage) strap** when installing the car seat in the **Forward-Facing Mode** with internal harness. Tethers improve the installation and stability of car seats and reduce the risk of injury. Attach the tether hook to the tether anchor designated by your vehicle manufacturer for that seating position. Check your vehicle owner's manual for more information. If the seating position does not have a tether anchor, use a different seating position or see your dealer or a qualified mechanic and have one installed.



#### **Storing Top Tether Strap**

The tether strap **MUST** be properly stored in its storage location when:

- Installing in Rear-Facing Mode; OR
- Using the Booster Seat Mode; OR
- The car seat is not installed in a vehicle.

Attach the tether hook to its storage location as shown. Gently tighten to remove slack.

### **WARNING**

Using this child restraint without the tether strap anchored as required by the manufacturer would be a misuse of the child restraint and, in a sudden stop or crash, could result in serious injury or death. Serious injury can include paralysis and/or permanent brain damage.

**DO NOT** fasten multiple tether hooks on the same tether anchor in the vehicle.

## **WARNING**

**NEVER** take your child out of the child restraint while the vehicle is moving.

**NEVER** leave your child unattended.

Placing your child in a hot child restraint may result in burns.

**DO NOT** use a child restraint with damaged or missing parts.

**DO NOT** use a child restraint with cut, frayed, or damaged harnesses.

**DO NOT** substitute parts or try to modify the child restraint in any way. **DO NOT** lubricate buckles and fasteners.

**DO NOT** use any child restraint accessory except those approved by Dorel Juvenile Group.

**NEVER** allow any child to play with this child restraint; it is not a toy.

**DO NOT** remove or cover up any of the warning labels or other labels on the child restraint.

This child restraint has been certified for use in passenger vehicles. **DO NOT** use in a boat, on a motorcycle or in a cargo van or bus where there are no seat belts or tether anchors.

Read all instructions for additional warnings.

## **AWARNING**



**NEVER** place a child rear-facing in a seating position with an active frontal air bag.

Check the vehicle owner's manual for more information about air bag/child restraint use.



Use the child restraint only on vehicle seats that face forward.



**DO NOT** use on seats that face the sides or rear of the vehicle.

For vehicles without a back seat, refer to your vehicle owner's manual.



According to accident statistics, children are safer when properly restrained in the rear seating

positions than in the front seating positions.

Rear seating positions are statistically safer, whether you have air bags, advanced air bags, or no air bags at all.

If you are not sure where to place the car seat in your vehicle:

- Consult your vehicle owner's manual; OR
- Contact Dorel Juvenile Group Consumer Care Department; OR
- Visit your local Child Passenger Inspection Station. Go to https://www.nhtsa.gov/vehicle-safety/car-seats-and-boosterseats to find your closest station.

#### To avoid your child being seriously burned, take the following precautions:

- Park in the shade or where the sun does not directly hit the car seat.
- Cover the car seat with a sheet or blanket when not in use.
- Check for hot seat and buckles before placing child in car seat.

To help protect your vehicle seat's upholstery from damage: you may use an accessory approved by Dorel Juvenile Group or a single layer towel underneath and behind car seat.

### **▲ WARNING**

Check the vehicle belt or lower anchor belt before each use. Use only if the belt can be tightened properly and locked securely in place.

Even when unoccupied, this child restraint **MUST** be firmly secured to the vehicle with the lower anchor belt or with the vehicle seat belt.

Even when unoccupied, this booster seat **MUST** be firmly secured to the vehicle with the vehicle seat belt.

In a crash or sudden stop, an unsecured child restraint or booster seat could injure occupants.

### Replacement and Expiration

#### DO NOT risk your child's safety.

To keep your child as safe as possible, Dorel Juvenile Group strongly recommends replacing the car seat even after a minor crash; even if it was not occupied at the time.

#### Replacement After a Minor Crash

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration states that for a crash to be considered minor ALL of the following MUST be true:

- Vehicle able to drive away from the crash site; AND
- Vehicle door nearest the car seat was not damaged; AND
- No passengers were injured; AND
- Airbags did not deploy; AND
- There is no visible damage to the car seat.

If the crash your car seat was involved in meets **ALL** the criteria, you may not need to replace the car seat.

If one or more of these criteria are not true or if you are uncertain of any of your answers, replace the car seat immediately.

#### Replacement After a Moderate to Severe Crash

You **MUST** replace this car seat if it has been in a moderate to severe car crash.

This car seat is intended to protect a child in a single crash. During a crash, the car seat and all of its parts absorb crash energy which can deform or weaken it. Damage is not always visible. A damaged car seat **MUST** be replaced immediately.



#### **Expiration**

On the side of the car seat there is a date of manufacture label as shown.

**DO NOT** use this car seat more than 10 years after the date of manufacture.
