## 2021 GEVREY-CHAMBERTIN 1ER CRU “CLOS DES ISSARTS” PREMIER CRU MONOPOLE



### STORY

In the 9th century, Charlemagne owned vines in the Côte d’Or. He requested that the best lands be cleared out and this parcel was constructed in the forest. Situated in the south-west of the village, this Monopole climat was purchased by the domaine in 2003 following a 50 year leasing agreement. It is the smallest appellation in Bourgogne even smaller than Romanée-Conti Grand Cru..

### WINE NOTES

<b>Fermentation:</b>	Partial whole cluster fermentation with daily punch downs for a 19 day vatting period
<b>Barrel-Aged:</b>	16 months in French oak barrels- 40-50% new oak
<b>Fining &amp; Filtration:</b>	No fining and, light filtration using the lenticular module process
<b>Alcohol:</b>	13%

### TASTING NOTES

Deep ruby red in color with notes of ripe fruits, oak and touch of licorice on the nose. The palate offers silky smooth tannins, an elegant mouth-feel, good balance and excellent length.
