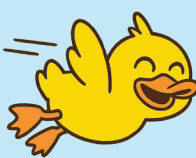

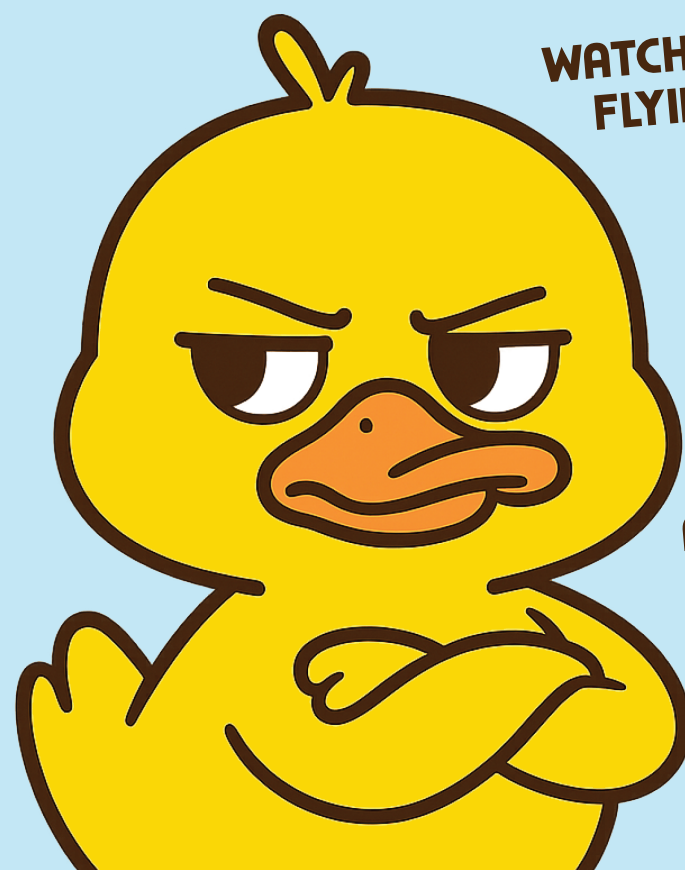

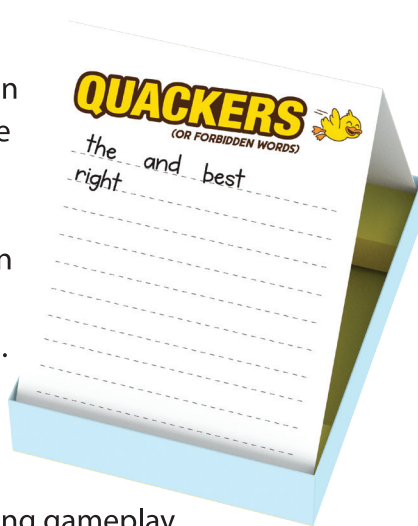

### Object of the Game

The first player to properly throw 5 Ducks wins.

### Set Up:

- Place the Quackers Board in a location where all players can see what is written on it. Place the Board in the slots on the platform in the game box. Place the Dry-Erase Marker nearby.
- Players thoroughly shuffle the Question Cards and place the Card deck face down in the middle of the playing area.
- Each player receives 5 Ducks and gets ready to start play.
- Quackers (known as forbidden words) are written on the Quackers Board during gameplay.



### How to Play:

1. The youngest player goes first. That player takes the top Card from the Question Card deck. The player reads the Card out loud, so everyone has an opportunity to hear the question. The player then answers the question with a minimum 4-word answer. (*Typical answers should be 2 to 3 sentences.*)
2. After the player has answered the Question Card, the player selects one of the words used in their answer and writes the word on the Quackers Board with the Dry-Erase Marker. **That word is now a Quacker or forbidden word and cannot be repeated at any time for the rest of the game.** Players may "QUACK" in the word's place, if desired, to avoid saying the word. (*The player should be sure*

*to write the word on the Board so that everyone has an opportunity to see and understand which word it is.)*

3. Play continues clockwise. (*The list of Forbidden Words will keep growing with every turn.*)
4. At any point in the game, if a player hears any other player saying a Quacker instead of saying "Quack," that player may throw a Duck at the person who said the word. If two different players' Ducks hit a player at the same time, and no one can really know which one was first, both players lose a Duck. But if it's clear that one Duck first to hit the offending player, only the first player gets rid of a Duck. Players may only throw one Duck when a Quacker is spoken. If a player mistakenly throws a Duck at someone and it turns out they didn't actually say a Quacker (*maybe you misheard, or you misremembered a word that was not actually on the Board*), the person who threw the Duck receives one Duck of the from the player who was misidentified (*plus the offending player has to keep the Duck mistakenly thrown in the first place*). Place any successfully thrown Ducks back in the game box. They are now out of play. If a player throws a Duck at another player and misses, the Duck goes back in their hand. (*By the way, any player can duck or move out of the way to avoid being hit!*)

*Note: Players should take care not to throw a Duck at another player's face.*

### A Word on Quackers:

Quackers are forbidden during the entire gameplay session, not just during official gameplay. Not saying Quackers means not saying them! Not when it is your turn, not when you are reading the Question Cards, not when you are double-checking the Instructions to prove somebody wrong, not even if players have "stopped playing" but everyone knows you didn't really stop playing. DO NOT say Quackers or any player will throw a Duck at you. Quackers are ALWAYS illegal until someone has won the game.

### Winning the Game:

The first player to properly throw their 5 Ducks wins the game.
