Phillips Screw Driver, Carpenters Level, (8 pcs AA Batteries not included)

An electric screwdriver is helpful in assembly. However, please set at low torque and use extreme caution with an electric screwdriver because you could overtighten the hardware and strip the screws.

Assembly Tips

Make sure you understand the following tips before you begin to assemble your game table.

1. Start all bolts by hand before tightening.
2. Some drawings or images in this manual may not look exactly like your product. Please read and understand the text before starting each assembly step.
3. Assembly can be made both simpler and less timely by first unpacking all parts, and matching and organizing them to the Parts Identifier. This will greatly help you become familiar with the parts before and during assembly.
4. Some of this assembly can be made easier – by placing the parts and building the assembly on a pair of saw horses. A table can be used also as long as the top is well protected from any scratches that could occur. The table or saw horses would need to be structurally strong enough to support this weight.

Step 1 NOTE: READ + STUDY ALL ASSEMBLY TEXT, DIAGRAMS AND DIAGRAM NOTES.

IMPORTANT NOTE: BEFORE INSTALLING PLAYFIELD SCREWS - PLEASE BE SURE ALL PARTS HAVE BEEN REMOVED FROM INNER CABINET AND AIR MOTOR CORD IS BROUGHT THROUGH THE HOLE IN SIDE PANEL.



Remove all components from the carton. Note: Parts are packed inside the table cabinet. Remove the Hockey Table Playfield (#2). Inside the table cabinet you will find all the parts needed to assemble your table. Remove all parts.

IMPORTANT, be sure to feed the plug end from the fan motor through the hole in the side apron.

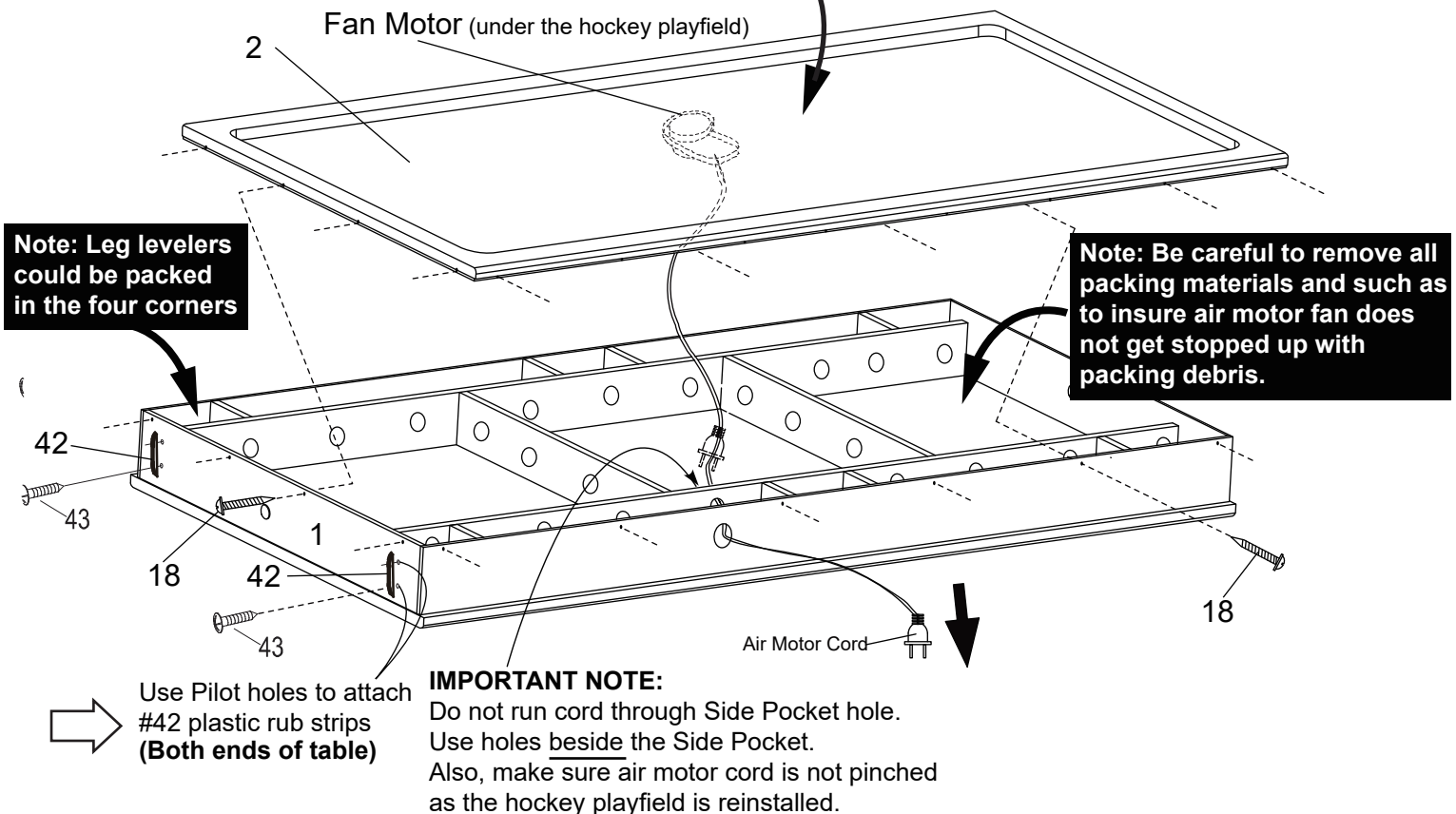
With the help of another adult, carefully reinstall the hockey table playfield (#2) onto the main cabinet and attach using Screws (#18). Attach the plastic Rub Strips (#42) to the ends of the Cabinet with Screws (#43).

Tighten, but do not strip out Screws #18 and #43.

IMPORTANT: Press Air Hockey Playfield Down Tight While Installing each (#18) Screw



**Carefully stand the air hockey playfield on edge while removing parts.
Do not lay playfield down onto the air motor.**

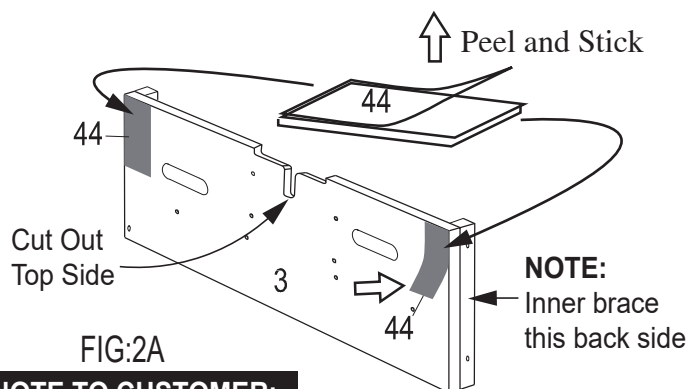

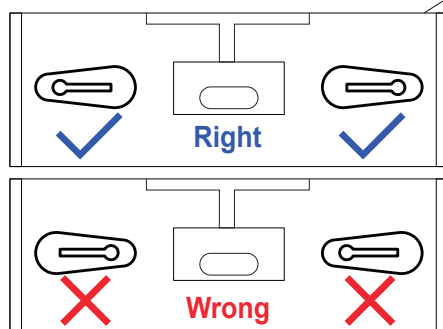
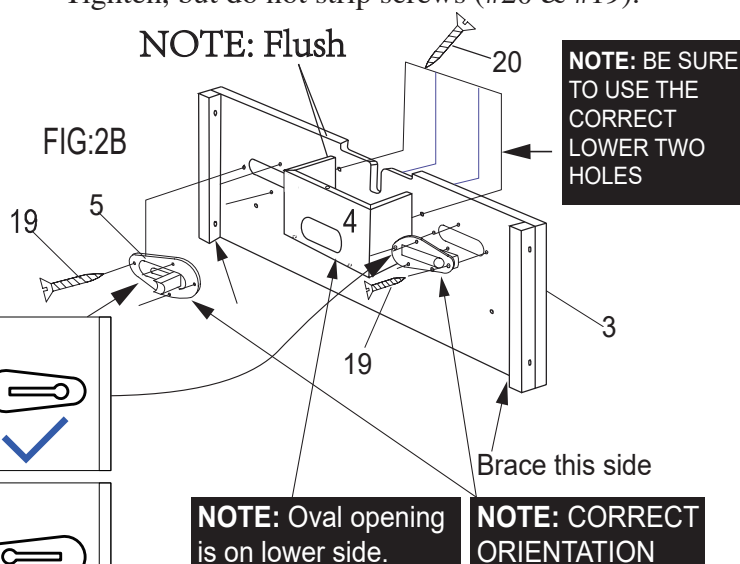
Remove backing and stick the end panel inner cushions (#44) to the each of the end panels (#3).



NOTE TO CUSTOMER:
The purpose of the (#44) end panel inner cushions is to offer a more stable playfield during play

Attach 2 Latch/locks (#5) into the Leg Top End Panel (#3) pre-cut holes with Screws (#19). Carefully fold and attach the puck catcher box (#4) with Screws (#20) using the predrilled holes. Add a small amount of wood glue into miter grooves before folding. Repeat this step for the other end panel. Tighten, but do not strip screws (#20 & #19).



CRITICAL: Latch locks(#19) must be orientated exactly the same as diagram.

Step 3

FIG:3A

Screw the end panel support board (#6) to the leg top end panel (#3) using screws (#20) into predrilled holes. Tighten, but do not strip screws (#20).

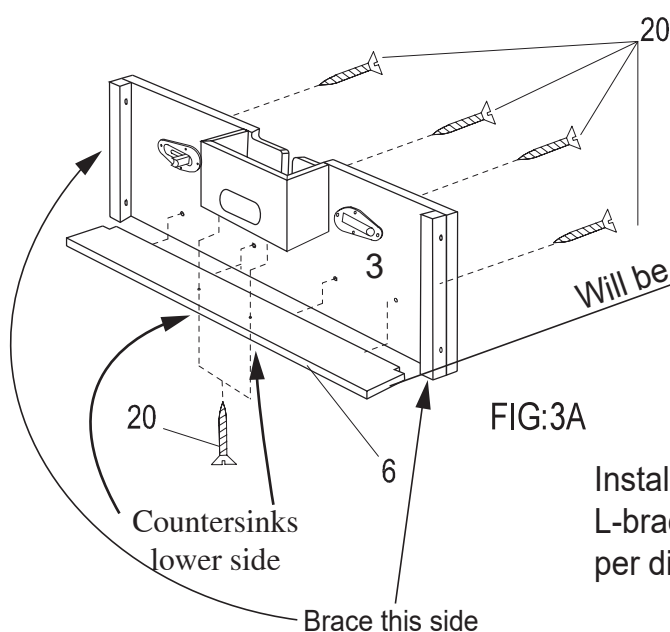
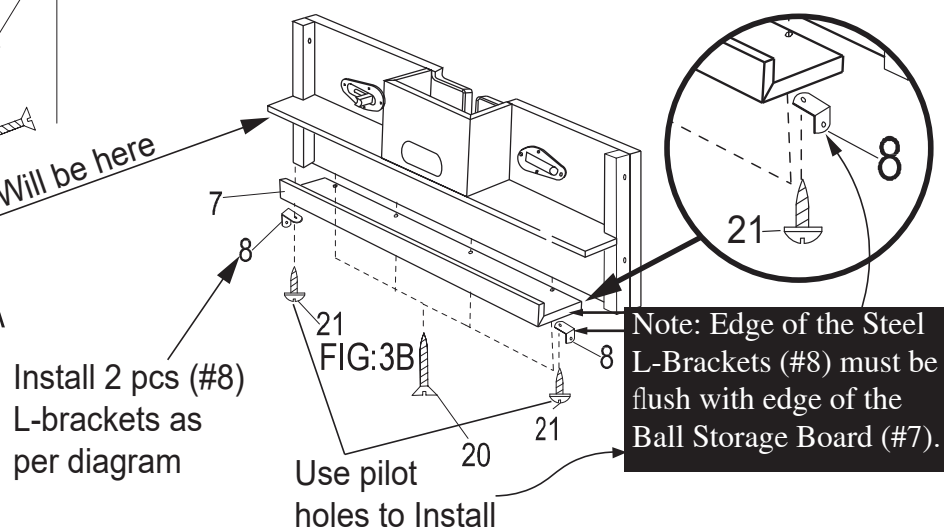

Screw the Steel Brackets (#8) onto the bottom of the Ball Storage Board (#7) using the pilot holes and Screws (#21). Now attach the Ball Storage Board (#7) to the leg pedestal using the predrilled holes and Screws (#20). Tighten, but do not strip screws (#20) and (#21). Repeat these steps for the other end panel (#3).



Step 4

NOTE: Be sure mitered grooves are free of any dust or debris before folding.

NOTE: Handle each leg with care

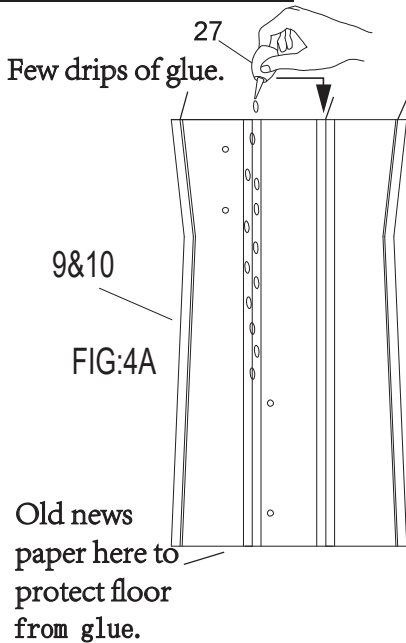

Assemble the legs (#9). Run a thin bead of glue (#27) into the mitered grooves on the inside edges of the leg (#9). And carefully fold leg.

Carefully slide leg Panel (#11) into grooves in the leg (#9). Make flush, leg + leg panel, at the top of the leg.

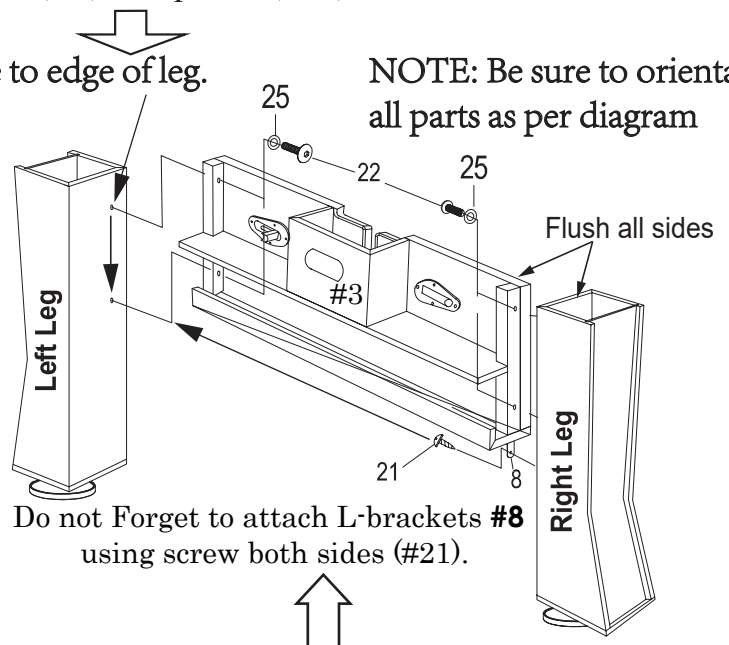
Attach leg base (#12) to the bottom end of the leg using screws (#20). Screw leg leveler (#26) into leg base (#12). Repeat this step for all 4 legs, 2 pcs of (#9) & 2 pcs of (#10).

IMPORTANT : Holes are close to edge of leg.

NOTE: Be sure to orientate all parts as per diagram

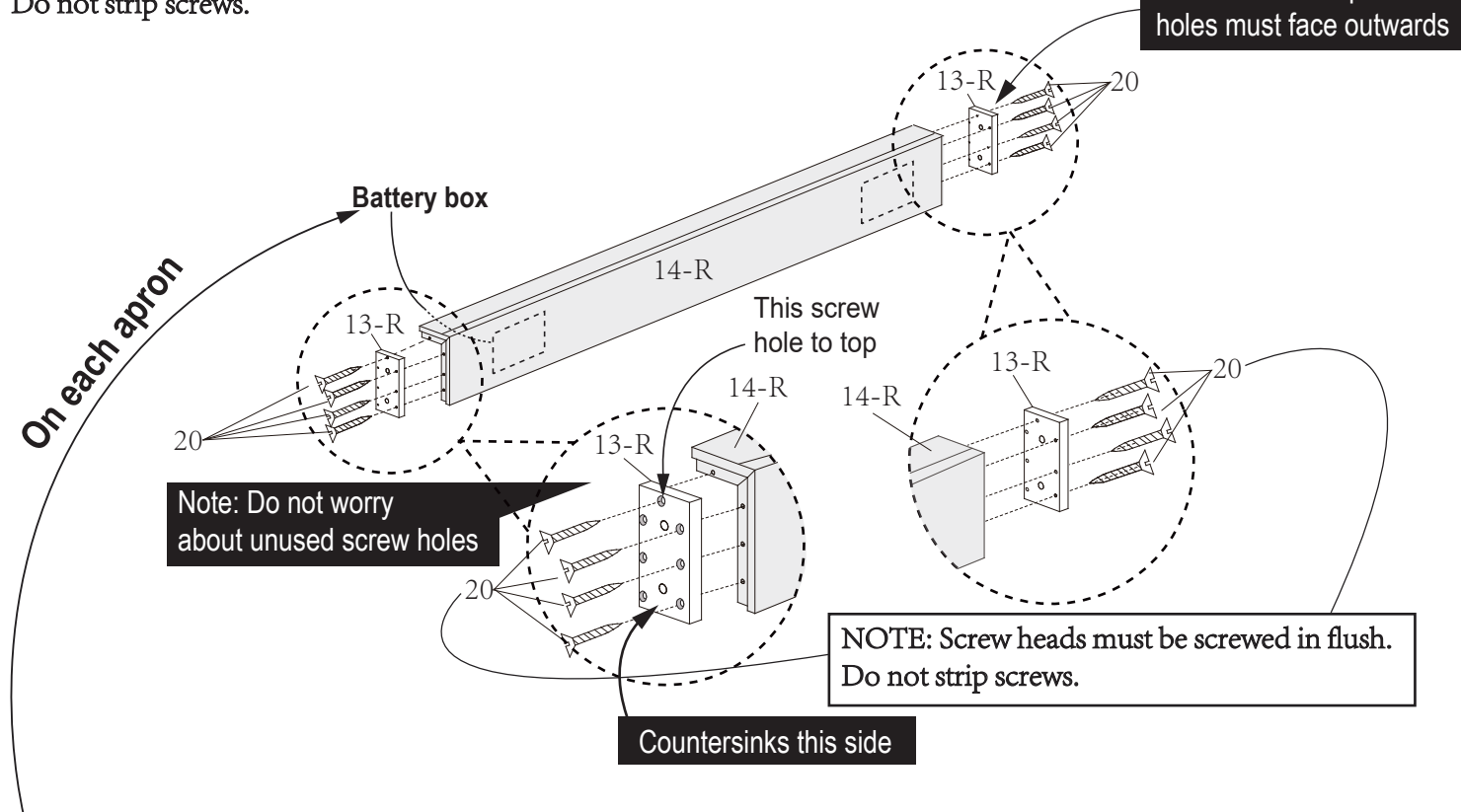
Step 5

With help from a second adult. Attach the leg pedestal (#3) to the legs (#9) & (#10) Align the bolt holes on each side of the leg pedestal (#3) to each leg (#9 & #10) using Bolts(#22) with washers (#25) and tighten using Allen key(#47). Now attach the steel brackets(#8) using screws (#21). Repeat procedure for the other end panel.



Step 6

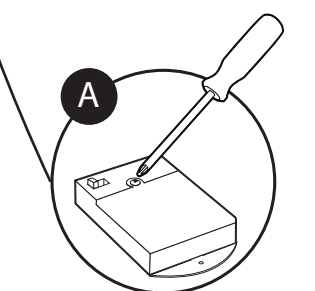
Assemble outside lower aprons 2 pcs (#14-R) by screwing the apron end boards (#13-R) to each end of the outside lower apron (#14-R) with screws (#20). Do not strip screws.



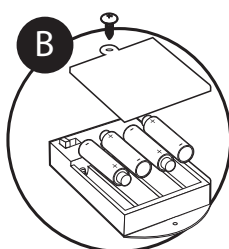
Step 7

Remove the screw using a small phillips screwdriver and open the battery box, Insert (4) AA batteries (not included) in the order of polarity as shown on the inside of the battery box. Then close using the same screwdriver. Turn on the power by pushing the on/off switch on the battery box to the "ON" position. (If the game will not be used for a long period of the time, we recommend that the batteries be removed)

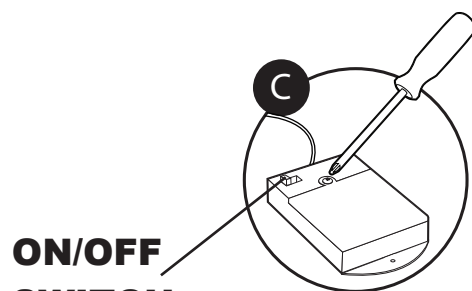

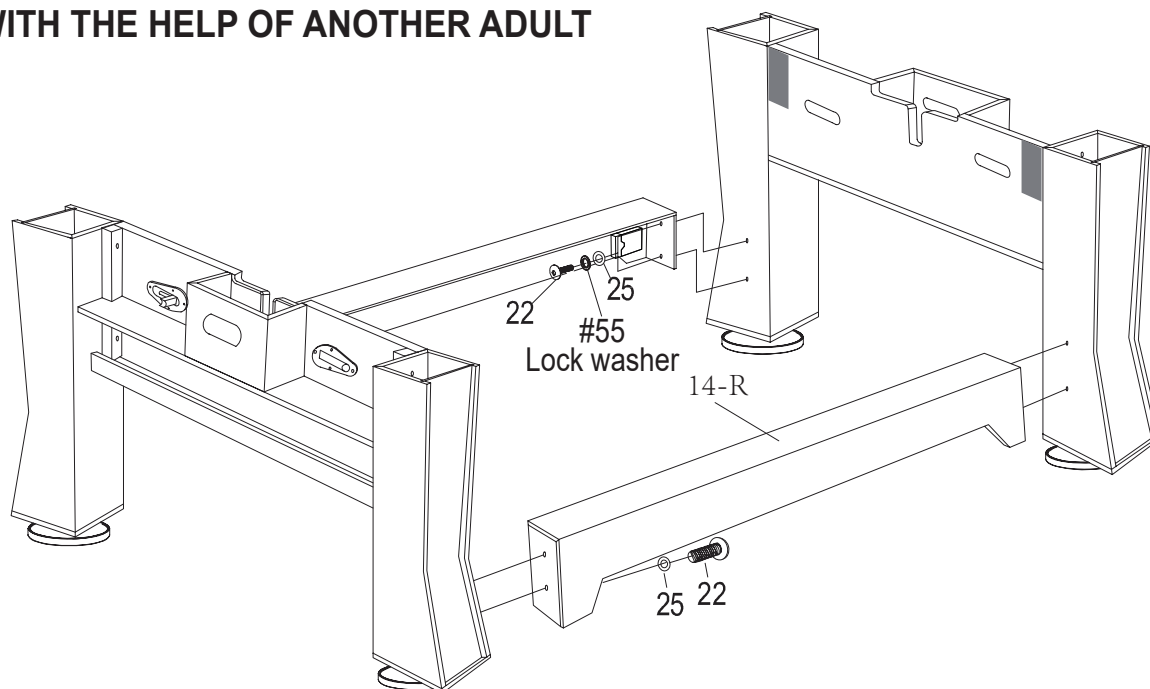
Should LED light strip not come on when the switch is on:

Check the battery box to light strip connection and correct battery polarity (+-) inside the battery box. And lastly, make sure batteries are good.

Step 8

With the help of another adult, attach the outside lower aprons(14-R) (flat side up) to the assembled leg pedestals by aligning the holes in the outside lower aprons (14-R) with the holes in the legs using bolts(#22) with washers(#25). Tighten bolts tight, Using the #47 Allen Wrench

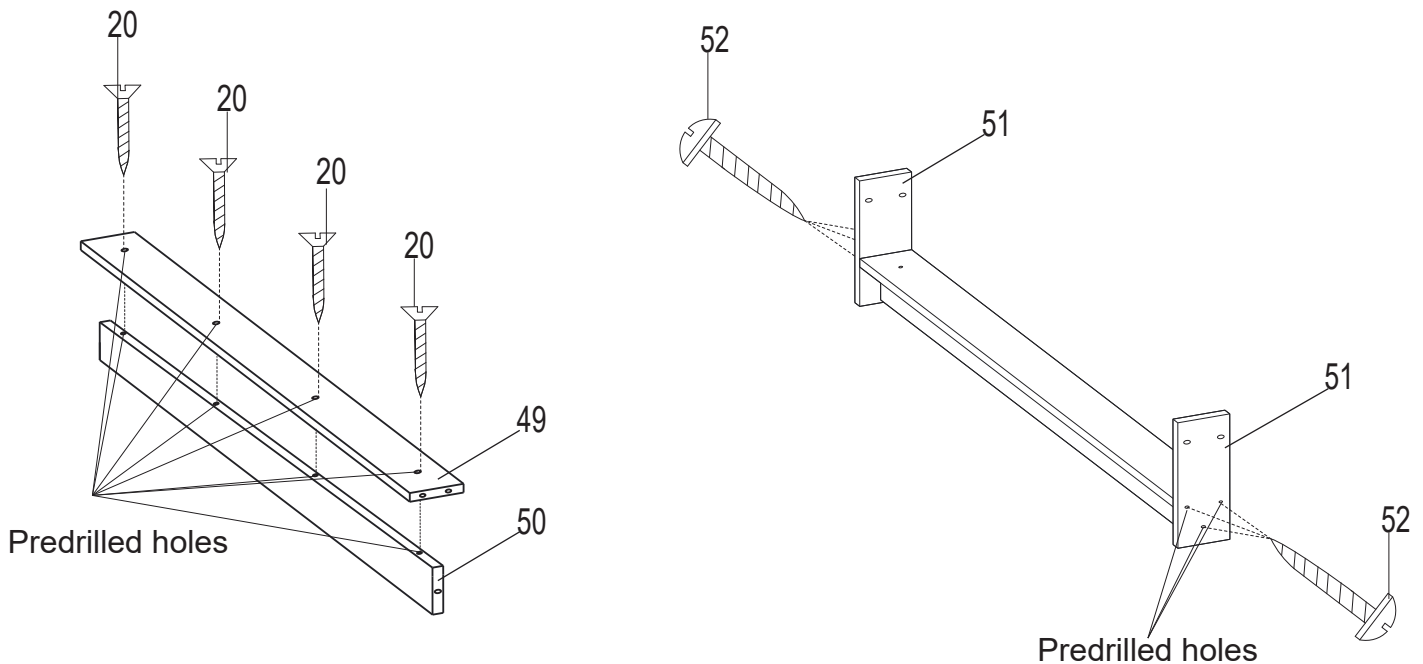
Note: When this assembly is complete, it would be best to place it where it will set in your room.

Keep in mind an A/C outlet for the air hockey air motor cord.

Step 9

Assemble TT playfield holder board **#49** and TT holder support board **#50** using screws **#20**.

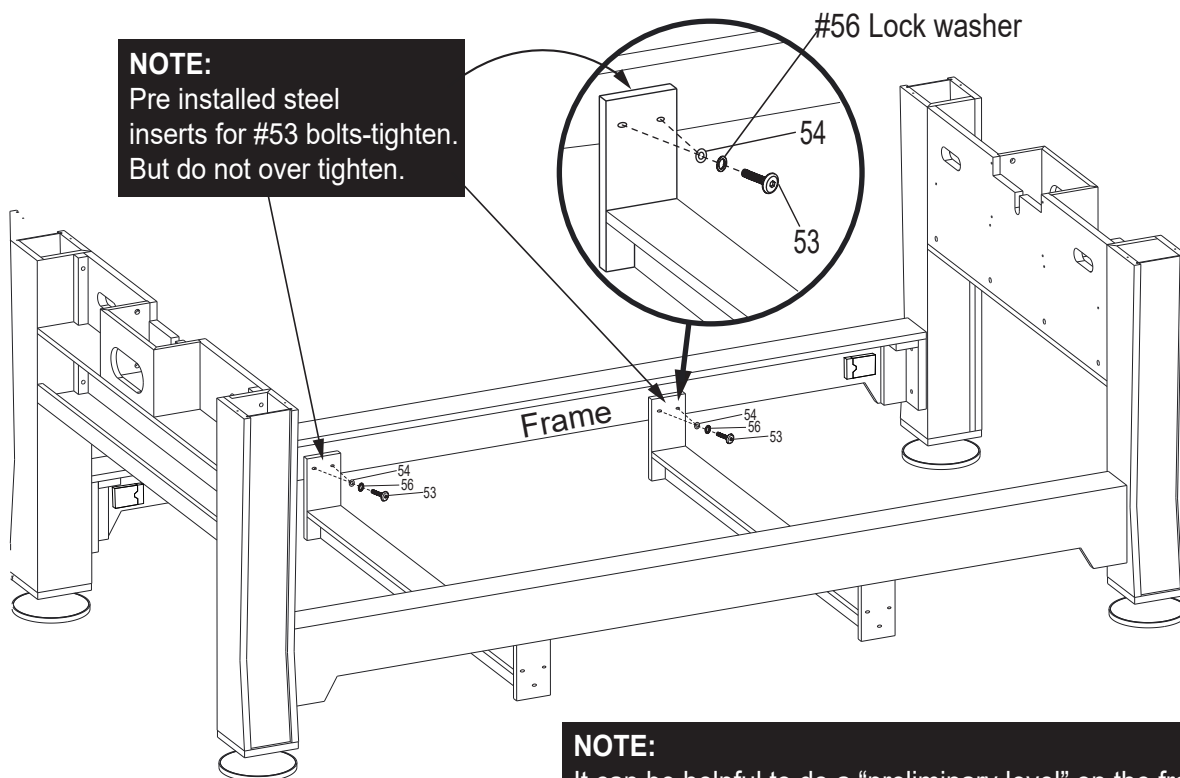
Attach TT holder connectors **#51** using screw **#52**. Assemble 2 identical assemblies
Do not strip out screws.



Step 10

WITH THE HELP OF A SECOND ADULT:

Attach the TT playfield holders to the frame by threading the **#53** bolts with **#54** washers and **#56** lock washer tighten tight. Using the **#47** Allen Wrench.



NOTE:

It can be helpful to do a "preliminary level" on the frame now. Use the leg levelers as required.

Step 11

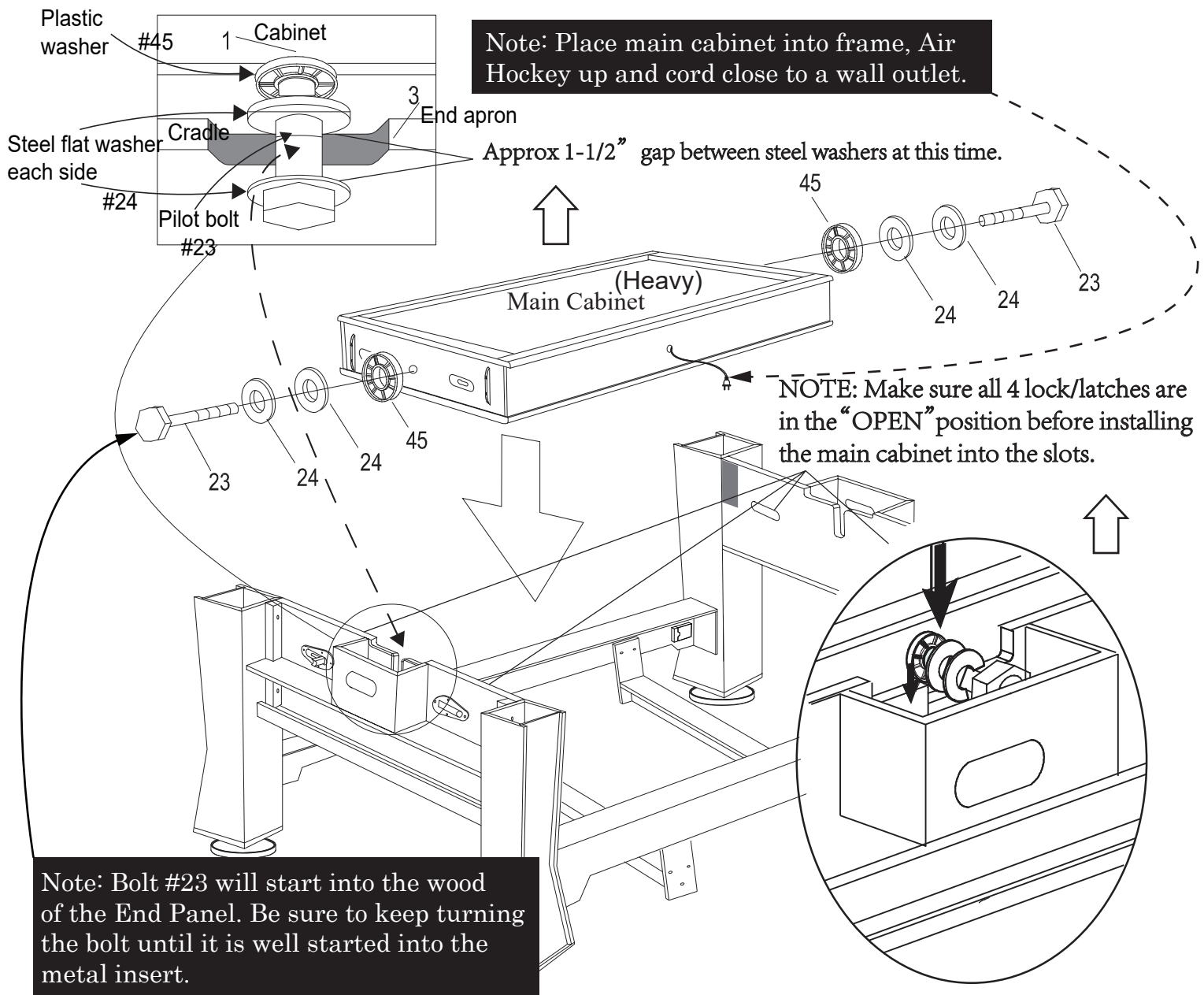
Preparing the pool / air hockey main cabinet for placement into the frame.

The factory installed threaded inserts in the main cabinet inside of each end (#1) cannot be removed, First, slide 2 pcs 20mm washers (#24) and plastic washer (#45) onto the 20mm hex bolt (#23) as seen below. Second, install pivot bolts (#23) into the metal threaded inserts in the ends of the main cabinet.

Screw the bolt into the steel insert leaving approx 1-1/2 of the hex bolt exposed when the bolt is secured into the steel threaded insert.

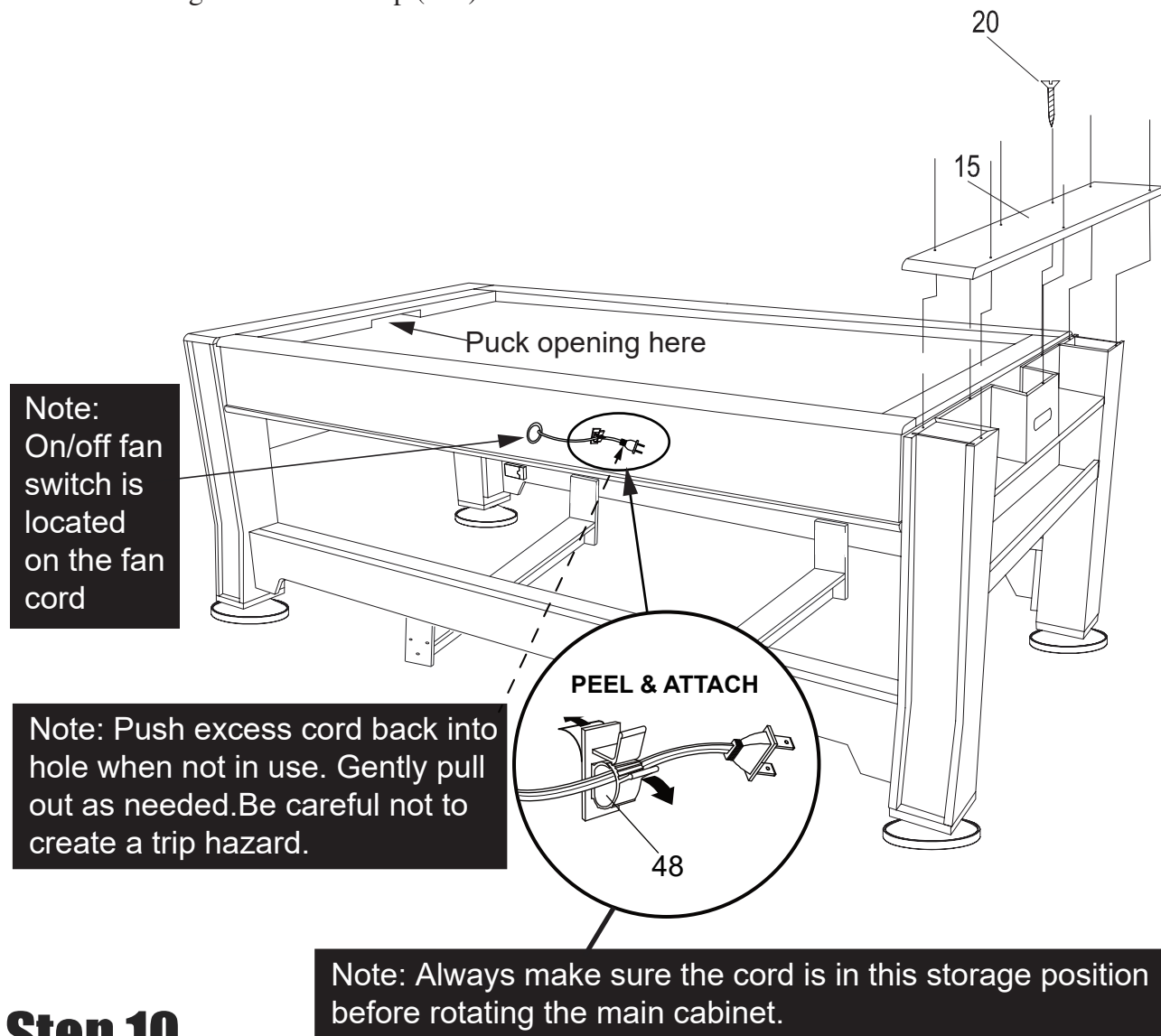
Placing the pool / air hockey cabinet to the base frame: **NOTE: USE CAUTION NOT TO PINCH FINGERS.** You are now ready to place the main cabinet (#1) onto the base frame. With the help of 4 to 5 other adults, have two adults on each side of the table top, and the others on the ends to help guide the hex bolts (#23) into the slots on the leg pedestals. Once in place, make sure the head of the hex bolts (#23) and the 20mm washer (#24) are sticking out past the leg panel. Make sure the plastic washer (#45) is against the main cabinet (#1) as it will act as the spacer for the table to rotate freely. To secure the table top to the leg panel use the wrench (#28) provided. Tighten each of the 20mm hex bolts (#23) on each end of the leg panel, snug tighten only. This will lock the table top to the base frame, and still allow the table top to rotate freely. When rotation is complete, engage all 4 latch/locks.

CAREFULLY LIFT THE MAIN CABINET FROM EACH SIDE (NOT ENDS) TO PLACE THE INTO THE END PEDISTAL LEGS 4 TO 5 CAPABLE ADULTS REQUIRED!



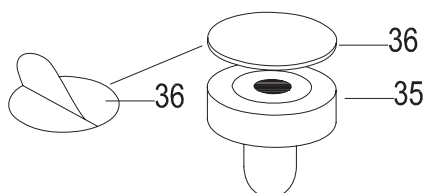
Step 12

Attach the top end panels(#15) to the assembled leg pedestals(#3) by aligning the holes in the end panel (#15) with the predrilled holes in the top of the leg pedestal,(#3) with screws (#20). Do not strip screws. Peel the backing off the Cord Clip (#48) and attach to a side of the table.



Step 10

Assemble the hockey striker (#35) by attaching the hockey felt (#36). Remove the protective paper and adhere the hockey felt (#36) to the striker (#35).



Note: #36 Hockey striker felt could be installed by factory

Step 13

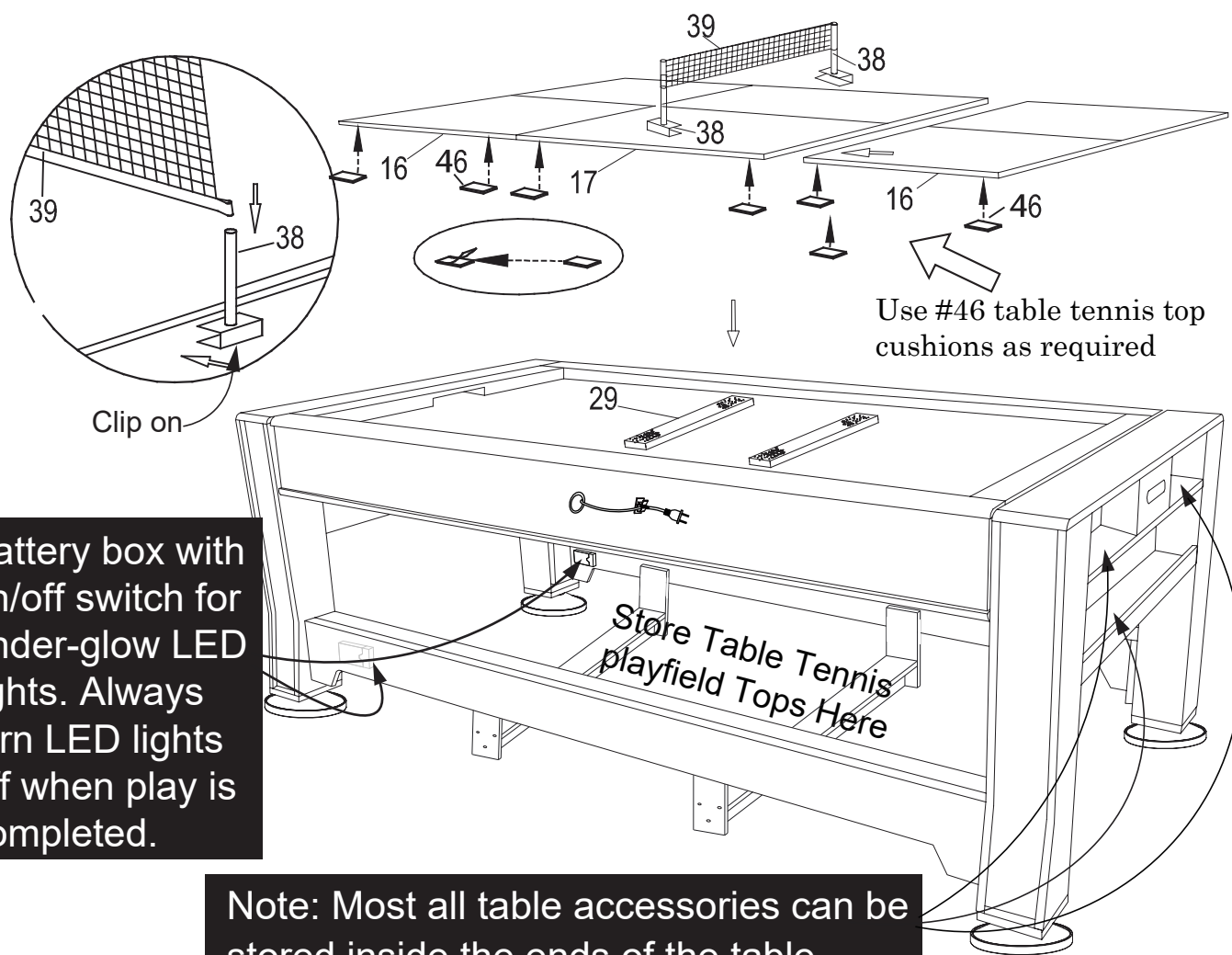
Place the 2 pcs anti sag tennis top playfield -supports(#29) onto the center of the hockey table playfield. Place the table tennis playfield (#17) and table tennis playfields (#16) on the cabinet top.

Attach the Net Posts (#38) to the Middle Board (#17), slide the table tennis net (#39) onto the Net Posts (#38).

WARNING: Table Tennis tops must be removed before rotating main cabinet!

Trouble Shooting:

If the pool table side is not level, first try to level by using the leg levelers on each leg. Most of the time the table can be easily leveled using this method. If the tennis top surface needs adjustments, shims may be used on the #29 cross supports to bring up the low spots.



Note: Always make sure all (4) latch/locks are correctly locked in place during the leveling process and during any play.

Lastly, using a carpenter's level and (4) leg levelers - level the table for best play.

Notice:

NOTE: Remove all billiard balls from the playfield pockets before rotating the billiards table.

BILLIARDS:

After the break, regardless of whether any balls were pocketed on the break, the table is Open, with the choice of stripes or solids determined by the next legally pocketed ball.

In the course of play, a player must call each shot in advance, by indicating the ball to be made and the pocket into which it will be made. It is not necessary to indicate details such as cushions, banks, caroms, etc. Failure to make the shot as called results in a loss of turn. If the shot is made as called, then any other balls pocketed remain pocketed. However, if the called shot is not made and any other balls are pocketed, then the shooter's ball(s) that were pocketed would be spotted and any of the opponent's balls would remain pocketed.

In order to execute a Legal Shot, the first ball hit must be one of the balls in the shooter's group (stripes or solids) and the object ball must be pocketed or the cue ball or any object ball must come into contact with a rail. (Note: It is legal for the shooter to bank the cue ball off a rail before hitting the object ball.) A player who legally pockets a ball continues play until missing or committing a Foul. Once a player's ball group (stripes or solids) is pocketed, the player may play the 8 ball. Again, the player must clearly indicate the intended pocket, even if it appears obvious. A player who legally pockets all of his ball group and the 8 ball is the winner.

FOULS

1. Failure to execute a legal shot as defined above.
2. A scratch shot (shooting the cue ball into a pocket or off the table)
3. Moving or touching any ball by means other than legal play.
4. Shooting an intentional jump shot over another ball by scooping the cue stick under the cue ball.
A jump shot executed by striking the cue ball above center is legal.
5. Using the 8 ball first in a combination shot when the table is not open.

HOCKEY: Plug in and turn on air motor to play. Turn off and unplug when not playing.

- 1) This game is designed to be played with two (2) players, one at each end.
- 2) Play begins when the puck is placed on the playing surface. Players must hit the puck with the hand-held pushers and attempt to shoot into the opponent's goal.
- 3) One point is given when a puck is shot into the opponent's goal.
- 4) Winning: the winning goal is accomplished by being the first player to reach a predetermined score or by being the player to score the most points within a given period.

Never allow cord to become a trip hazard.
Always unplg + store the air motor cord before rotating main cabinet.

Notice:

TABLE TENNIS:

In singles, the server first makes a good service and then the receiver makes a good return. Thereafter, server and receiver alternately each make a good return. In doubles, the server first makes a good service and the receiver returns the ball. Then the partner of the server makes a good return, followed by the partner of the receiver returning the ball. Thereafter, each player alternately in that sequence makes a good return.

Serving

After hitting it, the ball must first touch the server's own court and pass directly over the net or around the net assembly, then touching the receiver's court. In doubles, the ball must first touch the server's right half-court or center line, pass over the net, and then touch the receiver's right half-court or center line. If, in attempting to serve, a player fails to strike the ball while it is in play, he loses a point. Return After the ball is served or returned in play, it is struck so that it passes directly over the net and its assembly and touches the opponent's court. A returned ball which touches the net or its supports on the way over to the other side, is considered a good return. The ball is in play from the last moment at which it is stationary on the palm of the server's free hand before being projected in service until:

- a point is scored.
- it touches the same court twice consecutively.
- it has been volleyed.
- it touches a player, or anything he wears or carries, other than his racket or his racket hand below his wrist.
- it touches any object other than the net or its support (referred to above).
- it is struck by a player more than once consecutively.
- it touches, in a doubles service, the left half-court of the server or receiver.
- it is struck, in doubles, by a player out of sequence, except where there has been a genuine error in playing order.
- **Always remove and store the table tennis playfields before rotating the main cabinet.**

CARE AND USE OF YOUR SWIVEL TABLE

1. Use only a suitable 120v AC household outlet, and insure the cord is not a trip hazard.
2. For long life and best play from your swivel table, apply spray furniture polish to clean cloth and wipe down the hockey playfield with air motor running to make the pucks slide faster before first play and frequently thereafter.
3. Use spray furniture polish to clean all exterior surfaces of your game table.
4. Use the Billiards Playfield brush provided to clean the cloth on the billiards table.
5. Use a carpenters level to properly level table using the leg levelers.
6. This product is intended for **INDOOR** use only.
7. **DO NOT** operate the air motor if the cord is damaged in any way.
8. **DO NOT** sit, climb or lean on the table.
9. **DO NOT** drag the table when moving it. This will damage the legs.
10. **DO NOT** set drinks on the table.
11. It is suggested that this table be placed close to a wall thus allowing the air motor cord to **NOT** be a trip hazard. Always turn air motor off when table is not in use.
12. If possible, cover table with a pool table cover or sheet when not used to keep playfield clean preventing any dust build up.
13. Clean the table tennis playfield with a soft, slightly damp (water) cloth.
Do not use furniture polish.

First Time Battery Installation:

Locate battery compartment for this product .

Use alkaline batteries for maximum performance .

Using a small Phillips head screwdriver – loosen and remove the battery compartment cover screw(s).

Remove battery compartment cover .

Install new batteries only after reading the “ Battery Information NOTICE“ !

Replace compartment cover and secure cover with the cover screw . Do not over tighten and strip out the screw .

IMPORTANT: BATTERY INFORMATION

Please retain this information for future reference. Batteries must be installed / replaced by an adult .

Notice:

1. Remove and replace batteries when the electrical features of this product work slowly or are not functional .
2. Do not mix old and new batteries .
3. Do not mix different types of batteries : Alkaline , Standard (Carbon-Zinc) , or rechargeable (Nickel-Cadmium batteries) .
4. Use Alkaline Batteries for maximum performance .
5. Do not use damaged batteries .
6. Use only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended.
7. Install new batteries as per matching the battery polarity guide (+ & - , positive and negative) inside of the battery compartment . Correct battery polarity installation is critical as to not damage the internal electrical components as well as insuring the correct functionality of the product .
8. Do not short circuit the battery terminals .
9. Always remove exhausted , leaking, weak , and batteries from long periods of nonuse from the product . Battery leakage and corrosion can cause damage .
10. Check the battery terminals are clean and bright before installing new batteries.
11. Dispose of old batteries safely and per local battery disposal codes .
12. Do not dispose of batteries into a fire as they may explode or leak.
13. If removable rechargeable batteries are used , they are to be charged under adult supervision .
14. Rechargeable batteries are to removed from the product before they are charged .
