The Compliance Intersection for Modern Mail & Package Rooms

Course Description:

Centralized mail and package delivery is all too often a last-minute consideration that causes confusion due to the intersection of various Federal compliance and accessibility requirements needed to complete a secure installation.

This course is designed to demystify the process by providing a clear explanation of how different mailbox installation types meet accessibility standards while remaining in Federal and Postal compliance, and how different design strategies can elevate this common space to improve social interaction.

Learner Outcomes:

At the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- state the accessibility and general centralized mailbox installation specification differences between the United States Postal Service (USPS), Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), and Fair Housing Act (FHA);
- specify the proper space-planning requirements for centralized mail and package delivery equipment to meet USPS specifications and accessibility requirements;
- outline at least one design strategy based on accessibility standards for residential centralized mail and parcel delivery equipment; and
- identify tips for improving collaboration with US Postal Service officials for successful approval of centralized mail and package delivery designs.
