 Make certain your tent is properly ventilated in all weather conditions. In extreme weather conditions, snow could obstruct airflow and cause

EXERCISE CARE WHEN USING ELECTRIC DEVICES IN AND NEAR TENTS.

Although our tents and screen houses are constructed to rigid specifications, periods of wind or rain socking the ground may loosen the stakes and cause the uprights to sink into the ground. This will weaken the rigidity of the overall structure. Water pockets may also form in the roof if the unit is not assembled taut, possibly causing broken frames and torn fabric.




AREA FOR THE CAMPSITE. TO PREVENT DAMAGE TO THE ZIPPER, UNZIP THE DOOR TO ALLOW AIR TO ENTER THE TENT DURING SET UP. TO PROLONG THE LIFE OF THE TENT FLOOR, SELECT A LEVEL, CLEAN



STEP 6: Stake down tent by inserting tent stakes through the loops at each corner of the tent and at the center of the tent. Hammer stakes into ground at a 45° angle, by using a hammer or mallet. Make sure to pull tent out even and tight.




STEP 7: Unfold the fly. Place fly over the tent so that the cut out for the door is the fiberglass tent poles. the tent corners. Fasten the Velcro fasteners sewn to the edge of the fly around placed over the tent door. Attach the hooks on the fly to the webbing loops at

Slide tent and stake bag into carry bag. tent to distribute the bulk. Fold fly and lay on top of tent. Start a small tight roll
